## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Automated Decision Systems Task Force.
- 2 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 3 hereby enacts as follows:
- 4 Section 1. Short title.
- 5 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Automated
- 6 Decision Systems Task Force Act.
- 7 Section 2. Findings.
- 8 The General Assembly finds:
- 9 (1) Automated decision systems have been utilized in
- 10 recent years to assist in decision making in State and local
- 11 governments and in businesses, including in issues of
- 12 criminal justice and public benefits.
- 13 (2) Automated decision systems serve a variety of
- 14 functions to assist organizations, agencies and corporations
- 15 and to improve efficiency, but these systems can lack
- 16 transparency and may be utilized without public knowledge.
- 17 (3) The use of automated decision systems, including

- 1 controversial technology like facial recognition, may
- 2 unwittingly have a disproportionate negative impact on
- 3 members of marginalized communities by reinforcing existing
- 4 biases.
- 5 (4) Reliance on automated decision systems require
- 6 oversight and transparency to prevent the entrenching of
- 7 biases and to mitigate potential harm.
- 8 (5) The Commonwealth must examine the use of automated
- 9 decision systems to ensure transparency.
- 10 Section 3. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 14 "Task force." The Automated Decision Systems Task Force
- 15 established under section 4.
- 16 Section 4. Automated Decision Systems Task Force.
- 17 (a) Establishment. -- The Automated Decision Systems Task
- 18 Force is established to study the use of automated decision
- 19 systems in government.
- 20 (b) Membership. -- The task force shall consist of the
- 21 following members:
- 22 (1) One member appointed by the Governor.
- 23 (2) One member appointed by the Majority Leader of the
- 24 Senate.
- 25 (3) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
- 26 Senate.
- 27 (4) One member appointed by the Majority Leader of the
- 28 House of Representatives.
- 29 (5) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
- 30 House of Representatives.

- 1 One member appointed by the Attorney General.
- 2 (c) Appointment of members. -- The following shall apply:
- 3 Each member appointed to the task force shall be knowledgeable of the issues surrounding automated decision 4 5 systems and technological ethics.
- Appointments to the task force shall be made within (2) 7 30 days of the effective date of this section. Any vacancy shall be filled by the relevant appointing authority.
- 9 Members of the task force shall elect a member to 10 serve as the chairperson of the task force.
- 11 Expenses. -- Members may not receive compensation for
- 12 service on the task force but shall be reimbursed for all
- 13 necessary travel and other reasonable expenses incurred in
- 14 connection with the performance of duties as members of the task
- 15 force.

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- 16 Business. -- The following shall apply: (e)
- 17 The physical or remote presence of a majority of the members shall constitute a quorum of the task force. 18
- 19 Action of the task force must be authorized or 20 ratified by a majority vote of the members of the task force.
- 21 A member not physically present may participate by (3) 22 teleconference, video conference or other electronic means.
- 23 The first meeting of the task force shall be 24 convened within 60 days of the effective date of this 25 section.
- 26 The task force shall meet at least four times (5) 27 annually beginning on the date of the first meeting and may 28 hold additional meetings upon the written request of a two-29 thirds majority of members of the task force.
- 30 The task force shall hold public hearings as

- 1 necessary to obtain information required to conduct reviews
- 2 under this act.
- 3 (7) The task force may participate in meetings or hearings via teleconference when necessary.
- 5 (8) The task force shall determine the location of 6 meetings in this Commonwealth, subject to the approval of the 7 chairperson.
- 8 (9) The Department of Human Services, the Department of 9 Transportation, the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and
- 10 Parole and any other agency that uses automated decision
- 11 systems shall cooperate to provide administrative or other
- 12 assistance to the task force.
- 13 (f) Powers and duties.—The task force shall have the power 14 and duty to:
- 15 (1) Review and analyze the prevalence of the use of 16 automated decision systems in this Commonwealth.
- 17 (2) Hold public hearings for the taking of testimony and 18 the requesting of documents.
- 19 (3) Administer oaths and affirmations to witnesses 20 appearing before the task force.
- 21 (4) Accept and review written comments from individuals 22 and organizations.
- 23 (5) Issue a report to the Governor, Senate and House of
  24 Representatives with the findings of the task force within
  25 one year of the first meeting of the task force. The report
  26 shall include findings and recommendations regarding:
- 27 (i) potential oversight for the use of automated decision systems;
- 29 (ii) a complete accounting of which agencies utilize 30 automated decision systems and how they are used;

1	(iii) any issues of bias or potential bias that have
2	arisen through the use of automated decision systems
3	within government agencies;
4	(iv) legislative solutions to remedy any potential
5	bias caused by the use of automated decision systems; and
6	(v) development of guidelines to ensure that
7	information about the use of automated decision systems
8	is publicly available.
9	Section 5. Effective date.

10 This act shall take effect immediately.
