A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of November 2020 as "Assistive Technology Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, An assistive technology device is any item, piece of
- 4 equipment or product system, whether acquired commercially,
- 5 modified or customized, that is used to increase, maintain or
- 6 improve the functional capabilities of individuals with
- 7 disabilities or older individuals; and
- 8 WHEREAS, An assistive technology service is any service that
- 9 directly assists an individual in the selection, acquisition or
- 10 use of an assistive technology device; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Assistive technology devices and services are tools
- 12 that empower individuals to control their lives and their
- 13 futures through the ability to work, attend school, play and
- 14 live in the community of their choice; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Pennsylvanians of all ages with disabilities may
- 16 need assistive technology devices and services to live

- 1 independently and productively as well as to participate fully
- 2 in their communities; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Assistive technology has been proven to improve the
- 4 quality of life and capabilities of those living with
- 5 disabilities such as autism spectrum disorder, blindness,
- 6 deafness, mobility impairment, communication disorders and
- 7 learning disabilities; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Connecting individuals with the assistive technology
- 9 that they need can serve as the bridge to reaching academic,
- 10 occupational or personal success; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Ensuring people of all ages who are currently living
- 12 with a disability have access to quality and affordable
- 13 assistive technology should remain a priority for this
- 14 Commonwealth as such devices can be life-saving tools for
- 15 individuals seeking to live dignified and independent lives; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth is a leader in the development and
- 17 implementation of assistive technology programs for residents
- 18 with disabilities and older residents; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Working in conjunction with organizations such as
- 20 the Pennsylvania Assistive Technology Foundation (PATF), the
- 21 Commonwealth provides valuable information and support,
- 22 financial education and financing for the purchase of assistive
- 23 technology devices and services; and
- 24 WHEREAS, In the most recent decade, PATF has been able to
- 25 connect almost 10,000 individuals with disabilities with the
- 26 resources that they need; and
- 27 WHEREAS, As a result of such partnership, more than \$1.4
- 28 million in low-interest loans have been granted to individuals
- 29 with disabilities since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic in
- 30 efforts to address the unprecedented need for telehealth

- 1 services and home-based assistive technology for those who are
- 2 working and learning from home; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Greater attention should be paid to the methods in
- 4 which the Commonwealth can better support individuals living
- 5 with disabilities by making our roadways, workplaces, public
- 6 facilities and outdoor spaces more accommodating for individuals
- 7 of all ability levels, while maintaining the appropriate funding
- 8 necessary to continue to serve our fellow Pennsylvanians;
- 9 therefore be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 11 month of November 2020 as "Assistive Technology Awareness Month"
- 12 in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives acknowledge the
- 14 work that is yet to be done in serving the population of
- 15 Pennsylvanians living with a disability.
