14	hereby enacts as follows:	
15	Section 1. Section 9124(a), (b) and (c) of Title 18 of the	<
16	Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended and the section

18	§ 9124. Use of records by licensing agencies.	
19	(a) [State agencies. Except as provided by this chapter]	
20	Permissible use of information	
21	(1) Except as provided in subsection (e), a board,

15	information shall not be used in consideration of an application
16	for a license, certificate, registration or permit:
17	(1) Records of arrest if there is no conviction of a
18	crime based on the arrest.
19	(2) Convictions which have been annulled [or] expunged
20	or subject to limited access under sections 9122.1 (relating
21	to petition for limited access) and 9122.2 (relating to clean
22	slate limited access).
23	(3) Convictions of a summary offense.
24	(4) Convictions for which the individual has received a
25	pardon from the Governor.
26	(5) Convictions which do not relate to the applicant's
27	suitability for the license, certificate, registration or
28	permit.
29	(6) Adjudications of delinquency.
30	(c) State action authorized. [Boards,] Except as provided

- 3 the practice of trades, occupations or professions may refuse to
- 4 grant or renew, or may suspend or revoke any license,

- 6 (1) Where the applicant has been convicted of a felony.
- 7 (2) Where the applicant has been convicted of a
- 8 misdemeanor which relates to the trade, occupation or
- 9 profession for which the license, certificate, registration
- 10 or permit is sought.

- 12 (e) Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs.
- 13 (1) A board or commission under the Bureau of
- 14 Professional and Occupational Affairs in the Department of
- 15 <u>State, when determining eligibility for licensure,</u>
- 16 <u>certification, registration or permission to engage in a</u>
- 17 <u>profession or occupation, may consider convictions of the</u>
- 18 applicant of crimes only in accordance with this section.
- 19 Convictions shall not automatically preclude the issuance of
- 20 <u>a license</u>, <u>certificate</u>, <u>registration or permit</u>.
- 21 <u>(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law</u>
- 22 concerning licensing, certification, registration or
- 23 permitting in the various practice acts, in addition to the
- 24 restrictions in subsection (b), a board or commission under
- 25 the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs shall not
- 26 consider a conviction which does not directly relate to the
- 27 duties, functions and responsibilities in the practice of the

2	required by paragraph (3) that the applicant poses an
3	unacceptable risk to the people with whom the applicant would
4	interact in the conduct of the profession or occupation.
5	(3) A board or commission under the Bureau of
6	Professional and Occupational Affairs may refuse to grant or
7	renew, or may suspend, revoke or otherwise discipline a
8	license, certificate, registration or permit of an individual
9	based in whole or in part on a conviction of a crime if all
10	of the following apply:
11	(i) The individual has been convicted of a felony or
12	misdemeanor which directly relates to the duties,
13	functions and responsibilities in the practice of the
14	profession or occupation or which, based on the facts and
15	circumstances of the particular crime, demonstrates that
16	the individual poses an unacceptable risk to the people
17	with whom the individual would interact in the practice
18	of the profession or occupation.
19	(ii) The board or commission has conducted an
20	individualized assessment of the relation of the
21	conviction to the individual's overall suitability to
22	engage in the profession or occupation. An individualized
23	assessment conducted under this subparagraph shall
24	include a consideration of the particular facts or
25	circumstances surrounding the crime, the length of time
26	since the crime occurred and the grade and seriousness of
27	the crime.
28	(4) A board or commission under the Bureau of
29	Professional and Occupational Affairs may not refuse to grant
30	or renew and may not suspend, revoke or otherwise discipline

<u>a</u>	<u>license, certificate, registration or permit under</u>
p	aragraph (3) if the individual can present evidence of the
9	articular facts and circumstances surrounding the crime, and
ŧ	he individual's overall criminal history record, which

<u>e</u>	stablish fitness to perform the duties of the profession or
<u>0</u>	ccupation, including:
	(i) Facts or circumstances regarding the crime.
	(ii) Number of offenses for which the individual was
	convicted.
	(iii) Increase in age and maturity of the individual
	since the date of the conviction for the crime or release
	from a correctional institution.
	(iv) The individual's criminal history, or lack of
	criminal history, after the date of the crime while
	engaged in the same or similar profession or occupation.
	(v) Length and consistency of employment history
	before and after the date of the crime.
	(vi) Participation in education and training
	activities.

1	<u>(vii) Employment or character references and any </u>
2	other information regarding fitness for practice in the
3	profession or occupation.
4	(viii) Any other factor that would show the
5	individual does not pose an unacceptable risk, is capable
6	of being rehabilitated or is fit to perform the duties of
7	the profession or occupation.
8	(5) An applicant with a criminal history who, based on a
9	review of the regulations published by the board or
10	commission under paragraph (9) is unable to determine whether
11	the applicant's criminal record would preclude the issuance
12	of a license, certificate, registration or permit, may file a
13	petition for preliminary review with the board or commission
14	under the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs
15	seeking a preliminary decision on whether the applicant's
16	criminal history would disqualify the applicant from
17	receiving a license, certificate, registration or permit,
18	subject to the following:
19	(i) If the petition is filed separately from a
20	formal application for a license, certificate,
21	registration or permit, the board or commission shall
22	issue a preliminary decision within 45 days. The
23	preliminary decision shall be limited to a declaration of
24	whether a conviction on the petitioner's criminal history
25	record falls within the set of convictions that the board
26	or commission has previously determined may be directly
27	related to the profession or occupation over which the
28	board or commission has authority.
29	(ii) In the event that the board or commission
30	determines a conviction on the petitioner's criminal

history record is directly related to the duties,

functions and responsibilities in the practice of the

profession or occupation, the notice of the preliminary

decision shall inform the petitioner that the

determination is not final or binding as to whether the

petitioner qualifies for a license, certificate,

registration or permit, and that the petitioner has the

opportunity to present evidence of the factors specified

in paragraph (4) in connection with any subsequent formal

application for a license, certificate, registration or

permit.

(iii) The board or commission may charge a filing fee, which shall not exceed \$45, to be paid for each petition for preliminary review filed. On or after January 1, 2022, the board or commission may establish by regulation reasonable fees which may not exceed an amount sufficient to reimburse the board or commission for the administrative costs associated with processing the petition for preliminary review. The board or commission shall make available forms for petitioners to request in forma pauperis status in connection with a petition. The board or commission may not unreasonably deny in forma pauperis status. A petitioner granted in forma pauperis status shall be permitted to file a petition and receive a preliminary decision without payment of the filing fee.

(iv) Except for the petitioner filing the petition,

a preliminary decision issued by a board, commission or

the department as a result of a petition for preliminary

review shall have no precedential value and may not be

relied upon by individuals applying for a license,

1	<u>certificate, registration or permit.</u>
2	(6) Each board or commission under the Bureau of
3	Professional and Occupational Affairs shall provide, on their
4	publicly accessible Internet website, a standardized form for
5	an applicant to petition for a preliminary review and shall
6	issue preliminary decisions upon promulgating final
7	regulations in accordance with paragraph (9) or within 18
8	months, whichever is sooner.
9	(7) A board or commission under the Bureau of
10	Professional and Occupational Affairs may not consider moral
11	character to make determinations of whether to grant or
12	renew, deny, suspend, revoke or otherwise discipline a
13	license, certificate, registration or permit.
14	(8) A board or commission under the Bureau of
15	Professional and Occupational Affairs may only consider
16	criminal history records and make determinations of whether
17	to grant or renew, deny, suspend, revoke or otherwise
18	discipline a license, certificate, registration or permit in
19	accordance with the limitations under this subsection. A
20	crime of moral turpitude may only be considered as grounds to
21	deny, revoke or otherwise discipline a license, certificate,
22	registration or permit if the board or commission has
23	determined that a conviction for such crime is directly
24	related to the duties, functions and responsibilities in the
25	practice of the profession or occupation or that the
26	individual poses an unacceptable risk to people with whom the
27	individual would interact in the conduct of the profession or
28	occupation. The provisions of this section shall supersede
29	any law or regulation to the contrary.
3.0	(9) Each board or commission under the Bureau of

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2	from the effective date of this section, promulgate final
3	regulations, following public notice and comments, regarding
4	the consideration of criminal history records as part of the
