1	<u>§ 3501. Definitions.</u>
2	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
3	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
4	context clearly indicates otherwise:
5	<u>"Commonwealth agency." A department, agency or commission of</u>
6	the Commonwealth under the policy supervision and control of the
7	Governor.
8	<u>"Contractor." A person, including, but not limited to, a</u>
9	<u>bidder, offeror, loan recipient grantee or lessor, who has</u>
10	furnished or performed or seeks to furnish or perform goods,
11	supplies, services, leased space, construction or other activity
12	with an executive agency.
13	"Department." The Treasury Department of the Commonwealth.
14	<u>"Entity." A corporation, joint-stock association, business</u>
15	trust, limited liability company, sole proprietorship, nonprofit
16	corporation or Subchapter S corporation.
17	"Improper payment." A payment made by a Commonwealth agency
18	that:
19	(1) exceeds the amount a recipient should have received
20	from a Commonwealth agency;
21	(2) is less than the amount a recipient should have
22	received from the Commonwealth;
23	(3) makes a payment to a recipient that was ineligible
24	to receive money from the particular program from the
25	<u>Commonwealth;</u>
26	(4) was ineligible;
27	(5) was duplicative or redundant;
28	(6) was for a service which was never received; or
29	(7) was for a service that does not account for or was
30	not given any of the available credits or the discounts
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1	available for the service rendered.
2	"Initiative." The Do-Not-Pay Initiative established under_
3	section 3502 (relating to establishment).
4	<u>"Office." The Governor's Budget Office.</u>
5	"Payment." Money expended by the Commonwealth as part of the
6	operating budget for the Commonwealth.
7	"Recipient." An individual, contractor or entity.
8	"Secretary." The Secretary of the Budget of the
9	<u>Commonwealth.</u>
10	<u>§ 3502. Establishment.</u>
11	(a) Initiative establishment. The Do Not-Pay Initiative is
12	established in the department for the purpose of monitoring
13	improper payments across Commonwealth agencies. As part of the
14	initiative, the department shall enter into a memorandum of
15	understanding with the United States Treasury Department to join
16	the United States Treasury Department's Do Not Pay program.
17	(b) Operation and assistance. The office shall assist the
18	department in the operation of the initiative and ensure the
19	department has the necessary information from each Commonwealth
20	agency.
21	(c) Database. The initiative shall provide a searchable
22	database of recipients that are not eligible to receive payment
23	from the Commonwealth under section 3503 (relating to award and
24	payment).
25	(d) Agency use of database An agency shall, with the
26	assistance of the office, utilize the database under subsection
27	(c) in order to determine eligibility for the awarding and
28	disbursement of payments.
29	(e) Information sharing A Commonwealth agency shall
30	provide the department with all information necessary for the
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1	operation and maintenance of the initiative.
2	(f) Prohibition. A Commonwealth agency may not award or
3	issue payment to a recipient that is listed on the initiative's
4	database unless the payment is determined by the secretary of
5	the agency as being necessary and:
6	(1) The award or payment is for services which cannot be
7	provided or provided in a timely manner by another entity or
8	recipient.
9	(2) The award or payment is required as a condition of
10	receiving Federal money for programs jointly funded with
11	Federal and Commonwealth money.

20	THE FOLLOWING WORDS AND PHRASES WHEN USED IN THIS CHAPTER
21	SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS SECTION UNLESS THE
22	CONTEXT CLEARLY INDICATES OTHERWISE:
23	"COMMONWEALTH AGENCY." A DEPARTMENT, AGENCY OR COMMISSION OF
24	THE COMMONWEALTH UNDER THE POLICY SUPERVISION AND CONTROL OF THE
25	GOVERNOR.
26	"IMPROPER PAYMENT." A PAYMENT MADE BY A COMMONWEALTH AGENCY

30	(2) IS LESS THAN THE AMOUNT A RECIPIENT SHOULD HAVE

2	(3) IS MADE TO A RECIPIENT WHO IS INELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE
3	THE PAYMENT FROM A PARTICULAR COMMONWEALTH PROGRAM;

5	(5) IS DUPLICATIVE OR REDUNDANT;
6	(6) IS FOR A SERVICE WHICH WAS NEVER RECEIVED; OR

18	(A) PARTICIPATION A COMMONWEALTH AGENCY THAT MAKES
19	PAYMENTS BY EXPENDING FEDERAL FUNDS SHALL ENTER INTO A
20	MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE UNITED STATES TREASURY
21	DEPARTMENT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE INITIATIVE. THE PARTICIPATION
22	IN THE INITIATIVE BY A COMMONWEALTH AGENCY SHALL INCLUDE ALL OF
