## A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing April 8 through 12, 2019, as the "Week of the Young Child" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, From birth to five years of age, young children's
- 4 brains make at least 1 million neural connections every second
- 5 that form brain architecture for life; and
- 6 WHEREAS, At no other time in a human's life will the brain
- 7 develop at this remarkable speed or with such intricacy; and
- 8 WHEREAS, This is the foundation upon which all later
- 9 learning, behavior and health depend; and
- 10 WHEREAS, High-quality early care and education prepares
- 11 children to succeed in school, earn higher wages and live
- 12 healthier lives; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Participation in high-quality early care and
- 14 education saves taxpayer dollars, makes working families more
- 15 economically secure and is a revenue-generating investment over
- 16 time, benefiting society and the State and national economy; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Parents will always be the most important influence

- 1 on their children and 70% of children under six years of age in
- 2 Pennsylvania have all available parents in the workforce and
- 3 evidence-based programs that strengthen our families and ensure
- 4 access to high-quality early care and education are needed to
- 5 maximize children's potential in the first five years; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Despite the proven benefits of high-quality early
- 7 care and education, more eligible Pennsylvania children and
- 8 families need access to these services:
- 9 (1) Just 2% of all children under six years of age and
- only 5% of low-income children under six years of age are
- 11 receiving publicly funded, evidence-based home visiting
- 12 programs;
- 13 (2) Only 37% of subsidized children under five years of
- 14 age and 34% of subsidized infants and toddlers are in high-
- quality programs and only 21% of child care capacity in the
- 16 State currently meets high-quality standards;
- 17 (3) Seventy-three percent of eligible children under
- five years of age and 77% of eligible infants or toddlers are
- 19 not enrolled in the Child Care Works subsidized child care
- 20 program and a waiting list of over 3,700 children exists as
- 21 of March 2019; and
- 22 (4) Fifty-six percent of eligible children three and
- four years of age do not have access to high-quality
- 24 prekindergarten;
- 25 and
- 26 WHEREAS, High-quality early care and education depends on
- 27 high-quality programs and the educators and professionals who
- 28 ensure that children, supported by families, have the early
- 29 experiences they need for a strong start; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Early childhood educators and professionals should

- 1 be valued, respected and compensated for the important roles
- 2 they play; therefore be it
- 3 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize April 8 through 12, 2019,
- 4 as the "Week of the Young Child" in Pennsylvania.
