## A RESOLUTION

Directing the Children and Youth Committee to establish a subcommittee to investigate the alleged sexual abuse 2 committed by William McKendry while he was a teacher in the 3 Lower Merion School District. 4 5 WHEREAS, In the 1980's, William McKendry, a Social Studies teacher in the Lower Merion School District, allegedly sexually abused a female student, Elizabeth Goldman; and 8 WHEREAS, In addition to love letters, gifts, promises of 9 marriage, sexually explicit discourse and sexually explicit 10 correspondence, McKendry sexually assaulted and abused this 11 young woman on numerous occasions in 1985 and 1986; and 12 WHEREAS, Some of the assaults took place in the Bala Cynwyd 13 Middle School in Montgomery County; and 14 WHEREAS, When made aware of the abuse, the Lower Merion 15 School District settled this matter when a guidance counselor 16 directed McKendry and Goldman to avoid one another and stay on 17 their respective floors of the Bala Cynwyd Middle School; and 18 WHEREAS, At the time, and at no time since, no contact was ever made with the Pennsylvania Department of Education; and

- 1 WHEREAS, No report of McKendry's actions to the Pennsylvania
- 2 Department of Education, nor revocation of McKendry's teaching
- 3 credentials were ever made; and
- 4 WHEREAS, McKendry was free to abuse again, and the children
- 5 of the school district were not afforded proper protection from
- 6 an admitted perpetrator of child sexual abuse; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In 1999, Goldman, then a medical student at Case
- 8 Western Reserve University, met with two administrators from the
- 9 Lower Merion School District and physically presented the
- 10 correspondence she received from McKendry; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Goldman was received by the administrators with
- 12 hostility and disdain and was threatened with not being
- 13 permitted to leave the building with the physical evidence she
- 14 had respectfully presented in good faith; and
- 15 WHEREAS, In 2005, Goldman again approached the Lower Merion
- 16 School District and was informed that "the Lower Merion School
- 17 District considers this matter closed"; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Lower Merion School District refused further
- 19 discussions with Goldman, a victim of child sexual abuse by one
- 20 of their own teachers; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Despite his actions and admissions, McKendry was
- 22 still teaching in the Lower Merion School District at this time;
- 23 and
- 24 WHEREAS, Our Commonwealth can no longer allow institutions to
- 25 turn a blind eye to the sexual exploitation of children they
- 26 should be protecting; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Author Carolyn Spring said "It was that culture of
- 28 denial that allowed my abuse to take place to start with. Did
- 29 you known it wasn't until 1984 that the Department of Health
- 30 added the category of 'sexual abuse' to its list of harms that

- 1 can befall children"; and
- 2 WHEREAS, This is a case of alleged sexual abuse by a teacher
- 3 which will not be resolved until the truth is known; therefore
- 4 be it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the
- 6 Children and Youth Committee to establish a subcommittee to
- 7 investigate the alleged sexual abuse committed by William
- 8 McKendry while he was a teacher in the Lower Merion School
- 9 District; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the subcommittee compile a report on its
- 11 findings and submit a written report to the House of
- 12 Representatives no later than December 31, 2020.
