1 § 4301. Scope of chapter. This chapter relates to the Commonwealth Office of Management 2 3 and Budget. § 4302. Legislative findings and declarations. 4 The General Assembly finds and declares that the Commonwealth 5 will benefit from devoting adequate resources to do the 6 7 following: 8 (1) Gather and coordinate data in a timely manner. 9 (2) Perform comprehensive and detailed budgeting 10 analyses. 11 (3) Implement comprehensive and effective budgeting 12 practices. (4) Coordinate all functions related to budgeting and 13 14 controlling spending in State government. 15 (5) Coordinate all functions related to information 16 technology in State government. 17 (6) Coordinate all functions of human resources in State 18 government. 19 (7) Coordinate all functions of procurement in State 20 government. 21 (8) Perform comprehensive and detailed financial 22 analyses. 23 (9) Perform comprehensive financial oversight. 24 (10) Ensure that effective financial management policies 25 are implemented throughout State government. 26 (11) Perform comprehensive and detailed performance 27 analyses. 28 (12) Ascertain whether the burdens imposed by laws and 29 rules are justified by their benefits using a rigorous cost-30 benefit analysis.

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1	(13) Measure the performance of governmental activities.
2	<u>§ 4303. Definitions.</u>
3	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
4	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
5	context clearly indicates otherwise:
6	"Administrative Code of 1929." The act of April 9, 1929
7	(P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929.
8	"Continuous improvement process system." A management
9	methodology system that combines tools to improve process speed
10	and reduce waste with data-driven project analysis to provide
11	products and services with improved quality at a lower cost. The
12	term may involve any of the following strategies:
13	(1) Developing a process map that describes the lean
14	government principles or another widely accepted business
15	process improvement system by which an executive agency
16	engages in specific activities that have the purpose of
17	increasing efficiency and eliminating waste in the processes
18	used to deliver goods and services to taxpayers and customers
19	of this Commonwealth. This strategy includes the measurement
20	of the outcomes regarding increased efficiency and the
21	elimination of waste and procedures by which the executive
22	agency produces goods or serves its customers.
23	(2) Engaging in specific activities to rapidly improve
24	an executive agency's processes that will increase value or
25	decrease staff time, inventory, defects, overproduction,
26	complexity, delays or excessive movement.
27	(3) Involving executive agency employees at all levels
28	to map the executive agency's processes and recommend
29	improvements, with specific importance placed on the
30	involvement of executive agency employees closest to the
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1	customer or end user of the State government product or
2	service.
3	(4) Providing the means to measure each process in order
4	to demonstrate the effectiveness of each process or process
5	improvement.
6	(5) Training executive agency employees to mentor and
7	train other executive agency employees in continuous
8	improvement process systems.
9	"Director." The director of the office.
10	"Executive agency." Any of the following:
11	(1) The Governor's Office.
12	(2) A department, board, commission, authority or other
13	agency of the Commonwealth that is subject to the policy
14	supervision and control of the Governor.
15	(3) The Office of Lieutenant Governor.
16	(4) An independent department.
17	(5) An independent agency.
18	"Executive board." As specified in section 204 of the
19	Administrative Code of 1929.
20	"Independent agency." A board, commission, authority or
21	other agency of the Commonwealth that is not subject to the
22	policy supervision and control of the Governor. The term does
23	not include:
24	(1) A court or agency of the unified judicial system.
25	(2) The General Assembly or an agency of the General
26	Assembly.
27	"Independent department." Any of the following:
28	(1) The Department of the Auditor General.
29	(2) The Treasury Department.
30	(3) The Office of Attorney General.

3	"Office." The Commonwealth Office of Management and Budget

20	established as an administrative department within the executive
21	branch of the government of this Commonwealth.

24	divided into the following:
25	(1) The Bureau of Budget and Financial Management.

(c) Apportionment.--The personnel, appropriations, equipment 13 14 and other items and material transferred to the office by this section shall include an appropriate portion of the general 15 16 administrative, overhead and supporting personnel, appropriations, equipment and other material of the Office of 17 18 the Budget, the Department of General Services, the Office of 19 Administration or the Office of Policy and Planning and shall also include, where applicable, Federal grants and funds and 20 21 other benefits from any Federal program. 22 (d) Status of employees.--All personnel transferred under 23 this chapter shall retain any civil service employment status 24 assigned to the personnel. § 4314. 8	(2) A reference to the Office of Administration in a
9	statute or regulation shall be deemed a reference to the
10	<u>office.</u>

The office may continue to use the name "Office of Policy and Planning" 11 12 on badges, licenses, contracts, deeds, stationery and other 13 official documents until existing supplies are exhausted. 2	form innovation teams, which shall be responsible for

14	(a) DevelopmentWithin 60 days of the effective date of
15	this section, the Governor shall:

17	third party to develop a strategic plan under this section;

19	(2) execute a memorandum of understanding with the
20	Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to develop a
21	strategic plan under this section.
22	(b) Third-party contractThe Governor may enter into a
23	contract with a qualified third-party organization under this
24	section if the organization:
25	(1) has experience with large corporate mergers of a
26	company which has more than 500 employees;
27	(2) has experience assisting in the merging of
28	government agencies in other states; and
29	(3) utilizes continuous improvement process systems to
30	strengthen the efficiency and delivery of service of agencies

6	chapter, and shall provide for:
7	(1) A 20% reduction in administrative costs.
8	(2) The consolidation of similar programs.
9	(3) The elimination of redundancy to maximize taxpayer
10	<u>dollars.</u>
11	(4) The improvement of agency services to residents of
12	this Commonwealth at a lower cost to taxpayers.
13	(5) A continuous improvement process system throughout
14	executive agencies.
15	(6) Financial transparency to residents of this
16	Commonwealth.
17	(7) A uniform accounting system and prudent financial
18	management throughout executive agencies.
19	(8) The apportionment of personnel, appropriations,
20	equipment and other items and material transferred to the
21	office under section 4313(c) (relating to general duties of
22	office and transfer provisions).
23	(d) SubmittalNo later than 210 days after the effective
24	dates of this section, the strategic plan under this section
25	shall be submitted to the General Assembly for review and any
26	hearings deemed necessary.
27	Section 2. All other acts or parts of acts are repealed
28	insofar as they are inconsistent with this act.
29	Section 3. Except as otherwise provided in 71 Pa.C.S. Ch.
30	43, all activities regarding the powers and duties under 71
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Pa.C.S. Ch. 43 which were initiated under the Office of the 1 Budget, the Department of General Services, the Office of 2 Administration or the Office of Policy and Planning shall 3 4 continue and remain in full force and effect and may be completed under 71 Pa.C.S. Ch. 43. Orders, regulations, rules 5 6 and decisions which were made under the authority of the Office of the Budget, the Department of General Services, the Office of 7 Administration or the Office of Policy and Planning regarding 8 the powers and duties under 71 Pa.C.S. Ch. 43 and which are in 9 effect on the effective date of 71 Pa.C.S. Ch. 43 shall remain 10 11 in full force and effect until revoked, vacated or modified 12 under 71 Pa.C.S. Ch. 43. Contracts, obligations and collective 13 bargaining agreements entered into under the authority of the 14 Office of the Budget, the Department of General Services, the Office of Administration or the Office of Policy and Planning 15 are not affected nor impaired by the transfer of powers and 16 duties under 71 Pa.C.S. Ch. 43. 17

Section 4. Any expenditures needed to implement this act shall be paid using encumbered funds of the respective executive agency.

21 Section 5. Within 10 days of the nomination under 71 Pa.C.S. 22 § 4316(a), the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall provide 23 notice of the nomination to the Legislative Reference Bureau, 24 which shall publish the notice in the Pennsylvania Bulletin. Section 6. This act shall take effect as follows: 25 26 The following shall take effect immediately: (1)27 (i) This section and section 5 of this act. 28 The addition of 71 Pa.C.S. §§ 4301, 4302, 4303, (ii) 4316 and 4318. 29 The remainder of this act shall take effect 30 days 30 (2)
