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AN ACT

1 To provide appropriations from the General Fund for the expenses  
2 of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the  
3 Commonwealth, the public debt and the public schools for the  
4 fiscal year July 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020, and for the  
5 payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close  
6 of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2019; to provide  
7 appropriations from special funds and accounts to the  
8 Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year July  
9 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020, and for the payment of bills  
10 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June  
11 30, 2018; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds  
12 to the Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year  
13 July 1, 2019, to June 30, 2020, and for the payment of bills  
14 remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June  
15 30, 2019; and to provide for the additional appropriation of  
16 Federal and State funds to the Executive and Judicial  
17 Departments for the fiscal year July 1, 2018, to June 30,  
18 2019, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining  
19 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2018.

24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
25 hereby enacts as follows:

26 PART I

27 GENERAL PROVISIONS

28 Section 101. Short title.

29 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General  
30 Appropriation Act of 2019.

1 Section 102. Definitions.

2 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall  
3 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the  
4 context clearly indicates otherwise:

5 "Current fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1,  
6 2019, and ending June 30, 2020.

7 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau  
8 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant  
9 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,  
10 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,  
11 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,  
12 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and  
13 other assistants in a department, board or commission.

14 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding  
15 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,  
16 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and  
17 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage,  
18 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll  
19 charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising  
20 by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water,  
21 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of  
22 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and  
23 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums  
24 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on  
25 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer  
26 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee  
27 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance,  
28 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and  
29 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the  
30 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery



1 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment  
2 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other  
3 charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for  
4 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of  
5 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term  
6 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the  
7 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must  
8 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case  
9 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that  
10 provided under the State medical assistance program.

11 "Prior fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1 of the  
12 fiscal year immediately prior to the current fiscal year.

3 Section 104. State appropriations.

4 (a) General Fund.--Except as provided in Part XIX, the sums  
5 specified in this act, or as much thereof as may be necessary,  
6 are specifically appropriated from the General Fund to agencies  
7 of the Executive, Legislative and Judicial Departments of the  
8 Commonwealth for the payment of salaries, wages or other  
9 compensation and travel expenses of the duly elected or  
10 appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for the  
11 payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the  
12 purchase or rental of goods and services, printing, public  
13 advertising by or through any medium, equipment, land and  
14 buildings and for payment of any other expenses, as provided by  
15 law or by this act, necessary for the proper conduct of the  
16 duties, functions and activities and for the purposes specified  
17 in this act for the current fiscal year and for the payment of  
18 bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior  
19 fiscal year.

20 (b) Special funds and accounts.--Except as provided in Part  
21 XIX, the sums specified in this act, or as much thereof as may  
22 be necessary, are specifically appropriated from the special  
23 funds and accounts in the State Treasury to agencies of the  
24 Executive and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the  
25 payment of salaries, wages or other compensation and travel  
26 expenses of the duly appointed officers and employees of the  
27 Commonwealth, for the payment of fees for contractual services  
28 rendered, for the purchase or rental of goods and services and  
29 for payment of any other expenses, as provided by law or by this  
30 act, necessary for the proper conduct of the duties, functions

1 and activities and for the purposes specified in this act for  
2 the current fiscal year and for the payment of bills incurred  
3 and remaining unpaid at the close of the prior fiscal year.

4 Section 105. Federal appropriations.

5 Except as otherwise provided in section 1902, the Federal  
6 appropriations specified in this act, or as much thereof as may  
7 be necessary, are specifically appropriated to the agencies of  
8 the Executive Department of the Commonwealth specified in this  
9 act for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying  
10 out the programs specified in this act for the current fiscal  
11 year and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid  
12 at the close of the prior fiscal year. Unless otherwise stated,  
13 the Federal appropriations include any carryovers from the prior  
14 fiscal year.

15 Section 106. Block grants.

16 (a) Appropriations.--The sums specified in this act, or as  
17 much thereof as may be necessary, are specifically appropriated  
18 from the block grant (BG) funds to agencies of the Executive  
19 Department specified in this act for the purposes and under the  
20 restrictions for which the funds are provided for the current  
21 fiscal year.

22 (b) Small Communities Development Block Grant.--The Small  
23 Communities Development Block Grant (SCDBG) is to assist small  
24 cities and communities that have a high concentration of  
25 impoverished citizens and substandard housing to expand their  
26 low-income and moderate-income housing opportunities and to meet  
27 community development needs.

28 (c) Community Services Block Grant.--The Community Services  
29 Block Grant (CSBG) is to provide a range of services and  
30 activities having a measurable and potentially major impact on

1 the causes of poverty in the community or those areas of the  
2 community where poverty is a particularly acute problem. In  
3 addition, new focus may be placed on the unemployed, both old  
4 and new. Local agencies may lower their eligibility requirements  
5 for recipients to three months to allow greater flexibility to  
6 assure proper consideration of each recipient.

7 (d) Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant.--The  
8 Preventive Health and Health Services Block Grant (PHHSBG) is  
9 for the provision of preventive health and other health services  
10 related to emergency medical systems, health initiative grants,  
11 comprehensive public health, hypertension, fluoridation, health  
12 education, risk reduction, home health, rape crisis and domestic  
13 violence services.

14 (e) Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant.--The  
15 Maternal and Child Health Services Block Grant (MCHSBG) is to  
16 enable states to maintain and strengthen their leadership in  
17 planning, promoting, coordinating and evaluating health care for  
18 pregnant women, mothers, infants and children, and children with  
19 special health care needs and in providing health services for  
20 mothers and children who do not have access to adequate health  
21 care.

22 (f) Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant.--The Low-  
23 Income Home Energy Assistance Block Grant (LIHEABG) is to help  
24 lessen the impact of the high cost of energy on low-income  
25 families and individuals, including energy efficiency grants for  
26 low-income dwellings. No less than 15% of the LIHEABG funds  
27 received shall be used for weatherization. LIHEABG funds  
28 received pursuant to a Presidential release of contingency funds  
29 shall be exempt from the 15% requirement.

30 (g) Social Services Block Grant.--The Social Services Block

1 Grant (SSBG) is for the provision of social services to eligible  
2 persons.

3 (h) Mental Health Services Block Grant.--The Mental Health  
4 Services Block Grant (MH SBG) provides funds for the provision of  
5 services to adults with serious mental illness or children with  
6 serious emotional disturbance.

7 (i) Substance Abuse Block Grant.--The Substance Abuse Block  
8 Grant (SABG) provides funds to establish and maintain programs  
9 to combat alcohol and drug abuse.

10 (j) Child Care and Development Fund Block Grant.--The Child  
11 Care and Development Fund Block Grant (CCDFBG) is for the  
12 provision of direct child care or to increase the quality and  
13 availability of child care for low-income families.

14 (k) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant.--  
15 The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Block Grant (TANFBG)  
16 provides funds for the provision of cash grants, child care,  
17 training and support services, child welfare and administration  
18 for eligible families and individuals.

19 Section 107. Appropriations to Pennsylvania Higher Education  
20 Assistance Agency.

21 The appropriations set forth in this act to the Pennsylvania  
22 Higher Education Assistance Agency, which is an integral part  
23 and arm of the Commonwealth and which is directly controlled by  
24 the Commonwealth, shall supplement other Commonwealth funds  
25 maintained by the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance  
26 Agency in order to fulfill its essential State governmental  
27 function of providing Commonwealth students with access to  
28 higher education opportunities and providing essential higher  
29 education programs for the benefit of Commonwealth students.
