AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto, " in terms and courses of study,
- 6 providing for flexible instructional days.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 1506. Flexible Instructional Days.--(a) Within</u>
- 13 thirty (30) days of the effective date of this section, the
- 14 <u>department shall issue guidance and establish a standard</u>
- 15 application form for a public school entity seeking to establish
- 16 or renew a program. The quidance and form shall be published on
- 17 the department's publicly accessible Internet website.
- 18 (b) The form under subsection (a) shall require the
- 19 <u>following information:</u>

- 1 (1) The procedure for a public school entity to notify
- 2 <u>students</u>, <u>parents</u> and <u>professional employes that a flexible</u>
- 3 <u>instructional day is instituted.</u>
- 4 (2) The procedure for instituting a flexible instructional
- 5 day, including whether the public school entity will use
- 6 technology. If technology will be used by the school entity, the
- 7 procedure shall include information regarding accommodations for
- 8 students without Internet access at home and for digital device
- 9 access at home and for digital access for families without
- 10 technology or an insufficient amount of technology for the
- 11 <u>number of children in the household.</u>
- 12 <u>(3) The responsibilities of professional employes and</u>
- 13 <u>students during a flexible instructional day.</u>
- 14 (4) The procedure for identifying student participation
- 15 during a flexible instructional day for the purpose of enforcing
- 16 attendance under Article XIII.
- 17 (5) Instruction exemplary of a flexible instruction day in
- 18 each of the following:
- 19 (i) English language arts in any grade from grades nine
- 20 through twelve.
- 21 (ii) Mathematics in any grade from grades nine through
- 22 twelve.
- 23 (iii) Science in any grade from grades nine through twelve.
- 24 (iv) Social Studies in any grade from grades nine through
- 25 twelve.
- 26 (v) English language arts in kindergarten or in any grade
- 27 from grades one through eight.
- 28 <u>(vi) Mathematics in kindergarten or in any grade from grades</u>
- 29 <u>one through eight.</u>
- 30 (6) Assurance of compliance with the Individuals with

- 1 Disabilities Education Act (Public Law 91-230, 20 U.S.C. § 1400
- 2 et seq.) during a flexible instructional day.
- 3 (7) Any additional information that the department deems
- 4 <u>necessary to determine whether to accept or deny an application</u>
- 5 to establish or renew a program.
- 6 (c) (1) For the first two years for application under this
- 7 <u>section</u>, a <u>public school entity's application to establish a</u>
- 8 program shall be submitted to the department on or before
- 9 <u>September 1 and the department shall notify the public school</u>
- 10 entity if its application is accepted or denied by November 1.
- 11 (2) For each year thereafter, a public school entity's
- 12 application to establish or renew a program shall be submitted
- 13 to the department on or before June 1 and the department shall
- 14 notify the public school entity if its application or renewal is
- 15 accepted or denied by August 1.
- 16 (d) An application accepted under this section shall remain
- 17 valid for a period of three (3) years.
- 18 (e) The department shall issue an annual survey related to
- 19 the efficacy of flexible instructional days on or before April
- 20 30 of each year to each public school entity with an accepted
- 21 application. Each public school entity shall return the survey
- 22 to the department by June 30 of the same year.
- 23 (F) A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MAY USE TECHNOLOGY OR OTHER
- 24 APPROPRIATE MEANS TO PROVIDE INSTRUCTION TO STUDENTS ON DAYS
- 25 WHEN A SCHOOL BUILDING IS PREVENTED FROM OPENING. IN ORDER TO
- 26 PROVIDE THE INSTRUCTION, A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MUST HAVE PROCEDURES

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- 27 IN PLACE TO ENSURE THE FOLLOWING:
- 28 (1) THE ENFORCEMENT OF STUDENT ATTENDANCE UNDER ARTICLE
- 29 XIII.
- 30 (2) THE FULFILLMENT OF THE MINIMUM HOURS OF INSTRUCTION PER

- 1 YEAR UNDER SECTION 1327.
- 2 (f) (G) As used in this section, the following words and <--
- 3 phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 4 subsection:
- 5 "Department" shall mean the Department of Education of the
- 6 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 7 <u>"Flexible instructional day" shall mean a day that satisfies</u>
- 8 all of the following:
- 9 (1) Fulfills one of the minimum required days of instruction
- 10 under section 1501.
- 11 (2) Prevents a school building from opening due to any of
- 12 the following:
- 13 <u>(i) A disease epidemic.</u>
- 14 (ii) A hazardous weather condition.
- 15 (iii) A law enforcement emergency.
- 16 <u>(iv) The inoperability of school buses or other equipment</u>
- 17 necessary to the public school entity's operation.
- 18 (v) Damage to a school building.
- 19 (vi) Another temporary circumstance rendering any portion of
- 20 <u>a school building unfit or unsafe for use.</u>
- 21 (3) Provides instruction to students.
- 22 "Program" shall mean a program that allows for a number of
- 23 flexible instructional days not to exceed five (5) days during a
- 24 school year.
- 25 "Public school entity" shall mean any of the following:
- 26 (1) A school district.
- 27 (2) An intermediate unit.
- 28 (3) An area vocational-technical school.
- 29 (4) A charter school or regional charter school, as defined
- 30 in section 1703-A.

- 1 <u>"School building" shall mean a building owned by or under the</u>
- 2 control of a public school entity OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL where <--
- 3 <u>classes are taught or extracurricular activities are conducted</u>
- 4 <u>on a regular basis.</u>
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
