AN ACT

1 Amending the act of June 26, 2001 (P.L.755, No.77), entitled "An
2 act establishing a special fund and account for money
3 received by the Commonwealth from the Master Settlement
4 Agreement with tobacco manufacturers; providing for home and
5 community-based care, for tobacco use prevention and
6 cessation efforts, for Commonwealth universal research
7 enhancement, for hospital uncompensated care, for health
8 investment insurance, for medical assistance for workers with
9 disabilities, for regional biotechnology research centers,
10 for the HealthLink Program, for community-based health care
11 assistance programs, for PACE reinstatement and PACENET
12 expansion, for medical education loan assistance and for
13 percentage allocation and appropriation of moneys," in
14 medical assistance for workers with disabilities, further
15 providing for definitions and for medical assistance benefits
16 for workers with disabilities and workers with medically
17 improved disabilities.

18 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
19 hereby enacts as follows:

20 Section 1. The definitions of "worker with a disability" and
21 "worker with a medically improved disability" in section 1502 of
22 the act of June 26, 2001 (P.L.755, No.77), known as the Tobacco
23 Settlement Act, are amended and the section is amended by adding
24 a definition to read:

1 Section 1502. Definitions.

2 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
3 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
4 context clearly indicates otherwise:

5 * * *

6 "Worker with a disability." An individual who meets all of
7 the following:

8 (1) is at least 16 years of age [but less than 65 years
9 of age] and meets age requirements as established under
10 applicable Federal law;

11 (2) is employed and receiving compensation;

12 (3) is eligible to receive Supplemental Security Income
13 except for earnings and resources that exceed the limit
14 established in section 1905 of the Social Security Act (49
15 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 1396d(q) (2) (B));

16 (4) has monthly income below 250% of the Federal poverty
17 income guidelines; and

18 (5) has countable resources equal to or less than
19 \$10,000.

20 "Worker with a medically improved disability." An individual
21 who meets all of the following:

22 (1) is at least 16 years of age [but less than 65 years
23 of age] and meets age requirements as established under
24 applicable Federal law;

25 (2) is employed at least 40 hours per month and is
26 earning at least the applicable minimum wage under section 6
27 of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (52 Stat. 1060, 29
28 U.S.C. § 206);

29 (3) was previously a worker with a disability and
30 participated in medical assistance;

1 (4) has monthly income below 250% of the Federal poverty
2 income guidelines; and

3 (5) has countable resources equal to or less than
4 \$10,000.

5 "Worker with job success." An individual who meets all of
6 the following:

7 (1) is at least 16 years of age and meets age
8 requirements as established under Federal law;

9 (2) is earning at least the minimum wage under section 6
10 of the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (52 Stat. 1060, 29
11 U.S.C. § 206);

12 (3) has participated in a medical assistance for workers
13 with disabilities category or a medical assistance for
14 workers with medically improved disabilities category for the
15 previous 12 consecutive months;

16 (4) has monthly income that is more than 250% of the
17 Federal poverty income guidelines; and

18 (5) may have countable assets in excess of \$10,000 that
19 have been developed since the individual's initial
20 eligibility under this subsection.

21 Section 2. Section 1503 of the act is amended to read:

22 Section 1503. Medical assistance benefits for workers with
23 disabilities [and], workers with medically improved
24 disabilities and workers with job success.

25 (a) Program establishment.--There is established in the
26 department a medical assistance purchase program for workers
27 with disabilities [and], workers with medically improved
28 disabilities and workers with job success. Appropriations to the
29 department from [the fund] all sources of funds for the program
30 shall be used by the department to provide medical assistance to

1 a worker with a disability [or] a worker with a medically
2 improved disability or a worker with job success.

3 (b) Worker with a disability [or] worker with a medically
4 improved disability or worker with job success
5 responsibilities.--[A worker with a disability or a worker with
6 a medically improved disability seeking to purchase medical
7 assistance benefits shall:

8 (1) Pay to the department or its designee 5% of the
9 worker's monthly income in a manner to be determined by the
10 department.

11 (2) Notify the department or its designee of any change
12 in the worker's monthly income in a manner to be determined
13 by the department.

14 (3) Failure of a worker with a disability or a worker
15 with a medically improved disability to make payments in
16 accordance with paragraph (1) will result in the termination
17 of medical assistance coverage.]

18 (1) A worker with a disability or a worker with a
19 medically improved disability seeking to purchase medical
20 assistance benefits shall pay to the department or its
21 designee 5% of the worker's monthly income in a manner to be
22 determined by the department. Failure of a worker with a
23 disability or a worker with a medically improved disability
24 to make payments in accordance with this paragraph shall
25 result in the termination of medical assistance coverage.

26 (2) A worker with job success seeking to purchase
27 medical assistance benefits shall pay to the department or
28 its designee 7.5% of the worker's monthly income in a manner
29 to be determined by the department. Failure of a worker with
30 job success to make payments in accordance with this

1 paragraph shall result in the termination of medical
2 assistance coverage.

3 (3) A worker with a disability, a worker with a
4 medically improved disability or a worker with job success
5 shall notify the department or its designee of any change in
6 the worker's monthly income in a manner to be determined by
7 the department.

8 (b.1) Payment.--A worker with job success who participates
9 in medical assistance for workers with disabilities with income
10 at or above \$75,000 compounded by the cost-of-living increases
11 granted by the Federal Government under the Social Security
12 program annually since the year 2000 seeking to purchase medical
13 assistance benefits shall pay to the department or its designee
14 100% of the Commonwealth's average cost of the medical
15 assistance for workers with disabilities program.

16 (b.2) Determination of eligibility.--Assets developed by a
17 medical assistance for workers with disabilities enrollee who
18 was made eligible under the job success category will not be
19 counted in the determination of eligibility for the medical
20 assistance for workers with disabilities program if the enrollee
21 loses eligibility in the job success category.

22 (c) Provision of benefits.--Upon receipt of a worker's
23 payment under subsection (b) (1), the department or its designee
24 shall provide to the worker medical assistance benefits at the
25 categorically needy level as defined by the department.

26 (d) Department responsibilities.--The department shall:

27 (1) Administer the medical assistance purchase program.

28 (2) [Prepare] Annually prepare and submit by November
29 30[, 2002, and annually thereafter] of each year a report to
30 the chair and minority chair of the Public Health and Welfare

1 Committee of the Senate and the chair and minority chair of
2 the Health and Human Services Committee of the House of
3 Representatives on the number of individuals purchasing
4 medical benefits, the average amount paid for the benefits
5 and any other information deemed necessary by the department.
6 The annual report shall be made available for public
7 inspection and posted on the department's publicly accessible
8 [World Wide Web site] Internet website.
9 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
