19	Section 1. Section 731 of the act of March 20, 2002
20	(P.L.154, No.13), known as the Medical Care Availability and
21	Reduction of Error (Mcare) Act, is amended by adding subsections

23	Section 731. Joint underwriting association.

25	(d) Reports and hearingsThe following shall apply:

1	(1) The joint underwriting association shall submit
2	written estimates to the Secretary of the Budget as specified
3	under section 615 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
4	No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929.
5	(2) Within 30 days of a submission of a report under
6	paragraph (1), an agent of the joint underwriting association
7	shall appear at a public hearing of the Banking and Insurance
8	Committee of the Senate and the Insurance Committee of the
9	House of Representatives to testify about the contents of the
10	report.
11	(3) The joint underwriting association shall annually
12	appear before the Appropriations Committee of the Senate and
13	the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives
14	to testify as to the fiscal status of the joint underwriting
15	association and make any requests for appropriations.
16	(e) Board meetingsThe board of directors of the joint
17	underwriting association shall hold quarterly public meetings,
18	subject to the requirements under 65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7 (relating to
19	open meetings), to discuss the actuarial and fiscal status of
20	the joint underwriting association.
21	(f) Publicly accessible informationThe joint underwriting
22	association shall do all of the following:
23	(1) Submit a list of all employees of the joint
24	underwriting association as specified under section 614 of
25	The Administrative Code of 1929.
26	(2) Submit personnel information in accordance with the
27	act of June 30, 2011 (P.L.81, No.18), known as the
28	Pennsylvania Web Accountability and Transparency (PennWATCH)
29	<u>Act.</u>
30	(3) Comply with the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6,

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1	No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law.
2	(g) ProcurementThe joint underwriting association shall
3	comply with 62 Pa.C.S. Pt. I (relating to Commonwealth
4	Procurement Code).
5	(h) Commonwealth Attorneys ActThe joint underwriting
6	association shall comply with the act of October 15, 1980
7	(P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth Attorneys Act.
8	(i) OfficesThe joint underwriting association shall
9	conduct its operations in State-owned facilities.
10	(j) AppropriationsThe joint underwriting association
11	shall be funded through appropriations determined by the General
12	Assembly.
13	(k) Access to Federal tax informationThe joint
14	underwriting association shall coordinate with the Department of
15	Revenue to ensure that any employee of the joint underwriting
16	association with access to Federal tax information has met all
17	the requirements of the prerequisites of the Department of
18	Revenue to gain access to that information.
19	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
