AN ACT

Amending Title 25 (Elections) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in voter registration, further providing for methods of voter registration, providing for electronic voter registration, for electronic submission of changes to registration and for time for electronic voter registration 5 and further providing for preparation and distribution of 6 applications and for approval of registration applications; 7 in records, further providing for general register, for district registers and for reports; in changes in records, 9 further providing for removal notices and for change of 10 enrollment of political party; and, in penalties, further 11 providing for altering registration. 12 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. Section 1321 of Title 25 of the Pennsylvania 16 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a paragraph to read: 17 § 1321. Methods of voter registration. An individual qualified to register to vote under section 18 19 1301(a) (relating to qualifications to register) may apply to 20 register as follows: * * * 21

(5) Under section 1325.1 (relating to electronic voter

- 2 Section 2. Title 25 is amended by adding sections to read:
- 3 § 1325.1. Electronic voter registration.
- 4 (a) General rule. -- An application to register to vote may be
- 5 <u>submitted by an electronic voter registration application on the</u>
- 6 publicly accessible Internet website maintained by the
- 7 <u>department in the manner provided under this section.</u>
- 8 <u>(b) Establishment.--</u>
- 9 <u>(1) The department shall develop an electronic voter</u>
- 10 application on a secure Internet system, maintained by the
- department, that permits a qualified elector to
- 12 <u>electronically submit a voter registration application or</u>
- changes to an existing registration.
- 14 (2) The department shall develop the application within
- 15 180 days of the effective date of this section. The
- 16 <u>electronic voter registration application shall not be</u>
- implemented until the department, the Department of
- 18 Transportation and each commission have developed a process
- and the infrastructure necessary for the effective use of the
- 20 application as contemplated by this section but in no event
- 21 <u>later than June 30, 2021.</u>
- 22 (3) The electronic voter registration application shall
- comply with the requirements under section 1327 (relating to
- 24 preparation and distribution of applications). The electronic
- 25 voter registration application shall be provided in a manner
- that is accessible to applicants with disabilities, including
- 27 <u>those who are blind and visually impaired, and in a manner</u>
- that provides the same opportunity for access and
- 29 participation as for other voters.
- 30 (c) Submission.--

1	(1) A qualified elector who applies to register to vote
2	under this section shall do all of the following:
3	(i) Enter the data required on the electronic voter
4	registration application.
5	(ii) Provide one of the following:
6	(A) the last four digits of the applicant's
7	Social Security number;
8	(B) the applicant's driver's license number or
9	identification card number issued by the Department
10	of Transportation under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1510(b)
11	(relating to issuance and content of driver's
12	<u>license); or</u>
13	(C) if the applicant does not have the
14	information required by clause (A) or (B), any other
15	information required by the department to verify the
16	applicant's identity.
17	(iii) Affirmatively attest to the truth of the
18	information provided by the applicant.
19	(2) The department shall obtain and verify an electronic
20	copy of the applicant's signature from the applicant's
21	driver's license or identification card issued by the
22	Department of Transportation under 75 Pa.C.S. § 1510. The
23	department may, in the department's discretion, develop other
24	means of obtaining an electronic signature from an applicant,
25	including obtaining a copy of a signature on file with
26	another Commonwealth agency, so long as the signature is
27	capable of being transmitted to the department in a secure
28	<u>fashion.</u>
29	(3) (i) Notwithstanding the department's ability to
30	obtain and verify an electronic copy of an applicant's

1	<u>signature under paragraph (2), the department shall</u>
2	transfer the application to the SURE system for
3	examination and processing by the appropriate commission
4	in accordance with section 1328 (relating to approval of
5	registration applications). If the department is not able
6	to obtain and verify an electronic copy of the
7	applicant's signature, the department shall include a
8	notation that the applicant must provide a signature at
9	the polling place or, if the applicant votes by absentee
10	ballot, on the absentee ballot application, the first
11	time the applicant votes after submitting an electronic
12	voter registration application.
13	(ii) Nothing in this section shall be deemed to
14	prevent an applicant from printing the completed
15	electronic voter registration application, signing it and
16	mailing it to the appropriate commission in accordance
17	with the voter registration application deadlines
18	specified in section 1326.1 (relating to time for
19	electronic voter registration). If an applicant satisfies
20	the requirements of this subparagraph, no additional
21	signature shall be required.
22	(4) Use of electronic voter registration application by
23	the applicant shall constitute the applicant's consent to the
24	use of the applicant's signature on file with the Department
25	of Transportation or any other Commonwealth agency or
26	otherwise provided to the department under paragraph (2) for
27	voter registration purposes.
28	(d) Duties of department
29	(1) Within 24 months following the effective date of
30	this section, the department shall promulgate regulations

- 1 <u>necessary to implement the provisions of this section and</u>
- 2 section 1325.2 (relating to electronic submission of changes
- 3 to registration). Prior to the promulgation, the department
- 4 <u>shall transmit notice of the implementation guidelines to the</u>
- 5 <u>Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the</u>
- 6 <u>Pennsylvania Bulletin.</u>
- 7 (2) The department shall develop and employ security
- 8 <u>measures to ensure the security and integrity of voter</u>
- 9 registration applications or changes to voter registrations
- 10 submitted electronically under this section and section
- 11 1325.2.
- 12 (e) Time. -- If an electronic voter registration application
- 13 <u>is submitted within 30 days before an election, the application</u>
- 14 shall be transferred to the appropriate commission through the
- 15 SURE system and retained by the commission until the beginning
- 16 of the next period during which registrations must be processed.
- 17 § 1325.2. Electronic submission of changes to registration.
- 18 (a) Changing information. -- A registered elector may change
- 19 information in the registered elector's voter registration
- 20 records by using the electronic voter registration application
- 21 developed by the department under section 1325.1 (relating to
- 22 electronic voter registration) or a form developed by the
- 23 department for changes, as determined by the department. The
- 24 changes that may be made electronically shall be:
- 25 (1) A change in the enrollment of political designation.
- 26 (2) The enrollment of a political designation if,
- 27 although registered, the elector has not previously enrolled
- as a member of a party.
- 29 (3) The registered elector's name.
- 30 (4) The registered elector's address.

- 1 (b) Submission. -- The provisions of section 1325.1 regarding
- 2 the validity of the information, the requirement for and consent
- 3 to the use of the elector's signature on file with another
- 4 <u>Commonwealth agency or otherwise provided to the department</u>
- 5 under section 1325.1(c)(2) and other verification by the elector
- 6 of the elector's identity shall apply to a submission for a
- 7 <u>change to the elector's registration records under this section.</u>
- 8 (c) Effectiveness of changes. -- Changes to information in an
- 9 <u>elector's voter registration records under this section shall</u>
- 10 only be effective if:
- 11 (1) the department is able to obtain and verify an
- 12 electronic copy of the elector's signature. The department
- shall inform the applicant if the electronic signature cannot
- 14 <u>be verified; or</u>
- 15 (2) the elector prints the form on which the changes
- 16 <u>have been made, signs the form and mails it to the</u>
- appropriate commission, and the commission receives the
- 18 changes in accordance with the voter registration application
- deadlines specified in section 1326.1 (relating to time for
- 20 electronic voter registration).
- 21 § 1326.1. Time for electronic voter registration.
- 22 In the case of electronic voter registration under section
- 23 <u>1325.1 (relating to electronic voter registration), each</u>
- 24 commission shall ensure that an applicant who is a qualified
- 25 <u>elector is registered to vote in an election if the voter</u>
- 26 transmits the electronic voter registration application through
- 27 the Internet system maintained by the department no later than
- 28 11:59 p.m. on the 30th day prior to the election.
- 29 Section 3. Sections 1327(a)(3), (4), (5) and (6) and (b)(3)
- 30 and (4), 1328(a)(2), 1401(a)(5), 1402(b)(2), 1406(a), 1501(b)

- 1 (1), 1503 and 1704(a) of Title 25 are amended to read:
- 2 § 1327. Preparation and distribution of applications.
- 3 (a) Form.--
- 4 * * *

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5 (3) Any person who assists in the completion of the 6 registration application shall sign or, in the case of 7 registration under section 1325.1 (relating to electronic voter registration), shall electronically sign the 8 9 application and indicate the person's address. In the case of 10 those registering under sections 1323 (relating to 11 application with driver's license application) and 1325 12 (relating to government agencies), the person providing 13 assistance shall insert the person's initials or employee or 14 agent identification number on a separate or detachable

portion of the application or computer data file.

- 16 A voter registration application, except an 17 electronic voter registration application under section 18 1325.1, shall be printed on stock of good quality and shall 19 be of suitable uniform size. [Nothing in this part shall 20 prohibit the design and use of an electronic voter 21 registration application which includes the applicant's 22 digitized or electronic signature.] The registration 23 application, including a registration application under 24 section 1325.1, shall contain the following information; 25 however, the information may be provided on a separate form 26 for voter registration made under section 1323 or 1325:
 - (i) Notice that a registered elector does not need to reregister unless the registered elector has moved.
- 29 (ii) Instructions on how to fill out and submit the 30 application and notification of when the application must

be submitted to a voter registration office or, for electronic voter registration under section 1325.1, electronically, in order to be registered for the ensuing election.

- (iii) Notice that the applicant must be a citizen of the United States for at least one month prior to the next election and a resident of this Commonwealth and the election district for at least 30 days and must be at least 18 years of age by the day of the next ensuing election and has not been confined in a penal institution for a conviction of a felony within the last five years. The notice required in this subparagraph shall be in print identical to the declaration under subsection (b).
- (iv) Notice that political party enrollment is mandatory to vote in a primary election of a political party.
- nonforwardable mail to the applicant a voter's identification card upon acceptance of the application and that the applicant should contact the commission if the identification card is not received within 14 days from the date the application is sent to the registration office[.] or submitted electronically to the department under section 1325.1. In the event that the applicant's electronic registration application did not contain a signature, the registration card shall contain a notice that the registered elector must provide a signature the first time the registered elector votes after submission of the electronic voter registration application.
 - (vi) Notice that registration is not complete until

1 the application is processed and accepted by the commission or, if submitted electronically under section 2 1325.1, processed and accepted by the department. 3 A warning to the applicant that making a false 4 5 registration or furnishing false information is perjury. The notice required in this subparagraph shall be in 6 7 print identical to the declaration under subsection (b). 8 Instructions to Federal or State employees 9 who wish to retain voting residence in county of last 10 residence to so indicate on the application. Notice that, if an individual declines to 11 12 register to vote, the fact that the individual has 13 declined to register will remain confidential and will be 14 used only for voter registration purposes. The notice 15 required in this subparagraph shall be in print identical to the declaration under subsection (b). 16 17 Notice that, if an individual does register to 18 vote, the office at which the individual submits a voter 19 registration application will remain confidential and 20 will be used for voter registration purposes only. The 21 notices required in this subparagraph shall be in print 22 identical to the declaration in subsection (b). 23 In jurisdictions where there is a single language 24 minority, the [secretary] department may print a bilingual application and develop a bilingual electronic voter 25 26 registration application. 27 In jurisdictions where a single language minority 28 exceeds 5% of the population, in accordance with applicable 29 law, the [secretary] department shall: 30 print a bilingual application and develop a

bilingual electronic voter registration application; and

2 (ii) conduct a public educational program among that
3 language group alerting both organizations and
4 individuals of that group of the availability of the
5 bilingual application and encouraging individuals to

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register.

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(b) Registration declaration. --

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- (3) The registration declaration shall contain the printed name [and signature of the applicant and the date of signing.], date of signing and, except for an applicant submitting a registration under section 1325.1, the signature of the applicant. An applicant unable to sign the voter registration application shall make a mark before a person of the applicant's choice other than the applicant's employer or an agent of the applicant's union. The person shall insert the person's name, address and telephone number. If the person is an employee or agent of the Department of Transportation or another agency as provided under section 1325 and is assisting the applicant in an official capacity, the employee or agent shall insert the initials and identification number of the employee or agent. In the case of applicants registering under section 1323 or 1325, the person providing assistance shall insert initials or employee or agent identification number on a separate or detachable portion of the application or computer data file.
- (4) The official registration application shall contain a notice entitled "PENALTY FOR FALSIFYING DECLARATION." The notice shall advise the applicant that if a person signs an

- 1 official registration application or submits an electronic
- 2 registration application or a change to registration form
- 3 under section 1325.1 or 1325.2 (relating to electronic
- 4 <u>submission of changes to registration</u>), knowing a statement
- 5 declared in the application to be false, the person commits
- 6 perjury. The notice shall specify the penalty for perjury.
- 7 * * *
- 8 § 1328. Approval of registration applications.
- 9 (a) Examination. -- Upon receiving a voter registration
- 10 application, a commissioner, clerk or registrar of a commission
- 11 shall do all of the following:
- 12 * * *
- 13 (2) Examine the application to determine all of the
- 14 following:
- (i) Whether the application is complete. The lack of
- an applicant's signature on an application submitted
- 17 under section 1325.1 (relating to electronic voter
- 18 registration) shall not be grounds for rejecting an
- 19 otherwise valid application.
- 20 (ii) Whether the applicant is a qualified elector.
- 21 (iii) Whether the applicant has an existing
- 22 registration record. After the commission is connected to
- 23 the SURE system, the commissioner, clerk or registrar
- shall search the SURE system on a Statewide basis to
- determine if the applicant has an existing registration
- record.
- 27 (iv) Whether the applicant is entitled or qualified
- to receive the requested transfer or change, if
- applicable.

- 1 § 1401. General register.
- 2 (a) General rule. -- The general register shall contain all of
- 3 the following for each registered elector of the county:
- 4 * * *
- 5 (5) The digitized or electronic signature of the
- 6 registered elector. <u>In the case of an elector permitted to</u>
- 7 submit a signature the first time the elector votes after
- 8 <u>submitting an electronic voter registration application under</u>
- 9 <u>section 1325.1 (relating to electronic voter registration)</u>,
- 10 the commission shall enter the elector's signature on the
- 11 <u>elector's registration record as soon as practicable after</u>
- 12 <u>the election. The elector shall not be subject to the</u>
- provisions of section 1210(a.3)(2) of the act of June 3, 1937
- 14 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code,
- 15 <u>until the elector's signature has been entered on the</u>
- 16 <u>elector's registration record.</u>
- 17 * * *
- 18 § 1402. District registers.
- 19 * * *
- 20 (b) Computer lists.--
- 21 * * *
- 22 (2) After a commission is connected to the SURE system,
- 23 each commission shall create from its general register a
- computer list to be used as the district register. For each
- election district, the list shall contain the names of the
- 26 registered electors of the election district, alphabetically
- 27 by last name of each registered elector. Each page of the
- list shall contain the name of the county, the election
- 29 district, the date of the election and the date and time the
- 30 list was prepared. The computer list shall be in a form

- 1 prescribed by the secretary and must contain necessary
- 2 information that would otherwise be available in the general
- 3 register, including, except for an elector permitted to
- 4 <u>submit a signature at the polling place the first time the</u>
- 5 <u>elector votes after submitting an electronic voter</u>
- 6 <u>registration application under section 1325.1 (relating to</u>
- 7 <u>electronic voter registration</u>), a legible digitized or
- 8 electronic signature, the street address and political party
- 9 of each registered elector, and suitable space for insertion
- of the signature of the registered elector and for insertion
- by the proper election official of the number and letter of
- the stub of the ballot issued to the registered elector or
- 13 the registered elector's number in the order of admission to
- 14 the voting systems and the initials of the election official
- who enters the record of voting in the district register and
- 16 whether the elector needs assistance to vote and, if so, the
- 17 nature of the disability. The district register shall be kept
- 18 at the office of the commission and shall be open to public
- inspection, subject to reasonable safeguards, rules and
- 20 regulations.

- 22 § 1406. Reports.
- 23 (a) Commission. -- By March 1, a commission shall submit to
- 24 the secretary an annual report setting forth the number of
- 25 electors registered under sections 1322 (relating to in-person
- 26 voter registration), 1323 (relating to application with driver's
- 27 license application), 1324 (relating to application by mail)
- 28 [and], 1325 (relating to government agencies) and 1325.1
- 29 (relating to electronic voter registration). The report shall
- 30 specify the number of electors whose registration has been

- 1 canceled under Chapter 15 (relating to changes in records) and
- 2 any other information required by the secretary.
- 3 * * *
- 4 § 1501. Removal notices.
- 5 * * *
- 6 (b) Use.--A registered elector who removes residence from
- 7 one place to another within the same county must notify the
- 8 commission by filing a removal notice under subsection (a) or a
- 9 signed request for [renewal] removal that contains the
- 10 information required in subsection (a) with the commission not
- 11 later than the registration deadline before an election. If
- 12 mailed, the notice or request must be postmarked not later than
- 13 the deadline for registration or, in the case of an illegible or
- 14 missing postmark, received within five days of the close of
- 15 registration. The following apply:
- 16 (1) An official registration application of an elector
- 17 who has registered by mail or electronic voter registration
- 18 <u>application</u> qualifies as a removal notice.
- 19 * * *
- 20 § 1503. Change of enrollment of political party.
- 21 By the deadline for registration, a registered elector who
- 22 desires to change the enrollment of political designation or
- 23 who, although registered, has not previously enrolled as a
- 24 member of a party may appear before a commissioner, registrar or
- 25 clerk or may submit an application by mail under section 1324
- 26 (relating to application by mail) [and state in a signed] or
- 27 <u>electronically under section 1325.2 (relating to electronic</u>
- 28 <u>submission of changes to registration</u>). In a case other than
- 29 submission under section 1325.2, the registered elector shall
- 30 state in a signed writing the political party in which the

- 1 registered elector desires to be enrolled. If the signature of
- 2 the elector is verified by comparison with the registered
- 3 elector's signature as it appears on file with the commission,
- 4 the commissioner, registrar or clerk shall make the change in
- 5 its registration records. [If] <u>In a case other than submission</u>
- 6 <u>under section 1325.2, if</u> supported by other evidence of
- 7 identity, a mark may be made in lieu of a signature by a
- 8 registered elector who is unable to write. The mark must be made
- 9 in the presence of a witness who must sign the registration
- 10 application. For submissions under section 1325.2, the
- 11 registered elector shall follow the procedure for verification
- 12 <u>of the registered elector's identity specified in section 1325.1</u>
- 13 <u>(relating to electronic voter registration).</u>
- 14 § 1704. Altering registration.
- 15 (a) Prohibition. -- No registrar, commissioner, clerk or
- 16 assistant [or], commission employee or other individual may do
- 17 any of the following:
- 18 (1) Intentionally insert or permit to be inserted an
- 19 entry in a registration record without a proper application
- 20 under this part or without requiring the proper evidence of
- 21 the right of the applicant to be registered.
- 22 (2) Intentionally materially alter a registration record
- after the entries have been made unless the alteration is in
- accordance with this part. This paragraph does not apply to
- an alteration pursuant to an order of a court of common pleas
- or of a commission.
- 27 (3) Intentionally submit false information regarding a
- 28 change of party enrollment or name or address on a
- registration record of another individual.

1 Section 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
