A RESOLUTION

Encouraging gender equity within the United States Soccer 1 Federation. 2 3 WHEREAS, The United States Soccer Federation is the single 4 common employer of male and female professional soccer players 5 who play on the United States Senior Men's National Soccer Team and United States Senior Women's National Soccer Team, 6 7 respectively; and 8 WHEREAS, In 2015, the United States Senior Women's National 9 Soccer Team defeated the Japanese National Team to become the 10 2015 Federation Internationale de Football Association (FIFA) 11 Women's World Cup Champion; and 12 WHEREAS, The 2015 World Cup Championship victory by the 13 United States Women's National Soccer Team made the team the 14 first three-time FIFA Women's World Cup winners; and 15 WHEREAS, The United States Soccer Federation has a mission to 16 "promote and govern soccer in the United States in order to make 17 it the preeminent sport recognized for excellence in participation, spectator appeal, international competition and 18

1 gender equality"; and

2 WHEREAS, Current United States Soccer Federation President 3 Carlos Cordeiro has stated that "our women's teams should be 4 respected and valued as much as our men's teams, but our female 5 players have not been treated equally"; and

6 WHEREAS, President Cordeiro's statements regarding the 7 federation's treatment of female players not only affects 8 female players' paychecks but where they play, how often they 9 play, how they train, the medical treatment they receive and how 10 they travel to and from matches; and

11 WHEREAS, Under the current pay structure, if the Men's 12 National Soccer Team and the Women's National Soccer Team were 13 to play and win 20 friendly matches a year, the male players 14 would earn an average of \$263,320 or \$13,166 per game while the 15 female players would earn an average of \$99,000 or \$4,950 per 16 game; and

WHEREAS, The current and former members of the United States Senior Women's National Team are entitled to equal pay under the Federal Equal Pay Act of 1963, and by paying the female players less than their male counterparts, the current and former members of the team have a strong legal case of pay

22 discrimination; and

23 WHEREAS, In order to further equality in sports both locally 24 and nationally, it is important that the leading organizations 25 in professional sports are held to their core mission of 26 promoting gender equality; and

27 WHEREAS, Sports organizations that are representing the 28 United States throughout the world should be held to the highest 29 standards and should treat all of their players, regardless of 30 their gender, equally; therefore be it
