 11 RUN ROAD BETWEEN STATE ROUTE 2018 IN NEW SEWICKLEY TOWNSHIP
 12 TO STATE ROUTE 1065 IN FREEDOM BOROUGH, BEAVER COUNTY, AS THE
 13 ARMY SERGEANT JOSHUA JAMES RIMER MEMORIAL ROAD; AND MAKING
 14 RELATED REPEALS.

15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
 16 hereby enacts as follows:

17 ~~Section 1. CPL William Glen Imler Memorial Bridge.~~ <--

18 ~~(a) Findings. The General Assembly finds and declares as~~
 19 ~~follows:~~

20 ~~(1) CPL Imler was born in Imlertown on November 26,~~

21 ~~1915.~~

1 ~~(2) CPL Imler graduated from Bedford High School in~~
2 ~~1935.~~

3 ~~(3) CPL Imler worked as a mason with his father until he~~
4 ~~was inducted into the United States Army on September 23,~~
5 ~~1941.~~

6 ~~(4) CPL Imler completed basic training at Camp Wheeler,~~
7 ~~Georgia, and from there was sent to Ft. Leonard Wood,~~
8 ~~Missouri.~~

9 ~~(5) In September of 1943, CPL Imler was sent to the~~
10 ~~Hawaiian Islands and in February 1944 landed in New Guinea.~~

11 ~~(6) On June 2, 1944, CPL Imler was killed in action in~~
12 ~~New Guinea at 29 years of age.~~

13 ~~(7) CPL Imler was awarded the Silver Star, Purple Heart,~~
14 ~~World War II Victory Medal and the Honorable Service Lapel~~
15 ~~Pin.~~

16 ~~(b) Designation. The bridge, identified as Bridge Key 4142,~~
17 ~~carrying State Route 1001 over the Dunning Creek in the Borough~~
18 ~~of Bedford, Bedford County, is designated as the CPL William~~
19 ~~Glen Imler Bridge.~~

20 ~~(c) Signs. The Department of Transportation shall erect and~~
21 ~~maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to~~
22 ~~traffic in both directions on the bridge.~~

23 SECTION 1. PFC JAMES E. WILLIAMS MEMORIAL BRIDGE. <--

24 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
25 FOLLOWS:

26 (1) PFC JAMES E. WILLIAMS, A NATIVE OF BEDFORD COUNTY,
27 GAVE HIS LIFE IN SERVICE TO HIS COUNTRY DURING THE KOREAN
28 WAR.

29 (2) PFC WILLIAMS SERVED AS A LIGHT WEAPONS INFANTRYMAN
30 WITH THE 38TH INFANTRY REGIMENT, 2ND INFANTRY DIVISION.

1 (3) PFC WILLIAMS WAS CAPTURED AND HELD BY THE CHINESE AS
2 A PRISONER OF WAR FOR 27 MONTHS.

3 (4) ON MAY 18, 1951, PFC WILLIAMS DIED WHILE STILL IN
4 CAPTIVITY.

5 (5) PFC WILLIAMS WAS AWARDED THE PURPLE HEART FOR HIS
6 VALIANT SERVICE.

7 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY
8 45676, CARRYING PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 26 OVER YELLOW CREEK IN
9 HOPEWELL TOWNSHIP, BEDFORD COUNTY, IS DESIGNATED THE PFC JAMES
10 E. WILLIAMS MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

11 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
12 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
13 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.
14 SECTION 2. COLONEL JOSEPH M. STINE MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

15 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
16 FOLLOWS:

17 (1) COLONEL JOSEPH M. STINE, A NATIVE OF EVERETT, GAVE
18 HIS LIFE IN SERVICE TO HIS COUNTRY DURING THE VIETNAM WAR.

19 (2) COLONEL STINE JOINED THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE
20 JUST A FEW DAYS AFTER GRADUATING FROM EVERETT AREA HIGH
21 SCHOOL IN 1949.

22 (3) COLONEL STINE RECEIVED HIS PILOT WINGS IN 1953 IN
23 BIG SPRINGS, TEXAS, AND WAS COMMISSIONED AS A 2ND LIEUTENANT.

24 (4) COLONEL STINE WAS A T33 INSTRUCTOR PILOT IN RIO,
25 TEXAS, FOR FIVE YEARS, AND IN 1959 WAS TRANSFERRED TO
26 ENGLAND, WHERE HE FLEW THE B-66 FOR THREE YEARS.

27 (5) ON AUGUST 1, 1966, COLONEL STINE WAS SENT TO
28 VIETNAM, AND, WHILE FLYING A NIGHT PHOTO MISSION OVER HANOI
29 ON SEPTEMBER 27, 1966, HIS PLANE DROPPED OFF OF RADAR AND HE
30 WAS NEVER SEEN OR HEARD FROM AGAIN.

1 (6) ON MARCH 6, 1978, COLONEL STINE'S STATUS WAS CHANGED
2 TO KILLED IN ACTION.

3 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY
4 55863, CARRYING PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 26 OVER BLOODY RUN IN EVERETT
5 BOROUGH, BEDFORD COUNTY, IS DESIGNATED THE COLONEL JOSEPH M.
6 STINE MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

7 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
8 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
9 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.
10 SECTION 3. ARMY SERGEANT JOSHUA JAMES RIMER MEMORIAL ROAD.

11 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
12 FOLLOWS:

13 (1) ARMY SERGEANT JOSHUA JAMES RIMER WAS BORN ON APRIL
14 18, 1985, AND GAVE HIS LIFE IN THE LINE OF DUTY ON JULY 22,
15 2009, WHILE ON A MISSION WITH THE UNITED STATES ARMY IN
16 AFGHANISTAN.

17 (2) SERGEANT RIMER WAS RAISED IN NEW SEWICKLEY TOWNSHIP,
18 BEAVER COUNTY.

19 (3) AFTER GRADUATING FROM FREEDOM AREA HIGH SCHOOL IN
20 2003, SERGEANT RIMER ENLISTED IN THE UNITED STATES ARMY.

21 (4) SERGEANT RIMER'S EXPERIENCE IN THE UNITED STATES
22 ARMY SPANNED THE GLOBE, FROM THE UNITED STATES TO GERMANY,
23 IRAQ AND AFGHANISTAN THROUGH MULTIPLE DEPLOYMENTS.

24 (5) DURING HIS SERVICE, SERGEANT RIMER WAS AWARDED A
25 BRONZE STAR AND TWO PURPLE HEARTS, AMONG OTHER COMMENDATIONS.

26 (6) THROUGHOUT HIS CAREER, SERGEANT RIMER STEADFASTLY
27 DISPLAYED EXCEEDING LOYALTY AND DEDICATION TO THE UNITED
28 STATES OF AMERICA AS WELL AS THE UNITED STATES ARMY.

29 (7) THOSE WHO VALUE FREEDOM WILL FOREVER OWE SERGEANT
30 RIMER A DEBT THAT NEVER CAN BE REPAYED.

1 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE SECTION OF HARVEY RUN ROAD BETWEEN
2 STATE ROUTE 2018 IN NEW SEWICKLEY TOWNSHIP TO STATE ROUTE 1065
3 IN FREEDOM BOROUGH, BEAVER COUNTY, IS DESIGNATED THE ARMY
4 SERGEANT JOSHUA JAMES RIMER MEMORIAL ROAD.

5 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
6 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
7 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.

29 KEY 39537, ON THAT PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 1005 OVER A
30 TRIBUTARY OF CROOKED CREEK, RAYNE TOWNSHIP, INDIANA COUNTY,

1 AS THE SERGEANT CHARLES R. LEARN MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING
