AN ACT

Amending the act of June 28, 1935 (P.L.477, No.193), entitled 1 "An act providing for the payment of the salary, medical and hospital expenses of certain employes of State and local 3 government who are injured or contract certain diseases in the performance of their duty; and providing that absence during such injury shall not reduce any usual sick leave 5 6 period," further providing for disability benefits and for 7 definitions. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 hereby enacts as follows: 11 Section 1. Sections 1 and 2.1 of the act of June 28, 1935 12 (P.L.477, No.193), referred to as the Enforcement Officer 13 Disability Benefits Law, are amended to read: 14 Section 1. (a) Be it enacted, &c., That: 15 any member of the State Police Force; (1)16 (2) any enforcement officer or investigator employed by the 17 Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; 18 (3) the parole agents, enforcement officers and investigators of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole; 19

(4) Capitol Police officers;

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- 1 (4.1) campus police officers employed by a participating
- 2 university;
- 3 (5) correction employes employed by the Department of
- 4 Corrections, whose principal duty is the care, custody and
- 5 control of inmates;
- 6 (5.1) commissioned police officers employed by the
- 7 <u>Department of Corrections</u>, <u>Bureau of Investigations and</u>
- 8 Intelligence;
- 9 (6) psychiatric security aides employed by the Department of
- 10 Human Services and the Department of Corrections, whose
- 11 principal duty is the care, custody, and control of the
- 12 criminally insane;
- 13 (7) drug enforcement agents of the Office of Attorney
- 14 General whose principal duty is the enforcement of the drug laws
- 15 of the Commonwealth;
- 16 (8) special agents of the Office of Attorney General whose
- 17 principal duty is the enforcement of the criminal laws of the
- 18 Commonwealth;
- 19 (9) any member of the Delaware River Port Authority Police;
- 20 (10) any policeman, fireman or park quard of any county,
- 21 city, borough, town or township;
- 22 (10.1) firemen employed by the Commonwealth;
- 23 (11) any sheriff or deputy sheriff; [or]
- 24 (12) any enforcement officer or investigator of the
- 25 Pennsylvania Game Commission or the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat
- 26 Commission;
- 27 (13) DCNR Rangers, DCNR Ranger Supervisors, DCNR Ranger
- 28 Operations Specialists and DCNR Ranger Trainees employed by the
- 29 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources;
- 30 (14) members of the Fort Indiantown Gap Police;

- 1 (15) investigative staff of the Office of Inspector General;
- 2 (16) members of the Allegheny County Port Authority Police;
- 3 (17) members of the Allegheny County Housing Authority
- 4 Police; or
- 5 (18) corrections officers or jail quards employed by a
- 6 participating county and whose principal duty is the care,
- 7 custody and control of inmates;
- 8 who is injured in the performance of his duties including, in
- 9 the case of firemen, duty as special fire police, and by reason
- 10 thereof is temporarily incapacitated from performing his duties,
- 11 shall be paid by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania if an employe
- 12 identified under paragraph (1), (2), (3), (4), (4.1), (5),
- 13 <u>(5.1)</u>, (6), (7), (8) [or], (12), (13), (14) or (15) or by the
- 14 Delaware River Port Authority if a member of the Delaware River
- 15 Port Authority Police or by the participating university if a
- 16 campus police officer or by the Allegheny County Port Authority
- 17 <u>if a member of the Allegheny County Port Authority Police or by</u>
- 18 the Allegheny County Housing Authority if a member of the
- 19 Allegheny County Housing Authority Police or by the county,
- 20 city, township or municipality, by which he is employed, his
- 21 full rate of salary, as fixed by ordinance or resolution, until
- 22 the disability arising therefrom has ceased. All medical and
- 23 hospital bills, incurred in connection with any such injury,
- 24 shall be paid by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or by the
- 25 Delaware River Port Authority or by the participating university
- 26 or by the Allegheny County Port Authority or by the Allegheny
- 27 County Housing Authority or by such county, township or
- 28 municipality. During the time salary for temporary incapacity
- 29 shall be paid by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or by the
- 30 Delaware River Port Authority or by the participating university

- 1 or by the Allegheny County Port Authority or by the Allegheny
- 2 <u>County Housing Authority</u> or by the county, city, borough, town
- 3 or township, any workmen's compensation, received or collected
- 4 by any such employe for such period, shall be turned over to the
- 5 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania or to the Delaware River Port
- 6 Authority or to the participating university or to the Allegheny
- 7 County Port Authority or to the Allegheny County Housing
- 8 Authority or to such county, city, borough, town or township,
- 9 and paid into the treasury thereof, and if such payment shall
- 10 not be so made by the employe the amount so due the Commonwealth
- 11 of Pennsylvania, the Delaware River Port Authority or the
- 12 participating university or the Allegheny County Port Authority
- 13 or the Allegheny County Housing Authority or the county, city,
- 14 borough, town or township shall be deducted from any salary then
- 15 or thereafter becoming due and owing.
- 16 (b) In the case of:
- 17 (1) the State Police Force;
- 18 (2) enforcement officers and investigators employed by the
- 19 Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board;
- 20 (3) the parole agents, enforcement officers and
- 21 investigators of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole;
- 22 (4) Capitol Police officers;
- 23 (4.1) campus police officers employed by a participating
- 24 university;
- 25 (5) correction employes employed by the Department of
- 26 Corrections, whose principal duty is the care, custody and
- 27 control of inmates;
- 28 (5.1) commissioned police officers employed by the
- 29 Department of Corrections, Bureau of Investigations and
- 30 Intelligence;

- 1 (6) psychiatric security aides employed by the Department of
- 2 Human Services and the Department of Corrections whose principal
- 3 duty is the care, custody, and control of the criminally insane;
- 4 (7) drug enforcement agents of the Office of Attorney
- 5 General whose principal duty is the enforcement of the drug laws
- 6 of the Commonwealth;
- 7 (8) special agents of the Office of Attorney General whose
- 8 principal duty is the enforcement of the criminal laws of the
- 9 Commonwealth;
- 10 (9) members of the Delaware River Port Authority Police;
- 11 (10) salaried policemen and firemen;
- 12 (10.1) firemen employed by the Commonwealth;
- 13 (11) sheriffs and deputy sheriffs; [and]
- 14 (12) enforcement officers and investigators of the
- 15 Pennsylvania Game Commission and the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat
- 16 Commission;
- 17 (13) DCNR Rangers, DCNR Ranger Supervisors, DCNR Ranger
- 18 Operations Specialists and DCNR Ranger Trainees employed by the
- 19 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources;
- 20 (14) members of the Fort Indiantown Gap Police;
- 21 (15) investigative staff of the Office of Inspector General;
- 22 (16) members of the Allegheny County Port Authority Police;
- 23 (17) members of the Allegheny County Housing Authority
- 24 Police; and
- 25 (18) corrections officers or jail quards employed by a
- 26 participating county and whose principal duty is the care,
- 27 <u>custody and control of inmates;</u>
- 28 who have served for four consecutive years or longer, diseases
- 29 of the heart and tuberculosis of the respiratory system,
- 30 contracted or incurred by any of them after four years of

- 1 continuous service as such, and caused by extreme overexertion
- 2 in times of stress or danger or by exposure to heat, smoke,
- 3 fumes or gases, arising directly out of the employment shall be
- 4 compensable in accordance with the terms hereof; and unless any
- 5 such disability shall be compensable under the compensation laws
- 6 as having been caused by accidental injury, such disability
- 7 shall be compensable as occupational disease disabilities are
- 8 presently compensable under the compensation laws of this
- 9 Commonwealth. It shall be presumed that tuberculosis of the
- 10 respiratory system contracted or incurred after four consecutive
- 11 years of service was contracted or incurred as a direct result
- 12 of employment.
- 13 (c) In the case of any person receiving benefits pursuant to
- 14 this act, the statutes of limitations set forth in sections
- 15 306.1, 315, 413, and 434 of the act of June 2, 1915 (P.L.736,
- 16 No.338), known as the "Workers' Compensation Act," shall not
- 17 begin to run until the expiration of the receipt of benefits
- 18 pursuant to this act.
- 19 (d) (1) All payments herein required to be made by the
- 20 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania on account of any member of the
- 21 State Police Force shall be made from moneys appropriated to the
- 22 Pennsylvania State Police.
- 23 (2) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 24 enforcement officer or investigator employed by the Pennsylvania
- 25 Liquor Control Board shall be made from appropriations out of
- 26 the State Stores Fund.
- 27 (3) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 28 parole agent, enforcement officer or investigator employed by
- 29 the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole shall be made
- 30 from moneys appropriated to the Pennsylvania Board of Probation

- 1 and Parole.
- 2 (4) Any payments required to be made on account of Capitol
- 3 Police officers shall be made from moneys appropriated to the
- 4 Department of General Services.
- 5 (5) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 6 correction employe or any commissioned police officer employed
- 7 by the Department of Corrections, Bureau of Investigations and
- 8 <u>Intelligence</u>, shall be made from moneys appropriated to the
- 9 Department of Corrections.
- 10 (6) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 11 psychiatric security aides shall be made from moneys
- 12 appropriated to the Department of Human Services or the
- 13 Department of Corrections where appropriate.
- 14 (6.1) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 15 campus police officers employed by a participating university
- 16 <u>shall be made from moneys appropriated to the participating</u>
- 17 university.
- 18 (6.2) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 19 DCNR Rangers, DCNR Ranger Supervisors, DCNR Ranger Operations
- 20 Specialists and DCNR Ranger Trainees employed by the Department
- 21 of Conservation and Natural Resources shall be made from moneys
- 22 appropriated to the Department of Conservation and Natural
- 23 Resources.
- 24 (6.3) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 25 members of the Fort Indiantown Gap Police Force employed by the
- 26 Department of Military and Veterans Affairs shall be made from
- 27 moneys appropriated to the Department of Military and Veterans
- 28 Affairs.
- 29 (6.4) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 30 investigative staff of the Office of Inspector General shall be

- 1 made from moneys appropriated to the Office of Inspector
- 2 General.
- 3 (6.5) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 4 <u>members of the Allegheny County Port Authority Police shall be</u>
- 5 made from any moneys appropriated to the Allegheny County Port
- 6 Authority.
- 7 (6.6) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 8 <u>members of the Allegheny County Housing Authority Police shall</u>
- 9 be made from any moneys appropriated to the Allegheny County
- 10 Housing Authority.
- 11 (7) Any payments required to be made on account of any drug
- 12 enforcement agent or special agents shall be made from moneys
- 13 appropriated to the Office of Attorney General and any payments
- 14 required to be made on account of any fireman employed by the
- 15 Commonwealth shall be made from moneys appropriated to the
- 16 employing agency.
- 17 (8) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 18 enforcement officers or investigators of the Pennsylvania Game
- 19 Commission shall be made from moneys appropriated to the
- 20 Pennsylvania Game Commission or executively authorized from the
- 21 Game Fund under 34 Pa.C.S. Ch. 5 Subch. B (relating to Game
- 22 Fund).
- 23 (9) Any payments required to be made on account of any
- 24 enforcement officers or investigators of the Pennsylvania Fish
- 25 and Boat Commission shall be made from moneys appropriated to
- 26 the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission or executively
- 27 authorized from the Fish Fund under 30 Pa.C.S. Ch. 5 Subch. B
- 28 (relating to the Fish Fund) or the Boat Fund under 30 Pa.C.S.
- 29 Ch. 5 Subch. C (relating to the Boat Fund).
- 30 Section 2.1. For the purposes of this act, the [term

- 1 "fireman" shall mean and include the following:] following words
- 2 and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 3 <u>section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 4 "Fireman." Any of the following:
- 5 (1) Paid firemen not employed by the Commonwealth.
- 6 (2) Emergency medical services personnel employed within a
- 7 city fire department.
- 8 (3) Firemen of airport authorities, including fire
- 9 suppression instructors.
- 10 (4) Fire and safety marshals who are firemen employed by the
- 11 Commonwealth.
- 12 (5) Fire academy instructors employed at the State Fire
- 13 Academy.
- 14 (6) Assistant fire marshals employed by the Commonwealth.
- 15 (7) Forest patrolmen and forest technicians employed by the
- 16 Commonwealth.
- 17 <u>"Participating county." A county that elects to participate</u>
- 18 in this act by submitting a notice to the Department of Labor
- 19 and Industry, which election shall be irrevocable after
- 20 participation in this act commences.
- 21 "Participating university." Any of the following that elects
- 22 to participate in this act by submitting a notice to the
- 23 Department of Labor and Industry, which election shall be
- 24 irrevocable after participation in this act commences:
- 25 (1) A State-owned university.
- 26 (2) A community college.
- 27 <u>(3) A State-related college or university.</u>
- 28 (4) A State-aided college or university.
- 29 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
