AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study,
- 6 providing for flexible instructional days.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 1506. Flexible Instructional Days.--(a) Within</u>
- 13 thirty (30) days of the effective date of this section, the
- 14 <u>department shall issue guidance and establish a standard</u>
- 15 application form for a public school entity seeking to establish
- 16 or renew a program. The quidance and form shall be published on
- 17 the department's publicly accessible Internet website.
- 18 (b) The form under subsection (a) shall require the
- 19 <u>following information:</u>

- 1 (1) The procedure for a public school entity to notify
- 2 <u>students</u>, <u>parents</u> and <u>professional employes that a flexible</u>
- 3 <u>instructional day is instituted.</u>
- 4 (2) The procedure for instituting a flexible instructional
- 5 day, including whether the public school entity will use
- 6 technology. If technology will be used by the school entity, the
- 7 procedure shall include information regarding accommodations for
- 8 <u>students AND PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYES without Internet access at</u> <--
- 9 <u>home and for digital device access at home and for digital</u>
- 10 <u>access for families AND EMPLOYES without technology or an</u> <--
- 11 <u>insufficient amount of technology for the number of children in</u>
- 12 <u>the household.</u>
- 13 (3) The responsibilities of professional employes and
- 14 <u>students during a flexible instructional day.</u>
- 15 (4) The procedure for identifying student participation
- 16 <u>during a flexible instructional day for the purpose of enforcing</u>
- 17 attendance under Article XIII.
- 18 (5) Instruction exemplary of a flexible instruction day in
- 19 each of the following:
- 20 (i) English language arts in any grade from grades nine
- 21 through twelve.
- 22 (ii) Mathematics in any grade from grades nine through
- 23 twelve.
- 24 (iii) Science in any grade from grades nine through twelve.
- 25 (iv) Social Studies in any grade from grades nine through
- 26 twelve.
- 27 (v) English language arts in kindergarten or in any grade
- 28 from grades one through eight.
- 29 (vi) Mathematics in kindergarten or in any grade from grades
- 30 one through eight.

- 1 (6) Assurance of compliance with the Individuals with
- 2 Disabilities Education Act (Public Law 91-230, 20 U.S.C. § 1400
- 3 et seq.) during a flexible instructional day.
- 4 (7) Any additional information that the department deems
- 5 necessary to determine whether to accept or deny an application
- 6 to establish or renew a program.
- 7 (c) (1) For the first two years for application under this
- 8 <u>section</u>, a <u>public school entity's application to establish a</u>
- 9 program shall be submitted to the department on or before
- 10 September 1 and the department shall notify the public school
- 11 entity if its application is accepted or denied by November 1.
- 12 (2) For each year thereafter, a public school entity's
- 13 <u>application to establish or renew a program shall be submitted</u>
- 14 to the department on or before June 1 and the department shall
- 15 notify the public school entity if its application or renewal is
- 16 accepted or denied by August 1.
- 17 (d) An application accepted under this section shall remain
- 18 valid for a period of three (3) years.
- 19 (e) The department shall issue an annual survey related to
- 20 the efficacy of flexible instructional days on or before April
- 21 30 of each year to each public school entity with an accepted
- 22 application. Each public school entity shall return the survey
- 23 to the department by June 30 of the same year.
- 24 (F) A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MAY USE TECHNOLOGY OR OTHER
- 25 APPROPRIATE MEANS TO PROVIDE INSTRUCTION TO STUDENTS ON DAYS
- 26 WHEN A SCHOOL BUILDING IS PREVENTED FROM OPENING. IN ORDER TO
- 27 PROVIDE THE INSTRUCTION, A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MUST HAVE PROCEDURES

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- 28 IN PLACE TO ENSURE THE FOLLOWING:
- 29 (1) THE ENFORCEMENT OF STUDENT ATTENDANCE UNDER ARTICLE
- 30 XIII.

- 1 (2) THE FULFILLMENT OF THE MINIMUM HOURS OF INSTRUCTION PER
- 2 YEAR UNDER SECTION 1327.
- 3 (G) NOTHING IN THIS SECTION SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO SUPERSEDE <--
- 4 OR PREEMPT THE RIGHTS, REMEDIES AND PROCEDURES AFFORDED TO
- 5 SCHOOL EMPLOYES OR LABOR ORGANIZATIONS UNDER FEDERAL OR STATE
- 6 LAW, INCLUDING THE ACT OF JULY 23, 1970 (P.L.563, NO.195), KNOWN
- 7 AS THE "PUBLIC EMPLOYE RELATIONS ACT," OR ANY PROVISION OF A
- 8 COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT NEGOTIATED BETWEEN A SCHOOL
- 9 ENTITY AND AN EXCLUSIVE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE EMPLOYES IN
- 10 ACCORDANCE WITH THE "PUBLIC EMPLOYE RELATIONS ACT."
- 11 (f) (G) (H) As used in this section, the following words and <--
- 12 phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 13 subsection:
- 14 "Department" shall mean the Department of Education of the
- 15 Commonwealth.
- 16 <u>"Flexible instructional day" shall mean a day that satisfies</u>
- 17 all of the following:
- 18 (1) Fulfills one of the minimum required days of instruction
- 19 under section 1501.
- 20 (2) Prevents a school building from opening due to any of
- 21 the following:
- 22 (i) A disease epidemic.
- 23 (ii) A hazardous weather condition.
- 24 (iii) A law enforcement emergency.
- 25 (iv) The inoperability of school buses or other equipment
- 26 necessary to the public school entity's operation.
- 27 <u>(v) Damage to a school building.</u>
- (vi) Another temporary circumstance rendering any portion of
- 29 <u>a school building unfit or unsafe for use.</u>
- 30 (3) Provides instruction to students.

- 1 <u>"Program" shall mean a program that allows for a number of</u>
- 2 <u>flexible instructional days not to exceed five (5) days during a</u>
- 3 <u>school year.</u>
- 4 "Public school entity" shall mean any of the following:
- 5 (1) A school district.
- 6 (2) An intermediate unit.
- 7 (3) An area vocational-technical school.
- 8 (4) A charter school or regional charter school, as defined
- 9 <u>in section 1703-A.</u>
- 10 "School building" shall mean a building owned by or under the
- 11 control of a public school entity OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL where
- 12 classes are taught or extracurricular activities are conducted
- 13 on a regular basis.
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
