1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11	Amending Title 11 (Cities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in city engineer, further providing for appointment of city engineer, providing for waiver and further providing for control of engineering matters, for duties, for certifying commencement and completion of municipal improvements and for entering upon property for surveys; in surveys and surface support in coal mining areas, further providing for survey of mines and for operators to furnish maps and contents; and, in corporate powers, further providing for regulation of division fences, party walls and foundations.
12	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13	hereby enacts as follows:
14	Section 1. Section 11501 of Title 11 of the Pennsylvania
15	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
16	§ 11501. Appointment of city [engineer] <u>engineers</u> .
17	[Council shall provide for the manner of appointment and
18	compensation of the city engineer. The] <u>Subject to section</u>
19	11501.1 (relating to waiver), council shall appoint, through a
20	competitive bid process, and determine the compensation of at
21	<u>least two city engineers. A</u> city engineer shall be a registered
22	professional engineer in this Commonwealth and shall serve at

1	the pleasure of council. Nothing in this section shall be
2	construed to prohibit council from designating an engineering
3	firm of registered professional engineers from performing the
4	duties and functions of [the] <u>a</u> city engineer.
5	Section 2. Title 11 is amended by adding a section to read:
6	<u>§ 11501.1. Waiver.</u>
7	(a) Waiver of requirement and certification formIf
8	council cannot obtain offers from qualified registered
9	professional engineers to fulfill the requirement under section
10	<u>11501 (relating to appointment of city engineers) to appoint at</u>
11	least two city engineers, council may be relieved from the
12	requirement by completing a certification form, subject to the
13	following:
14	(1) Council must complete the certification form before
15	the contract with the selected city engineer is executed and
16	must maintain the form throughout the life of the contract
17	with the city engineer.
18	(2) The certification form must be completed annually.
19	(3) A copy of the certification form must be filed with
20	the department.
21	(4) The department shall furnish the certification form,
22	which must:
23	(i) Require council to disclose the methods and
24	dates of the public solicitation. For purposes of meeting
25	this requirement, council shall advertise requests for
26	proposals and announce the solicitation at a public
27	meeting.
28	(ii) Require council to disclose the number of
29	gualified bids received to the public solicitation.
30	(iii) Contain a statement that the information

(iv) Contain a statement that the department does 3 not have the discretion to deny waiver requests. 4 (b) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following 5 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this 6 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 7 "Department." Sections 11502, 11503 introductory paragraph and (7), 11504(a) introductory paragraph, 11505, 12203(a) 11 12 introductory paragraph, 12204 and 12413(a)(1) of Title 11 are 13 amended to read: 14 § 11502. Control of engineering matters. 15 [The] <u>A</u> city engineer shall have the supervision, direction 16 and control of the engineering matters of the city. Unless 17 authorized by council, a department of the city may not employ 18 or retain any additional engineers. 19 § 11503. Duties. 20 As authorized by council, engineering work undertaken by the city shall be performed or supervised by [the] a city engineer 21 or by another registered professional engineer employed by the 22 23 city for a particular purpose. The duties of [the] <u>a</u> city 24 engineer may include all of the following: 25 * * * 26 (7) Making reports, as deemed expedient by [the] <u>a</u> city 27 engineer or as council shall direct, of the surveys and plans of city streets in convenient locations without awaiting the 28 29 completion of the entire survey. * * * 30

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\$ 11504. Certifying commencement and completion of municipal
improvements.

3 (a) Certification.--Within a reasonable time after the 4 completion of any municipal improvement, the cost and expense of 5 which, in whole or in part, is to be paid by the abutting 6 property owner, [the] <u>a</u> city engineer or employees designated by 7 [the] a city engineer shall:

9 § 11505. Entering upon property for surveys.

For the purposes of carrying out authorized surveys, laying out streets or other engineering work of the city, [the] <u>a</u> city engineer or other persons engaged in city engineering work may enter upon any property occupied by any person within the city. 4 § 12203. Survey of mines.

15 (a) General rule.--For the purpose of conducting a survey as 16 may be required by council, [the] <u>a</u> city engineer or other 17 registered professional engineer employed by the city may: 18 * * *

19 § 12204. Operators to furnish maps and contents.

The owner, operator or superintendent of a coal mine or colliery within the limits of the city, in whole or in part, shall, at the request of council, make or cause to be made and furnished to [the] <u>a</u> city engineer an accurate map or plan of the workings or excavations of each coal mine or colliery within the limits of the city.

26 § 12413. Regulation of division fences, party walls and 27 foundations.

28 (a) Authority.--

(1) Subject to the provisions of and regulations adopted
pursuant to the Pennsylvania Construction Code Act and other

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applicable law, council may provide regulations for party walls and division fences, the foundations of buildings and entering upon the land or lands, lot or lots, of any person within the city at all reasonable hours by [its] <u>a</u> duly appointed city engineer or building inspectors in order to enforce the regulations and set out foundations.

8 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
