A JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth
- of Pennsylvania, further providing for reapportionment of
- Federal and Commonwealth legislative representation.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby resolves as follows:
- 6 Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
- 7 Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
- 8 That section 17 heading, (a), (c), (e), (h) and (i) of
- 9 Article II of the Constitution of Pennsylvania be amended to
- 10 read:
- 11 § 17. Congressional and Legislative Reapportionment Commission.
- 12 (a) In each year following the year of the Federal decennial
- 13 census, a Congressional and Legislative Reapportionment
- 14 Commission shall be constituted for the purpose of
- 15 reapportioning the Commonwealth <u>for representation in the United</u>
- 16 States House of Representatives and in the General Assembly. The
- 17 commission shall act by a majority of its entire membership.
- 18 * * *

- 1 (c) No later than 90 days after either the commission has
- 2 been duly certified or the population data for the Commonwealth
- 3 as determined by the Federal decennial census are available,
- 4 whichever is later in time, the commission shall file a
- 5 preliminary reapportionment plan for the Pennsylvania districts
- 6 <u>in the United States House of Representatives and for the</u>
- 7 <u>districts in each chamber of the General Assembly</u> with such
- 8 elections officer.
- 9 [The commission shall have 30 days after filing the
- 10 preliminary plan to make corrections in the plan.] A public
- 11 comment period of 30 days shall commence with the filing of the
- 12 preliminary plan. During the comment period, the commission
- 13 <u>shall conduct public hearings in Philadelphia, Pittsburgh and</u>
- 14 Harrisburg. The commission shall have 30 days after the date of
- 15 the expiration of the public comment period to prepare and adopt
- 16 <u>a revised reapportionment plan.</u>
- Any person aggrieved by the preliminary plan shall have the
- 18 same 30-day period to file exceptions with the commission in
- 19 which case the commission shall have 30 days after the date the
- 20 exceptions were filed to prepare and file with such elections
- 21 officer a revised reapportionment plan. If no exceptions are
- 22 filed within 30 days, or if filed and acted upon, the
- 23 [commissions's] commission's plan shall be final and have the
- 24 force of law.
- 25 * * *
- 26 (e) When the Supreme Court has finally decided an appeal or
- 27 when the last day for filing an appeal has passed with no appeal
- 28 taken, the reapportionment plan shall have the force of law and
- 29 the districts therein provided shall be used thereafter in
- 30 elections to the United States House of Representatives and to

- 1 the General Assembly until the next reapportionment as required
- 2 under this section 17.
- 3 * * *
- 4 (h) If a preliminary, revised or final reapportionment plan
- 5 is not filed by the commission within the time prescribed by
- 6 this section, unless the time be extended by the Supreme Court
- 7 for cause shown, the Supreme Court shall immediately proceed on
- 8 its own motion to reapportion the Commonwealth <u>for</u>
- 9 representation in the United States House of Representatives and
- 10 <u>in the General Assembly</u>.
- 11 (i) Any reapportionment plan filed by the commission, or
- 12 ordered or prepared by the Supreme Court upon the failure of the
- 13 commission to act, shall be published by the elections officer
- 14 once in at least one newspaper of general circulation in each
- 15 congressional, senatorial and representative district. The
- 16 publication shall contain [a map] two maps of the Commonwealth
- 17 showing the complete reapportionment of the [General Assembly
- 18 by] Commonwealth, one for congressional districts[,] and [a map
- 19 showing the reapportionment districts in the area normally
- 20 served by the newspaper in which the publication is made] one
- 21 <u>for senatorial and representative districts</u>. The publication
- 22 shall also state the population of the congressional districts
- 23 <u>having the smallest and largest population and the percentage</u>
- 24 variation of such districts from the average population for
- 25 <u>congressional districts and</u> the population of the senatorial and
- 26 representative districts having the smallest and largest
- 27 population and the percentage variation of such districts from
- 28 the average population for senatorial and representative
- 29 districts.
- 30 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General

- 1 Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the
- 2 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to
- 3 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article
- 4 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the
- 5 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in
- 6 which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after
- 7 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment.
- 8 (b) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this
- 9 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the
- 10 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the
- 11 advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the
- 12 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required
- 13 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such
- 14 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of
- 15 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the
- 16 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment
- 17 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first
- 18 primary, general or municipal election which meets the
- 19 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article
- 20 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least
- 21 three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is
- 22 passed by the General Assembly.
