12	Section 1. Short title.	<
13	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Pennsylvania	
14	Clean Water Procurement Program Act.	
15	Section 2. Definitions.	
16	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall	
17	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the	
18	context clearly indicates otherwise:	
19	"Aggregator." A person that arranges for the sale of	
20	nutrient and sediment reductions generated by another person.	

- 1 The term includes an agricultural business acting on behalf of
- 2 farmers via a production contract or cooperative membership.
- 3 "Authority." The Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment
- 4 Authority.
- 5 "Chesapeake Bay TMDL." The Chesapeake Bay TMDL for nitrogen,
- 6 phosphorus and sediment as established by the United States
- 7 Environmental Protection Agency on December 29, 2010.
- 8 "Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of
- 9 the Commonwealth.
- 10 "Fund." The Watershed Innovation and Improvement Fund
- 11 established under section 3.
- 12 "Nutrient." Nitrogen or phosphorous.
- 13 "Nutrient or sediment reductions." Nitrogen, phosphorus and
- 14 sediment pollution load reductions to surface water and
- 15 groundwater resources that can be directly measured and
- 16 quantified or modeled by any of the following:
- 17 (1) The Chesapeake Bay Program Watershed Model.
- 18 (2) Any other model approved by the United States
- 19 Environmental Protection Agency or the department, including,
- 20 but not limited to, nonpoint source phosphorous, nitrogen and
- 21 sediment loads to surface water and groundwater resources and
- 22 pathogens using quantification methodologies and modeling
- 23 tools.
- 24 "Program." The Pennsylvania Clean Water Procurement Program
- 25 established under section 4.
- 26 "Qualified bidder." A bidder with an approved verification
- 27 plan.
- 28 "Request for proposals." A request for competitive sealed
- 29 proposals that define contract terms, future delivery dates and
- 30 technical specifications that is issued by the authority, in

- 1 conjunction with the department, to procure verified nutrient
- 2 and sediment reductions that count toward achievement of the
- 3 Chesapeake Bay TMDL nutrient and sediment pollutant reduction
- 4 requirements.
- 5 "Sediment." Soils or other erodible materials transported by
- 6 water as a product of erosion.
- 7 "Small farm." An agricultural operation that is not large-
- 8 enough to meet the definition of CAFO as set forth in 25 Pa.
- 9 Code § 92a.2 (relating to definitions).
- 10 "TMDL." Total maximum daily load.
- 11 "Verification plan." As follows:
- 12 (1) A plan that details the method that a qualified
- 13 bidder will use to produce verified nutrient or sediment
- 14 reductions, including mass balance calculation.
- 15 (2) In the case of an aggregator, a plan as specified
- 16 under paragraph (1) that describes the process that the
- 17 aggregator will use to certify verified nutrient or sediment
- 18 reductions from approved contracting parties under section
- 19 4(b)(4), including the aggregator's contract farmers,
- 20 cooperative members or other similar entities.
- 21 "Verified nutrient and sediment reductions." Nutrient or
- 22 sediment reductions measured in pounds created by an action,
- 23 activity or technology pursuant to a verification plan and
- 24 approved by the department.
- 25 Section 3. Watershed Innovation and Improvement Fund.
- 26 (a) Establishment. The Watershed Innovation and Improvement
- 27 Fund is established in the State Treasury.
- 28 (b) Source of funding. The fund shall consist of
- 29 appropriations made to the fund and interest earned on money in-
- 30 the fund.

Τ	(C) Appropriation. The sum of \$20,000,000 is hereby
2	appropriated from the General Fund to the fund for the purposes
3	specified under subsection (d).
4	(d) Use of fund. The following apply:
5	(1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), money in the
6	fund shall be used by the authority for the purchase of
7	verified nutrient and sediment reductions under section 4.
8	(2) No more than 5% of the money in the fund may be used
9	by the department and the authority to implement the program.
0	Section 4. Pennsylvania Clean Water Procurement Program.
1	(a) Establishment. The Pennsylvania Clean Water Procurement
_2	Program is established and shall provide for the purchase of
_3	verified nutrient and sediment reductions from approved-
4	contracting parties through a competitive sealed proposal
.5	procurement procedure consistent with 62 Pa.C.S. Pt. I (relating
. 6	to Commonwealth Procurement Code) or any other competitive
_7	bidding process determined to be appropriate by the authority.
8.	(b) Duties of authority. The authority shall have all of
_9	the following duties:
20	(1) Within 60 days of an appropriation to the fund, in
21	consultation with the department, issue a request for
22	proposals or initiate a competitive bidding process under 62
23	Pa.C.S. Pt. I for the supply of long-term nutrient and
24	sediment reductions for future delivery to accelerate
25	progress towards the achievement of the Chesapeake Bay TMDL
26	nutrient and sediment pollutant reduction requirements.
27	(2) Administer the fund for the purpose of implementing
28	this act.
29	(3) Evaluate the responses to the request for proposals
30	or competitive bidding process under paragraph (1) and

execute contracts with verified nutrient and sedimentreduction producers or aggregators. Contracts under thisparagraph shall be for at least 10 years and shall providesufficient time for the construction and permitting offacilities and the delivery of verified nutrient andsediment reductions.

(4) Require a contracting party for the supply of long-term nutrient and sediment reductions to make available 20% of its total nutrient or sediment reduction allotment for participation for 30 days by small farms or aggregators of small farms. The purpose of this requirement is to enable—small farms or aggregators of small farms to sell their credits from modeled reductions into the nutrient or sediment reduction allotment and receive the winning bid—price without participating in the request for proposals or competitive bidding process under paragraph (1).

(5) Purchase verified nutrient and sediment reductions in accordance with the terms of the contracts under paragraph (3) after the department has verified the nutrient and sediment reductions. The verification of nutrient and sediment reductions shall be performed monthly, based upon required data submissions from nutrient credit generators certified by the department.

(c) Publicly funded reductions. Nutrient and sediment reductions funded entirely by public grants are not eligible to-bid or respond to the request for proposals or competitive bidding process under subsection (b)(1). If a percentage of nutrient and sediment reductions are funded partially by public grants, the percentage of the remaining nutrient and sediment reductions that are eligible to bid or respond to a request for

- 1 proposals or competitive bidding process under subsection (b) (1)-
- 2 shall be commensurate with the percentage of the reduction-
- 3 activity that is not provided by public grants.
- 4 (d) Criteria. The criteria for the evaluation of responses
- 5 to the request for proposals or competitive bidding process
- 6 under subsection (b) (1) and the weighted percentage to be
- 7 applied to each factor in the evaluation of the responses shall-
- 8 be published by the department as part of the request for
- 9 proposals or competitive bidding process under subsection (b) (1)
- 10 and include, but not be limited to, all of the following:
- 11 (1) The environmental and recreational benefits to this
- 12 Commonwealth and local communities resulting from the-
- 13 nutrient and sediment reduction activities.
- 14 (2) The cost effectiveness of the proposed nutrient and
- 15 sediment reduction activity.
- 16 (3) Any additional criteria determined relevant and
- 17 necessary by the department.
- 18 (e) Annual report. The authority shall publish and make
- 19 available to the public an annual report on the program
- 20 detailing all of following information for the prior year:
- 21 (1) The total cost for the program.
- 22 (2) The nutrient and sediment reduction activities
- 23 <u>implemented</u>.
- 24 (3) The verified nutrient and sediment reductions
- 25 achieved towards the satisfaction of the Chesapeake Bay TMDL-
- 26 nutrient and sediment pollutant reduction requirements.
- 27 (4) The total cost for each verified nutrient and
- 28 sediment reduction.
- 29 Section 5. Duties of department.
- 30 The department shall have all of the following duties:
