## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Providing for access to congregate care facilities for essential caregivers, for additional safety requirements for residents of congregate care facilities, for suspension of access for essential caregivers and for personal protective equipment < for COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH SAFETY MEASURES RELATED TO < essential caregivers.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Short title.
10	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Access to
11	Congregate Care Facilities Act.
12	Section 2. Definitions.
13	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
14	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
15	context clearly indicates otherwise:
16	"Congregate care facility." A facility licensed by the
17	department or the Department of Human Services, including, but
18	not limited to, a long-term care nursing facility, a skilled
19	nursing facility, an assisted living facility, a personal care

home, an independent long-term care facility or an intermediate
 care facility for individuals with intellectual disabilities.

3 "Declaration of disaster emergency." A disaster emergency 4 declared by the Governor under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) (relating to 5 general authority of Governor).

6 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth. 7 "Essential caregiver." An individual, whether a family 8 member or friend of a resident of a congregate care facility, 9 who is designated by the resident or appointed by an individual 10 with decision-making authority for the resident to provide 11 physical or emotional support to the resident during a 12 declaration of disaster emergency.

13 Section 3. Access to congregate care facilities for essential 14 caregivers.

15 The department, in consultation with the Department of Human 16 Services, shall establish protocols to allow a resident of a 17 congregate care facility or an individual with decision-making 18 authority for the resident to designate an individual as the 19 resident's essential caregiver during a declaration of disaster 20 emergency. A resident of a congregate care facility or an 21 individual with decision-making authority for the resident shall designate an essential caregiver during the intake of the 22 23 resident into the congregate care facility. An essential 24 caregiver shall meet the necessary qualifications to enter the congregate care facility to provide in-person physical or 25 26 emotional support to a resident of a congregate care facility in accordance with the protocols established under this section. 27 THE DEPARTMENT MAY UPDATE THE PROTOCOLS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS 28 <---29 SECTION AT ANY TIME DURING THE DISASTER EMERGENCY. THE DEPARTMENT MAY NOT UPDATE THE PROTOCOLS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS 30

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SECTION TO EXTEND THE DURATION OF THE LOCK-DOWN PHASE UNDER
 PARAGRAPH (3) FOR A TIME PERIOD EXCEEDING 45 DAYS. The protocols
 shall include all of the following:

4 (1) Safety measures for an essential caregiver,
5 including, but not limited to, restrictions on travel,
6 enhanced testing for communicable diseases and the necessary
7 safety equipment required to protect the health and safety of
8 the residents of the congregate care facility.

9 (2) Procedures to replace an essential caregiver due to 10 necessary circumstances, including illness or death of the 11 essential caregiver.

12 A duration SET BY THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION (3)<---13 WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, not to exceed <del>30</del> 45 <---14 days after a declaration of disaster emergency, when a 15 congregate care facility may enter a lock-down phase DURING <---16 WHICH THE CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY SHALL EXCLUDE ESSENTIAL 17 CAREGIVERS for the purpose of establishing safety measures 18 for residents of the congregate care facility and essential 19 caregivers. If a congregate care facility requires an <---20 extension of the lock down phase under this paragraph, the 21 congregate care facility shall require staff of the-22 congregate care facility to remain in the congregate care 23 facility during the extended period to prevent the potential 24 spread of a communicable disease to the congregate care-25 facility. 26 Section 4. Additional safety requirements for residents of 27 congregate care facilities. 28 (a) Additional safety requirements. -- A A congregate care <---29 facility may establish reasonable, additional safety 30 requirements to protect the residents of the congregate care

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1 facility if the, INCLUDING LIMITATIONS ON THE DURATION OF THE <--</p>
2 VISITS, THE NUMBER OF VISITS PER WEEK PER RESIDENT, THE LOCATION
3 OF VISITS AND THE SPACING OF VISITORS. THE requirements UNDER <--</p>
4 THIS SUBSECTION SHALL meet all of the following criteria:

5 (1) The requirements are directly linked to a6 declaration of disaster emergency.

7 (2) The requirements are not so burdensome and onerous 8 as to substantially prevent an essential caregiver from being 9 able to physically or emotionally support a resident of the 10 congregate care facility in person.

11 (b) Costs. An essential caregiver shall pay the costs of <--</p>
12 the reasonable, additional safety measures established under
13 subsection (a). A congregate care facility may not pay the costs
14 of the reasonable, additional safety measures established under
15 subsection (a).

16 Section 5. Suspension of access for essential caregivers.

A congregate care facility may suspend access to the congregate care facility for an essential caregiver who violates the protocols established under section 3, and the congregate care facility shall allow the resident, or an individual with decision-making authority for the resident, to immediately designate a replacement essential caregiver.

23 Section 6. Personal protective equipment for essential
24 caregivers.

A congregate care facility may require an essential caregiver to provide personal protective equipment for himself or herself or assume the cost of the personal protective equipment provided by the facility to allow the essential caregiver to provide inperson physical or emotional support. SECTION 6. COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH SAFETY MEASURES RELATED TO <---

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ESSENTIAL CAREGIVERS.

2 A CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY MAY REQUIRE AN ESSENTIAL CAREGIVER3 TO ASSUME THE COSTS OF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:

4 (1) PROVIDING PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT FOR HIMSELF
5 OR HERSELF TO ALLOW THE ESSENTIAL CAREGIVER TO SAFELY PROVIDE
6 IN-PERSON PHYSICAL OR EMOTIONAL SUPPORT. PERSONAL PROTECTIVE
7 EQUIPMENT PROVIDED BY THE CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY MAY NOT
8 REDUCE THE PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT AVAILABLE TO THE
9 EMPLOYEES AND STAFF OF THE CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY.

MEETING THE ADDITIONAL SAFETY REQUIREMENTS
 ESTABLISHED BY THE CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY UNDER SECTION 4.
 Section 7. Applicability.

This act shall apply for the period commencing 15 days after a declaration of disaster emergency and THAT RESULTS IN THE <--CLOSURE OF CONGREGATE CARE FACILITIES UNTIL 60 days after the termination or expiration of the declaration of disaster emergency by executive order, proclamation or operation of law. Section 8. Construction.

19 Nothing in this act shall be construed to supersede Federal 20 authority or guidance regarding congregate care facilities or to 21 prevent the department or Department of Human Services from 22 taking necessary actions to render the Commonwealth eligible for 23 Federal funds or reimbursement services provided in congregate 24 care facilities.

25 Section 9. Effective date.

26 This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
