AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in registration of vehicles, further providing for 1 2 registration and certificate of title required; in lighting 3 equipment, further providing for general lighting requirements; in other required equipment, further providing for exhaust systems, mufflers and noise control and windshield obstructions and wipers; and, in inspection of 7 vehicles, further providing for operation of vehicle without 8 official certificate of inspection. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 11 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Sections 1301, 4303, 4523 and 4524 of Title 75 of 12 13 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended by adding subsections to read: 14 15 § 1301. Registration and certificate of title required. * * * 16 17 (e) Exception. -- No person shall be convicted of a violation 18 of this section prior to the first day of the fourth month after 19 the original expiration date, unless the person is also convicted of another violation of this title which occurred at 20
