8	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated	
9	Statutes is amended by adding sections A SECTION to read:	<
10	§ 7309. Retail store closure OPERATIONS during declaration of	<
11	disaster emergency.	
12	(A) CLOSURE PROHIBITED Notwithstanding the provisions of	<
13	this chapter or any other provision of law to the contrary, the	-
14	Governor may not close a retail store during a declaration of	
15	disaster emergency under section 7301 (relating to general	
16	authority of Governor) if the retail store IS ABLE TO PROVIDE	<
17	ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SERVICES:	

1	(1) restricts RESTRICTING access during a declaration of <
2	disaster emergency to one customer in the retail store
3	<pre>facility AND ONE EMPLOYEE at a time.; and</pre>
4	(2) restricts store operations to one employee in the
5	retail store facility at a time.
6	§ 7310. Contactless and curbside business operations during
7	declaration of disaster emergency.
8	A business shall be permitted, under a declaration by the
9	Governor of disaster emergency under section 7301(c) (relating
10	to general authority of Governor) on or before March 6, 2020, to
11	transition to contactless and curbside business operations for
12	the duration of the declaration of disaster emergency. The
13	following shall apply:
14	(1) A business shall:
15	(i) Comply with the Centers for Disease Control and
16	Prevention's Interim Guidance for Businesses and
17	Employers to Plan and Respond to Coronavirus Disease 2019
18	(COVID-19), promulgated under the Federal public health
19	emergency declared on January 31, 2020, under section 319
20	of the Public Health Service Act (58 Stat. 682, 42 U.S.C.
21	§ 247d) in relation to social distancing and sanitation
22	<del>protocols.</del>
23	<del>(ii) Maintain</del>
24	(2) CONTACTLESS CURBSIDE RETAIL STORE OPERATIONS. <
25	(B) OPERATIONS IF A RETAIL STORE REMAINS OPEN DURING A
26	DECLARATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY, THE RETAIL STORE:
27	(1) SHALL ADHERE TO FEDERAL AND STATE GUIDELINES TO
28	PROTECT THE RETAIL STORE'S CUSTOMERS AND EMPLOYEES;
29	(2) MAY MAINTAIN employees necessary to support taking
30	of orders through online, telephone or other means when

1	personal interaction is limited during a transaction if	<
2	employees adhere to social distancing and appropriate	
3	sanitation protocols.	
4	<u>(iii) Provide;</u>	<
5	(3) MAY PROVIDE contactless local delivery and curbside	
6	pick-up service of online or telephone orders.	<
7	(iv) Prohibit cash payments for transactions.	
8	(2) Any violation of paragraph (1) shall result in the	
9	immediate suspension of business operations.; AND	<
10	(4) MAY PROHIBIT CASH PAYMENTS FOR TRANSACTIONS IF	
11	NECESSARY TO PROVIDE SAFETY TO THE CUSTOMERS DURING THE	
12	DECLARATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY.	
13	(C) SUSPENSION ANY VIOLATION UNDER SUBSECTION (B) (1) SHALL	_
14	RESULT IN THE IMMEDIATE SUSPENSION OF THE RETAIL STORE'S	
15	OPERATIONS.	
16	Section 2. All regulations and parts of regulations are	
17	abrogated to the extent of any inconsistency with the provisions	
18	of this act.	
19	Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
