## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in school health services, providing for seizure recognition and related first aid training.	
7	This act may be referred to as the DOMinate Epilepsy Law.	
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania	
9	hereby enacts as follows:	
10	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known	
11	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a	
12	section to read:	
13	Section 1414.11. Seizure Recognition and Related First Aid	
14	Training(a) Beginning with the school year 2021-2022 and	
15	each year thereafter:	
16	(1) A school nurse may complete a Department of Health	<
17	approved HEALTH-APPROVED online course of instruction or in-	<
18	person training for school nurses regarding management of a	
19	student with seizures that includes information about seizure	

1	recognition, a seizure action plan and related first aid.
2	(2) A professional employe of a school entity, other than a
3	school nurse, whose duties at the school entity include direct
4	contact with students may complete a Department of Health-
5	approved online course of instruction or in-person training
6	regarding awareness of a student with seizures that includes
7	information about seizure recognition and related first aid.
8	(3) Training under this section shall be provided at no cost
9	and credited toward a professional educator's continuing
10	professional education requirement under section 1205.2, any <
11	staff development requirements for paraprofessionals under 22
12	Pa. Code § 14.105 (relating to personnel) and a school or system
13	leader's continuing professional education requirement under
14	<u>section 1205.5.</u>
15	(4) Completion of seizure disorder training shall not be
16	construed to obligate a professional employe to administer
17	medication or provide medical care to a student with a seizure
18	<u>disorder.</u>
19	(5) A professional employe acting in good faith and within
20	the scope of the authority provided under this section shall not
21	be liable for civil damages as a result of an act or omission in
22	the course of any training or related first aid under this
23	section.
24	(6) No later than June 30, 2021, the Department of Health,
25	in consultation with the Department of Education, shall identify
26	and approve an online course of instruction or in-person
27	training provided by a nonprofit national foundation that
28	supports the welfare of individuals with epilepsy and seizure
29	disorders to satisfy the training required under this section.
30	(7) The Department of Health, in consultation with the
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1	Department of Education, shall adopt guidelines to administer
2	this section.
3	(b) The following shall apply:
4	(1) The Department of Health shall provide a nonpublic
5	school with access to the approved online course of instruction
6	or in-person training regarding awareness of a student with
7	seizures that includes information about seizure recognition and
8	related first aid at no cost. The access to and completion of
9	seizure disorder training by nonpublic school employes shall not
10	be construed to do any of the following:
11	(i) Create, establish or expand any obligations on the part
12	of a nonpublic school to comply with section 504 of the
13	Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Public Law 93-112, 29 U.S.C. § 794).
14	(ii) Create, establish, result in or expand any contractual
15	obligations on the part of a nonpublic school.
16	(2) No nonpublic school employe or nonpublic school shall be
17	liable for civil damages as a result of an act or omission in
18	the course of any training or related first aid under this
19	section except that an employe may be liable for willful
20	misconduct.
21	(c) For purposes of this section, the following terms shall
22	have the following meanings:
23	"Nonpublic school." A nonprofit school, other than a public
24	school in this Commonwealth, wherein a resident of this
25	Commonwealth may legally fulfill the compulsory school
26	attendance requirements of this act and which meets the
27	applicable requirements of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of
28	<u>1964 (Public Law 88-352, 78 Stat. 241).</u>
29	"Professional employe." The term shall have the meaning
30	given in section 1101.

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- 1 <u>"School entity." A school district, intermediate unit, area</u>
- 2 <u>career and technical school, charter school, cyber charter</u>
- 3 <u>school or regional charter school.</u>
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
