A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing June 14, 2019, as "National Flag Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, On June 14, 2019, Americans are observing the 242nd
- 4 anniversary of the flag of the United States of America; and
- 5 WHEREAS, "Flag Day" provides an opportunity for residents of
- 6 this Commonwealth to reflect on the rich history of our nation's
- 7 flag and its meaning to Americans and people around the world;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Boy Scouts of America are deeply committed to
- 10 preserving the American tradition of honoring "National Flag
- 11 Day"; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The Continental Congress adopted the Stars and
- 13 Stripes as the official flag of the United States on June 14,
- 14 1777; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Describing the new flag, the Congress wrote: "White
- 16 signifies Purity and Innocence; Red, Hardiness and Valor; Blue
- 17 signifies Vigilance, Perseverance and Justice"; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Over time, the flag's design evolved to keep pace

- 1 with our nation's development and growth, but its meaning as a
- 2 symbol of democracy and freedom has remained constant; and
- 3 WHEREAS, "Flag Day" was first celebrated throughout the
- 4 country in 1877; and
- 5 WHEREAS, A caring teacher who inspired a love for learning
- 6 among his students sparked a renewed interest in the flag; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Wisconsin teacher B.J. Cigrand arranged for his
- 8 pupils to observe the 108th anniversary of the flag's official
- 9 adoption in 1885; and
- 10 WHEREAS, In the following years, B.J. Cigrand promoted an
- 11 official national celebration of June 14 as "Flag Birthday" or
- 12 "Flag Day" in magazine and newspaper articles and public
- 13 addresses; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Groups in Pennsylvania, New York and Illinois took
- 15 up the cause, and after three decades of state and local
- 16 celebrations, President Woodrow Wilson officially established
- 17 "Flag Day" by proclamation in 1916; and
- 18 WHEREAS, During World War II, Americans looked to the purity,
- 19 hardiness, valor, vigilance, perseverance and justice
- 20 represented by the flag as ideals worthy of the ultimate
- 21 sacrifice in order to defeat tyranny; and
- 22 WHEREAS, In celebration of the flag's powerful meaning to
- 23 Americans and its place in our culture and history, "Flag Day"
- 24 became a national observance by an act of the Congress of the
- 25 United States in 1949 and signed into law by President Harry S.
- 26 Truman; and
- 27 WHEREAS, On August 3, 1949, to commemorate the adoption of
- 28 the flag of the United States, Congress, by joint resolution,
- 29 designated June 14 of each year as "Flag Day" and requested that
- 30 the president issue an annual proclamation calling for a

- 1 national observance and the display of the flag of the United
- 2 States on all Federal Government buildings; and
- 3 WHEREAS, In a second joint resolution, approved June 9, 1966,
- 4 Congress requested that the president annually issue a
- 5 proclamation designating the week during which June 14 falls as
- 6 "National Flag Week" and call upon all citizens of the United
- 7 States to display the flag during "National Flag Week";
- 8 therefore be it
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize June 14, 2019, as
- 10 "National Flag Day" in Pennsylvania.
