## AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in school health services, providing for seizure management and treatment plan, for seizure 5 6 disorder management and fist aid liability, for acts not considered delegation for seizure disorder care and for liability. 9 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 13 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding sections 14 to read: Section 1414.11. Seizure Management and Treatment Plan. -- (a) 15 16 The parent or quardian of a student with a seizure disorder may 17 seek care for the student's seizures while the student is at 18 school or participating in a school activity by submitting to 19 the school entity where the student is enrolled a copy of a

seizure management and treatment plan developed by the parent or

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- 1 <u>quardian and the family physician responsible for the student's</u>
- 2 <u>seizure management and treatment.</u>
- 3 (b) The seizure management and treatment plan submitted
- 4 <u>under subsection (a) may be reviewed by the school entity to</u>
- 5 determine if the plan satisfies the criteria under subsection
- 6 <u>(c):</u>
- 7 (1) before or at the beginning of the school year;
- 8 (2) on the date of the enrollment of the student if the
- 9 student enrolls in the school entity after the beginning of the
- 10 school year; or
- 11 (3) as soon as practicable following a diagnosis of a
- 12 <u>seizure disorder for the student.</u>
- (c) A seizure management and treatment plan shall:
- 14 (1) identify the health care services that the student may
- 15 receive while at school or participating in a school activity;
- 16 (2) evaluate the student's ability to manage the ongoing
- 17 maintenance of the student's seizure disorder; and
- 18 (3) be signed by the student's parent or quardian and the
- 19 family physician responsible for the student's seizure
- 20 <u>management and treatment.</u>
- 21 (d) As used in this section, "school entity" means any
- 22 <u>public school, charter school, cyber charter school, private</u>
- 23 school, nonpublic school, intermediate unit or area vocational-
- 24 <u>technical school</u>.
- 25 Section 1414.12. Seizure Disorder Management and First Aid
- 26 <u>Liability.--(a) Nothing in the provisions under sections</u>
- 27 1414.11 shall be construed to establish or expand any civil
- 28 liability on the part of a school entity or school employe.
- 29 (b) As used in this section, "school entity" means any
- 30 <u>public school, charter school, cyber charter school, private</u>

- 1 school, nonpublic school, intermediate unit or area vocational-
- 2 technical school.
- 3 Section 1414.13. Acts Not Considered Delegation for Seizure
- 4 <u>Disorder Care. -- Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary,</u>
- 5 coordinating or supervising the provision of seizure disorder
- 6 care under section 1414.11 shall not be construed as a
- 7 <u>delegation by a health care practitioner.</u>
- 8 Section 1414.14. Liability.--(a) A school district or
- 9 school district employe or agent, acting in good faith and in
- 10 <u>substantial compliance with a student's seizure management and</u>
- 11 treatment plan and the instructions of the student's family
- 12 physician, shall not be subject to any criminal or civil
- 13 liability or any professional disciplinary action.
- 14 (b) A health care practitioner who acts in accordance with
- 15 <u>section 1414.11 when coordinating or supervising care for a</u>
- 16 <u>student shall not be subject to any criminal or civil liability</u>
- 17 or any professional disciplinary action.
- 18 Section 2. The addition of sections 1414.11, 1414.12,
- 19 1414.13, and 1414.14 of the act shall apply to the 2021-2022
- 20 school year and each school year thereafter.
- 21 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
