A RESOLUTION

Designating the month of September 2020 as "Childhood Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania, encouraging young Pennsylvanians who are fighting cancer, honoring young people 3 who have lost their lives to childhood cancer, expressing gratitude to the doctors and nurses who provide special care 5 to patients and families affected by childhood cancer and 6 encouraging all residents in this Commonwealth to join the 7 fight against childhood cancer. WHEREAS, Since 1975, childhood cancer rates have risen by 0.7%; and 10 11 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that 12 approximately 11,050 children in the United States under 15 13 years of age will be diagnosed with cancer in 2020; and WHEREAS, Childhood cancer is the second leading cause of 14 death in children under 15 years of age, exceeded only by 15 16 accidents, and approximately 1,190 children are expected to die from cancer in 2020; and 17 18 WHEREAS, The potential years of life lost to childhood cancer 19 and the potential years of life saved by treatment exceed all

- 1 other cancers with the exception of breast cancer; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Most children cannot be treated at a local hospital,
- 3 and families must face the disruption of relocating to receive
- 4 treatment at a regional cancer center; and
- 5 WHEREAS, As a result of major treatment advances in recent
- 6 decades, more than 84% of children with cancer now survive five
- 7 years or more; and
- 8 WHEREAS, This is a significant increase since the mid-1970s,
- 9 when the five-year survival rate was less than 60%; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Survival rates vary depending on the type of cancer
- 11 and other factors; and
- 12 WHEREAS, There is still significant progress to be made with
- 13 regard to childhood cancer treatment because many types of
- 14 childhood cancer, and some types with lower survival rates, are
- 15 very difficult to treat; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is a leader in the fight against and
- 17 treatment of childhood cancer, with six Children's Oncology
- 18 Group hospitals: St. Christopher's Hospital for Children,
- 19 Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Geisinger Medical Center,
- 20 Lehigh Valley Hospital-Cedar Crest, Penn State Health Children's
- 21 Hospital and UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Penn State Health Children's Hospital is one of only
- 23 10 institutions nationwide in the Pediatric Oncology
- 24 Experimental Therapeutic Investigators' Consortium; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The Department of Transportation reported that from
- 26 August 2019 through August 2020 Pennsylvanians contributed more
- 27 than \$1,051,840 to the Pediatric Cancer Research Fund through
- 28 its newly established donation feature made available during
- 29 online license, identification card and registration renewals;
- 30 therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of September
- 2 2020 as "Childhood Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania; and
- 3 be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That the Senate encourage young Pennsylvanians who
- 5 are fighting cancer, honor young people who have lost their
- 6 lives to childhood cancer, express gratitude to the doctors and
- 7 nurses who provide special care to patients and families
- 8 affected by childhood cancer and encourage all residents of this
- 9 Commonwealth to join the fight against childhood cancer.
