AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," in professional employees EMPLOYEES, 5 providing for day-to-day substitutes; and, in certification of teachers, further providing for substitute teaching permit for prospective teachers and for program of continuing 8 professional education. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 13 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 14 section to read: 15 Section 1114. Day-to-Day Substitutes.--(a) (1) An 16 individual holding a day-to-day substitute permit issued by the 17 department may serve as a day-to-day substitute in any 18 certificate area for a period not exceeding twenty (20) days of substituting for a professional AN INDIVIDUAL PROFESSIONAL OR <--19

TEMPORARY PROFESSIONAL employe. If the individual's service

- 10 (b) (1) An individual holding a day-to-day substitute
- 11 permit issued by a chief school administrator may serve as a
- 12 <u>day-to-day substitute in any certificate area for a period not</u>
- 13 exceeding twenty (20) days of substituting for a professional AN_<--
- 14 <u>INDIVIDUAL PROFESSIONAL OR TEMPORARY PROFESSIONAL employe. If a </u>
- 15 person's service exceeds twenty (20) days of substituting for a <--

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- 16 professional AN INDIVIDUAL PROFESSIONAL OR TEMPORARY
- 17 PROFESSIONAL employe, an emergency permit pursuant to 22 Pa.
- 18 Code § 49.31 (relating to criteria for eligibility) issued by
- 19 the department is required.
- 20 (2) An individual holding a day-to-day substitute permit
- 21 under paragraph (1) may serve as a day-to-day substitute for
- 22 <u>more than one professional OR TEMPORARY PROFESSIONAL employe</u>
- 23 within a school year, even if the individual serves as a
- 24 <u>substitute for more than twenty (20) cumulative days.</u>
- 25 (3) As used in this subsection, the term "chief school
- 26 administrator" shall include a school district superintendent,
- 27 an executive director of an intermediate unit, an administrative
- 28 director of an area career and technical school or a chief-
- 29 executive officer of a charter school, regional charter school
- 30 <u>or cyber charter school.</u>

- 1 (c) The department shall update certification staffing
- 2 <u>quidelines to comply with this section</u>.
- 3 (d) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 4 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 5 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 6 "CHIEF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR" SHALL INCLUDE A SCHOOL DISTRICT <--
- 7 SUPERINTENDENT, AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF AN INTERMEDIATE UNIT,
- 8 AN ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR OF AN AREA CAREER AND TECHNICAL
- 9 SCHOOL OR A CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF A CHARTER SCHOOL,
- 10 REGIONAL CHARTER SCHOOL OR CYBER CHARTER SCHOOL.
- 11 "Day-to-day substitute permit" shall mean a permit issued for-<--
- 12 <u>no longer than twenty (20) consecutive days to fill a position</u>
- 13 <u>due to the absence of professional certified personnel.</u> BY THE <--
- 14 <u>DEPARTMENT OR A CHIEF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR TO FILL A POSITION</u>
- 15 DUE TO THE TEMPORARY ABSENCE OF A PROFESSIONAL OR TEMPORARY
- 16 PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYE AND FOR WHICH A LONG-TERM SUBSTITUTE PERMIT
- 17 IS NOT REQUIRED.
- 18 "Emergency permit" shall mean a permit issued to fill a
- 19 vacancy resulting from resignation, termination, retirement,
- 20 death or the creation of a new position.
- 21 "Long-term substitute permit" shall mean a permit issued for <--
- 22 an indeterminate period to fill a position due to the absence of
- 23 professional certified personnel. BY THE DEPARTMENT THAT ALLOWS <--
- 24 A PERSON TO SUBSTITUTE FOR AN INDIVIDUAL PROFESSIONAL OR
- 25 TEMPORARY PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYE FOR MORE THAN TWENTY (20) DAYS.
- 26 Section 2. Section 1201.1(a) introductory paragraph and (b)
- 27 of the act, amended October 30, 2019 (P.L.460, No.76), are
- 28 amended to read:
- 29 Section 1201.1. Substitute Teaching Permit for Prospective
- 30 Teachers.--[(a)] An individual who does not hold a certificate

- 1 under section 1201 shall be eligible to teach as a substitute in
- 2 a school district, an area career and technical school or an
- 3 intermediate unit provided that:

- 5 [(b) This section shall expire on June 30, 2021.]
- 6 Section 3. Section 1205.2(k)(3) of the act is amended to
- 7 read:
- 8 Section 1205.2. Program of Continuing Professional
- 9 Education. -- * * *
- 10 (k) A professional educator who is not employed by a school
- 11 entity as a professional or temporary professional employe may
- 12 apply to the department for inactive certification. Inactive
- 13 certification shall:
- 14 * * *
- 15 (3) Disqualify an individual from being employed by a school
- 16 entity as a professional or temporary employe. An individual
- 17 with inactive certification who is not an annuitant as defined
- 18 in 24 Pa.C.S. § 8102 (relating to definitions) or 71 Pa.C.S. §
- 19 <u>5102 (relating to definitions)</u> may be employed as a substitute
- 20 teacher, principal, superintendent or assistant superintendent
- 21 in accordance with the endorsement on the individual's
- 22 certificate or letter of eligibility for no more than [ninety
- 23 (90) one hundred twenty (120) ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY (180) days

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- 24 during a school year.
