AN ACT

1 Designating that portion of Pennsylvania Route 92 from Apple
2 Tree Road to Rustic Lane in Exeter Township, Luzerne County,
3 as the Robert F. Kile, Sr., Memorial Highway; DESIGNATING A <--
4 BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY 13861, CARRYING STATE ROUTE
5 1025 OVER STATE ROUTE 1014 IN EAST PENNSBORO TOWNSHIP,
6 CUMBERLAND COUNTY, AS THE SENATOR HAL MOWERY MEMORIAL BRIDGE;
7 DESIGNATING A BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY 15986, ON THAT
8 PORTION OF INTERSTATE 79 NORTHBOUND OVER WEST 16TH STREET IN
9 THE CITY OF ERIE, ERIE COUNTY, AS THE U.S. MARINE CAPTAIN
10 THOMAS J. KENNEDY, JR., MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING THE
11 BRIDGE IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY 16385 ON THE PORTION OF STATE
12 ROUTE 4016, ALSO KNOWN AS WEST 38TH STREET, BETWEEN SCHAPER
13 AVENUE AND PITTSBURGH AVENUE OVER INTERSTATE 79 IN THE CITY
14 OF ERIE AS THE MAJOR TOM CARR MEMORIAL BRIDGE; AND MAKING
15 RELATED REPEALS.

16 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
17 hereby enacts as follows:

18 Section 1. Robert F. Kile, Sr., Memorial Highway.

19 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
20 follows:

21 (1) Robert "Bob" F. Kile, Sr., was born February 9,
22 1963, in Wilkes-Barre.

23 (2) Mr. Kile attended Bishop O'Reilly High School and,

1 upon graduation, received certificates from Luzerne Carbon
2 Community College and Bucks County Community College.

3 (3) Mr. Kile served his country with honor and
4 distinction as a member of the United States Army and the
5 Pennsylvania National Guard.

6 (4) Throughout Mr. Kile's life, he held many different
7 roles in the community and professionally, including Chair of
8 the Exeter Township Board of Supervisors, Chief of the
9 Franklin Township Fire Department, Ambulance Chief of Dallas
10 Fire and Ambulance, Second Assistant Chief and Vice President
11 of the Mt. Zion Bicentennial Fire Company, Second Assistant
12 Commander of the Harding/Mt. Zion Ambulance Association, and
13 was a certified emergency medical technician and a 10-year
14 employee with the Department of Transportation.

15 (5) Robert "Bob" F. Kile, Sr., died June 19, 2020, at
16 his home.

17 (b) Designation.--That portion of Pennsylvania Route 92 from
18 Apple Tree Road to Rustic Lane in Exeter Township, Luzerne
19 County, is designated the Robert F. Kile, Sr., Memorial Highway.

20 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
21 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
22 traffic in both directions on the highway.

25 SECTION 2. SENATOR HAL MOWERY MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

26 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
27 FOLLOWS:

28 (1) HAROLD F. MOWERY, JR., WAS BORN JANUARY 4, 1930, IN
29 CHAMBERSBURG AND WAS RAISED IN MECHANICSBURG.

30 (2) AS A GRADUATE OF MECHANICSBURG HIGH SCHOOL AND

1 DICKINSON COLLEGE, MR. MOWERY WAS A PRODUCT OF THE
2 PENNSYLVANIA EDUCATION SYSTEM.

3 (3) MR. MOWERY ENTERED THE INSURANCE BUSINESS IN 1954
4 AND EARNED A CHARTERED LIFE UNDERWRITER DEGREE. OVER SEVERAL
5 DECADES, MR. MOWERY FOUNDED MULTIPLE HIGHLY SUCCESSFUL
6 INSURANCE BUSINESSES THAT EMPLOYED HUNDREDS OF
7 PENNSYLVANIANS.

8 (4) MR. MOWERY WAS ELECTED TO THE HOUSE OF
9 REPRESENTATIVES IN 1976 AND WENT ON TO SERVE SEVEN TERMS. IN
10 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, MR. MOWERY ACHIEVED A
11 REPUTATION FOR EXPERTISE ON FISCAL AND PENSION ISSUES AND
12 ADVOCATED FOR THE APPLICATION OF PRIVATE-SECTOR BUSINESS
13 PRINCIPLES TO THE OPERATION OF PUBLIC PROGRAMS AND STATE
14 SPENDING. HE WAS ALSO INSTRUMENTAL IN ESTABLISHING THE PUBLIC
15 EMPLOYEE RETIREMENT COMMISSION.

16 (5) IN 1992, MR. MOWERY WAS ELECTED TO REPRESENT THE
17 31ST DISTRICT IN THE SENATE OF PENNSYLVANIA. HE SERVED WITH
18 DISTINCTION UNTIL HIS RETIREMENT IN 2004.

19 (6) DURING HIS TIME IN THE SENATE, SENATOR MOWERY
20 ENRICHED THE LIVES OF THOUSANDS AS CHAIRPERSON OF THE FORMER
21 PUBLIC HEALTH AND WELFARE COMMITTEE AND VICE CHAIRPERSON OF
22 THE EDUCATION COMMITTEE. HE ALSO SERVED AS VICE CHAIRPERSON
23 OF THE LEGISLATIVE DATA PROCESSING COMMITTEE AND AS A RANK-
24 AND-FILE MEMBER OF NUMEROUS STANDING COMMITTEES, INCLUDING
25 BANKING AND INSURANCE, LAW AND JUSTICE AND LABOR AND
26 INDUSTRY.

27 (7) DURING AND AFTER HIS PUBLIC SERVICE CAREER, SENATOR
28 MOWERY WAS A PROMINENT COMMUNITY LEADER. HE SUPPORTED THE
29 ESTABLISHMENT OF THE CAMP HILL LION FOUNDATION TO ENHANCE
30 ACADEMIC, ATHLETIC AND CULTURAL RESOURCES. HE WAS ALSO A

1 SUPPORTER OF THE WHITAKER CENTER FOR SCIENCE AND THE ARTS,
2 THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE GRACE MILLIMAN POLLOCK PERFORMING
3 ARTS CENTER AND THE PERFORMING ARTS, INCLUDING THE HARRISBURG
4 SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA. SENATOR MOWERY AIDED MANY CHARITIES BY
5 SPONSORING AND SUPPORTING BENEFITS, GALAS AND COMMUNITY
6 FUNDRAISERS.

7 (8) SENATOR MOWERY'S PROFESSIONAL ACHIEVEMENTS,
8 EXTENSIVE COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT AND THE MYRIAD OF AWARDS AND
9 ACCOLADES HE RECEIVED STAND AS STRONG TESTIMONY TO HIS
10 GENUINE CONCERN FOR THE WELL-BEING OF THIS COMMONWEALTH AND
11 THE PEOPLE OF THE 31ST SENATORIAL DISTRICT.

12 (9) BY ALL ACCOUNTS, SENATOR MOWERY WAS A LOVING FAMILY
13 MAN, A RESPECTED BUSINESSPERSON AND A DEDICATED AND
14 ACCOMPLISHED PUBLIC SERVANT WORTHY OF EMULATION FOR
15 GENERATIONS TO COME.

16 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY
17 13861, CARRYING STATE ROUTE 1025 OVER STATE ROUTE 1014 IN EAST
18 PENNSBORO TOWNSHIP, CUMBERLAND COUNTY, IS DESIGNATED THE SENATOR
19 HAL MOWERY MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

20 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
21 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
22 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE AND BOTH DIRECTIONS ON
23 STATE ROUTE 1014.

24 SECTION 3. U.S. MARINE CAPTAIN THOMAS J. KENNEDY, JR., MEMORIAL
25 BRIDGE.

26 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
27 FOLLOWS:

28 (1) THOMAS J. KENNEDY, JR., WAS BORN MAY 18, 1930, IN
29 THE CITY OF ERIE, ERIE COUNTY, AND SERVED THE UNITED STATES
30 IN THE MARINE CORPS, WHERE HE REACHED THE RANK OF CAPTAIN.

1 (2) CAPTAIN KENNEDY WAS THE SENIOR BATTALION ADVISOR TO
2 THE FIFTH BATTALION, VIETNAMESE MARINE BRIGADE, IN THE
3 HOSTILE AREA OF PHU AN, QUANG NGAI PROVINCE, VIETNAM.

4 (3) ON JUNE 12, 1966, CAPTAIN KENNEDY WAS WITH THE FIFTH
5 BATTALION COMMAND POST WHEN THE LEAD ELEMENTS WERE PINNED
6 DOWN BY HEAVY ENEMY FIRE AND THE COMMAND POST WAS DESTROYED
7 BY ENEMY MORTAR AND RIFLE FIRE, KILLING THE BATTALION
8 COMMANDER, THE BATTALION SURGEON, KEY STAFF OFFICERS AND
9 NUMEROUS SOLDIERS.

10 (4) ALTHOUGH SUFFERING MULTIPLE SHRAPNEL WOUNDS, CAPTAIN
11 KENNEDY LOCATED A RADIO AND, WITH HIS LAST BREATH, REPORTED
12 THE SITUATION, ALLOWING THE BATTALION TO SET UP A DEFENSIVE
13 PERIMETER AND REPULSE REPEATED ENEMY ATTACKS.

14 (5) DESPITE HIS MORTAL WOUNDS, CAPTAIN KENNEDY PREVENTED
15 ENEMY FORCES FROM OVERRUNNING THE REMAINING BATTALION UNITS
16 AND VALIANTLY GAVE HIS LIFE PROTECTING THE LIVES OF HIS
17 FELLOW MARINES.

18 (6) FOR CONSPICUOUS GALLANTRY AND INTREPIDITY IN ACTION,
19 CAPTAIN KENNEDY WAS POSTHUMOUSLY AWARDED THE SILVER STAR, THE
20 THIRD-HIGHEST PERSONAL DECORATION FOR VALOR IN COMBAT.

21 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY
22 15986, ON THAT PORTION OF INTERSTATE 79 NORTHBOUND OVER WEST
23 16TH STREET IN THE CITY OF ERIE, ERIE COUNTY, IS DESIGNATED THE
24 U.S. MARINE CAPTAIN THOMAS J. KENNEDY, JR., MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

25 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
26 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
27 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.

28 SECTION 4. MAJOR TOM CARR MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

29 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
30 FOLLOWS:

1 (1) TOM M. CARR WAS BORN APRIL 17, 1961, IN WILKES-
2 BARRE.

3 (2) MAJOR CARR WAS A 1979 GRADUATE OF ERIE TECH MEMORIAL
4 HIGH SCHOOL.

5 (3) MAJOR CARR GRADUATED FROM CLEMSON UNIVERSITY IN
6 1984, EARNING A BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE IN ELECTRICAL
7 ENGINEERING.

8 (4) IN 1986, MAJOR CARR BEGAN A DISTINGUISHED MILITARY
9 CAREER IN THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE AS AN F-16 FIGHTER
10 PILOT.

11 (5) MAJOR CARR WAS HAND-PICKED FOR THE AIR FORCE "ELITE"
12 FIGHTER WEAPONS SCHOOL, WHERE HE WAS PRAISED FOR HIS
13 OUTSTANDING LEADERSHIP AS SENIOR RANKING OFFICER.

14 (6) DURING HIS SERVICE, MAJOR CARR WAS STATIONED IN
15 KOREA, THE PERSIAN GULF, ITALY, BAHRAIN, BOSNIA, AND IRAQ.
16 HE FLEW NUMEROUS COMBAT MISSIONS, INCLUDING DURING OPERATION
17 NORTHERN WATCH IN IRAQ, AND FLEW OVER 2,000 FIGHTER SORTIES.

18 (7) AFTER LEAVING ACTIVE DUTY, MAJOR CARR BECAME AN AIR
19 FORCE RESERVIST ASSIGNED TO THE 93RD FIGHTER SQUADRON AT
20 HOMESTEAD AIR RESERVE STATION IN FLORIDA, WHERE HE SERVED AS
21 THE SQUADRON WEAPONS OFFICER.

22 (8) MAJOR CARR'S OUTSTANDING PROFESSIONAL SKILL,
23 LEADERSHIP AND CEASELESS EFFORTS AS AN AIR FORCE RESERVIST
24 FACILITATED TWO MAJOR OVERSEAS DEPLOYMENTS, THREE LIVE
25 WEAPONS DEPLOYMENTS, ONE OPERATIONAL READINESS INSPECTION AND
26 AN EXPEDITIOUS CONVERSION FROM THE F-16A TO THE F-16C
27 AIRCRAFT.

28 (9) ON SEPTEMBER 12, 1998, MAJOR CARR SACRIFICED HIS
29 LIFE IN DEFENSE OF HIS NATION WHEN, DURING AN AIR FORCE
30 ATTACK-TRAINING MISSION, HIS F-16D JET WENT DOWN OVER THE

1 AVON BOMBING RANGE IN FLORIDA.

2 (10) MAJOR CARR WAS POSTHUMOUSLY AWARDED THE MERITORIOUS
3 SERVICE MEDAL BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.

4 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY 16385
5 ON THE PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 4016, ALSO KNOWN AS WEST 38TH
6 STREET, BETWEEN SCHAPER AVENUE AND PITTSBURGH AVENUE OVER
7 INTERSTATE 79 IN THE CITY OF ERIE IS DESIGNATED THE MAJOR TOM
8 CARR MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

9 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
10 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
11 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE AND TO TRAFFIC IN BOTH
12 DIRECTIONS ON INTERSTATE 79 CROSSING UNDER THE BRIDGE.

13 SECTION 5. REPEALS.

14 REPEALS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

15 (1) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DECLARES THAT THE REPEAL UNDER
16 PARAGRAPH (2) IS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE DESIGNATION
17 UNDER SECTION 2 OF THIS ACT.

18 (2) THE ACT OF JUNE 5, 2020 (P.L.244, NO.31), ENTITLED
19 "AN ACT DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE CARRYING STATE ROUTE 1025 OVER
20 U.S. ROUTE 11/15 IN EAST PENNSBORO TOWNSHIP, CUMBERLAND
21 COUNTY, AS THE SENATOR HAL MOWERY MEMORIAL BRIDGE," IS
22 REPEALED.

23 (3) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DECLARES THAT THE REPEAL UNDER
24 PARAGRAPH (4) IS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE DESIGNATION
25 UNDER SECTION 3 OF THIS ACT.

26 (4) SECTION 6 OF THE ACT OF JULY 2, 2019 (P.L.318,
27 NO.44), ENTITLED "AN ACT DESIGNATING A BRIDGE ON THAT PORTION
28 OF STATE ROUTE 3047 OVER THE SOUTH BRANCH OF BLACKLICK CREEK,
29 BLACKLICK TOWNSHIP, CAMBRIA COUNTY, AS THE PRIVATE FIRST

2 PHILADELPHIA COUNTY AS THE POLICE OFFICER RAYMOND DIAZ, JR.,
3 MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING THE PORTION OF INTERSTATE 376
4 FROM THE END OF THE BRIDGE IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY 3522 TO
5 THE EXIT AT STATE ROUTE 51 IN BEAVER COUNTY AS THE RICHARD L.
6 SHAW MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE IDENTIFIED AS
7 BRIDGE KEY 3522 ON THAT PORTION OF INTERSTATE 376 OVER THE
8 OHIO RIVER IN VANPORT TOWNSHIP, BEAVER COUNTY, AS THE USAF
9 COMBAT CONTROLLER STAFF SGT. DYLAN ELCHIN MEMORIAL BRIDGE;
10 DESIGNATING THE FIRST BLOCK OF WEST MAIN STREET, STATE ROUTE
11 1010, IN FLEETWOOD BOROUGH, BERKS COUNTY, AS THE ALEX J.
12 SZOKE HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE
13 KEY 15986 ON THAT PORTION OF INTERSTATE 79 NORTHBOUND OVER
14 WEST 16TH STREET IN THE CITY OF ERIE, ERIE COUNTY, AS THE
15 THOMAS J. KENNEDY, JR., MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING THE
16 BRIDGE ON THAT PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 4011 OVER PINE CREEK,
17 HEGINS TOWNSHIP, SCHUYLKILL COUNTY, AS THE A. DONALD
18 BUFFINGTON MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF
19 PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 144 BEGINNING AT THE INTERSECTION OF
20 PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 64 IN PLEASANT GAP AND ENDING AT THE
21 INTERSECTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 45 IN CENTRE HALL, CENTRE
22 COUNTY, AS THE DUSTER-QUAD 50-SEARCHLIGHT HIGHWAY; AND
23 DESIGNATING A PORTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 50 IN
24 INDEPENDENCE TOWNSHIP, WASHINGTON COUNTY, AS THE LT. COL.
25 JUANITA L. WARMAN MEMORIAL HIGHWAY," IS REPEALED.

26 (5) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DECLARES THAT THE REPEAL UNDER
27 PARAGRAPH (6) IS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE DESIGNATION
28 UNDER SECTION 4 OF THIS ACT.

29 (6) SECTION 10 OF THE ACT OF OCTOBER 24, 2018 (P.L.1163,
30 NO.161), ENTITLED "AN ACT DESIGNATING A BRIDGE ON THAT

1 PORTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 100 OVER THE SCHUYLKILL RIVER
2 IN POTTSTOWN BOROUGH, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, AS THE NEWSTELL
3 MARABLE, SR., MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE ON
4 STOUGHSTOWN ROAD OVER INTERSTATE 81 IN CUMBERLAND COUNTY
5 (BRIDGE NUMBER 21-3007-0020-0865), AS THE PRIVATE RAYMOND
6 LAFAYETTE NAUGLE MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE ON

12 PEARY HIGHWAY, IN CAMBRIA TOWNSHIP, CAMBRIA COUNTY, AS THE
13 PFC NICK KOZOROSKY MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A BRIDGE ON
14 THAT PORTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 286, KNOWN AS WASHINGTON
15 STREET, OVER THE KISKIMINETAS RIVER, BETWEEN SALTSBURG
16 BOROUGH, INDIANA COUNTY, AND LOYALHANNA TOWNSHIP,
17 WESTMORELAND COUNTY, AS THE FIRST SERGEANT ALEXANDER KELLY
18 MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING THE BRIDGE IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE

21 CITY OF HARRISBURG, DAUPHIN COUNTY, AS THE SPECIALIST 4
22 REUBEN GARNETT, JR., MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A PORTION
23 OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 54 IN WEST MAHANAY TOWNSHIP, SCHUYLKILL
24 COUNTY, AS THE FRANCIS V. "ANGIE" MCANDREW MEMORIAL HIGHWAY;
25 DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 2026 IN UPPER MORELAND
26 TOWNSHIP, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, AS THE CORPORAL MICHAEL DENNIS
27 COOKE MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING THE PORTION OF STATE
28 ROUTE 192 FROM THE INTERSECTION WITH STATE ROUTE 477 IN MILES
29 TOWNSHIP, CENTRE COUNTY, TO THE INTERSECTION WITH STATE ROUTE
