AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the

- laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, providing for Internet safety education curriculum. 6
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 10
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 1555. Internet Safety Education Curriculum. -- (a)
- 13 The department, in consultation with the Office of Attorney
- General, shall establish an age-appropriate curriculum for 14
- 15 Internet safety instruction of students in kindergarten through
- 16 grade twelve. Beginning with the school year that commences
- 17 after the effective date of this section, a school district
- shall incorporate into the school curriculum a component on 18
- Internet safety to be taught at least once each school year to 19

- 1 <u>students in kindergarten through grade twelve. The school board</u>
- 2 shall determine the scope and duration of this unit of
- 3 <u>instruction. The age-appropriate unit of instruction may be</u>
- 4 <u>incorporated into the current courses of study regularly taught</u>
- 5 in the district's schools, as determined by the school board.
- 6 Such instruction shall be chosen from a menu of options
- 7 <u>developed by the department, which shall include, but not be</u>
- 8 <u>limited to, the following topics:</u>
- 9 (1) Safe and responsible use of social networking websites,
- 10 chat rooms, e-mail, bulletin boards, instant messaging and other
- 11 means of communication on the Internet.
- 12 (2) Recognizing, avoiding and reporting online solicitations
- 13 of students, their classmates and their friends by sexual
- 14 <u>predators</u>.
- 15 (3) Risks of transmitting personal information on the
- 16 Internet.
- 17 (4) Recognizing and avoiding unsolicited or deceptive
- 18 communications received online.
- 19 (5) Recognizing and reporting online harassment and cyber
- 20 bullying.
- 21 (6) Reporting illegal activities and communications on the
- 22 <u>Internet</u>.
- 23 (7) Copyright laws on written materials, photographs, music
- 24 and video.
- 25 (b) The department may develop curricula to serve the
- 26 instructional needs of multiple grades of students, such as one
- 27 <u>curriculum for elementary school students</u>, one curriculum for
- 28 middle school students and one curriculum for high school
- 29 students.
- 30 (c) In developing the Internet safety education curriculum,

- 1 the department shall take into consideration similar curricula
- 2 <u>in other states and other curricular materials suggested by</u>
- 3 education experts, child psychologists or technology companies
- 4 that work on child online safety issues. The department shall
- 5 <u>also conduct a thorough review of publicly available materials</u>
- 6 on the topics of safe online communications, privacy protection,
- 7 cyber bullying, viewing inappropriate material, file-sharing and
- 8 the importance of open communications with responsible adults.
- 9 The department shall make such resource materials that it deems_
- 10 appropriate available on its publicly accessible Internet
- 11 website.
- 12 (d) Curricula devised in accordance with subsection (a)
- 13 shall be developed within six (6) months of the effective date
- 14 of this section.
- (e) A parent or legal quardian of a student who is under
- 16 <u>eighteen (18) years of age, within a reasonable period of time</u>
- 17 after the request is made, shall be permitted to examine the
- 18 Internet safety curriculum instructional materials at the school
- 19 in which the student is enrolled.
- 20 (f) At the request of a parent or quardian, a student shall
- 21 be excused from all or parts of the Internet safety curriculum
- 22 instruction. The principal shall notify all parents or quardians
- 23 of their ability to withdraw their children from instruction in
- 24 the curriculum by returning a signed opt-out form.
- 25 (g) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 26 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection:
- 27 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 28 Commonwealth.
- 29 "Office of Attorney General." The Office of Attorney General
- 30 of the Commonwealth.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
