AN ACT

Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, No.69), entitled "An act concerning townships of the second class; and amending, 2 revising, consolidating and changing the law relating 3 thereto," in township engineer, further providing for township engineer, providing for waiver and further providing 5 for engineer's duties and preparation of plans and for 6 certificate of commencement and of completion of municipal 7 8 improvements. 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 11 Section 1. Section 1201 of the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.103, 12 No.69), known as The Second Class Township Code, is amended to 1.3 read: Section 1201. Township [Engineer. -- The] Engineers. -- Subject 14 to section 1201.1, the board of supervisors [may appoint and 15 16 determine the compensation of a township engineer who shall be a 17 registered professional engineer. The township engineer serves] 18 shall appoint, through a competitive bid process, and determine 19 the compensation of at least two township engineers who shall be registered professional engineers. A township engineer shall 20

serve at the pleasure of the board of supervisors.

- 1 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 2 <u>Section 1201.1. Waiver.--(a) If the board of supervisors</u>
- 3 cannot obtain offers from qualified registered professional
- 4 <u>engineers to fulfill the requirement under section 1201 to</u>
- 5 appoint at least two township engineers, the board of
- 6 supervisors may be relieved from the requirement by completing a
- 7 <u>certification form</u>, <u>subject to the following:</u>
- 8 (1) The board of supervisors must complete the certification
- 9 form before the contract with the selected township engineer is
- 10 executed and must maintain the form throughout the life of the
- 11 contract with the township engineer.
- 12 (2) The certification form must be completed annually.
- 13 (3) A copy of the certification form must be filed with the
- 14 department.
- 15 <u>(4) The department shall furnish the certification form,</u>
- 16 which must:
- 17 (i) Require the board of supervisors to disclose the methods
- 18 and dates of the public solicitation. For purposes of meeting
- 19 this requirement, the board of supervisors shall advertise
- 20 requests for proposals and announce the solicitation at a public
- 21 meeting.
- 22 (ii) Require the board of supervisors to disclose the number
- 23 of qualified bids received to the public solicitation.
- 24 (iii) Contain a statement that the information provided by
- 25 the board of supervisors is in compliance with 18 Pa.C.S. § 4904
- 26 (relating to unsworn falsification to authorities).
- 27 (iv) Contain a statement that the department does not have
- 28 the discretion to deny waiver requests.
- 29 (b) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 30 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless

- 1 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 2 "Department." The Department of Labor and Industry of the
- 3 Commonwealth.
- 4 Section 3. Sections 1202 and 1203 of the act are amended to
- 5 read:
- 6 Section 1202. Engineer's Duties; Preparation of Plans.--
- 7 [The] \underline{A} township engineer shall perform duties as the board of
- 8 supervisors may direct for the construction, reconstruction,
- 9 maintenance and repair of streets, roads, pavements, sanitary
- 10 sewers, bridges, culverts and other engineering work. [The] A
- 11 township engineer shall prepare plans, specifications and
- 12 estimates of the work undertaken by the township and furnish the
- 13 board of supervisors with reports, information or estimates on
- 14 [any] township engineering work or on questions submitted by the
- 15 board of supervisors.
- 16 Section 1203. Certificate of Commencement and of Completion
- 17 of Municipal Improvements. -- [The] A township engineer shall
- 18 certify to the township secretary the date of commencement and
- 19 of completion of [all municipal improvements] a municipal
- 20 <u>improvement</u>, the cost of which, in whole or in part, is to be
- 21 paid by the owners of the abutting property. The certification
- 22 shall be made a part of the permanent records of the township.
- 23 The certified time of commencement and completion is conclusive
- 24 on all parties. The term "certified time of completion" means
- 25 the time of the completion of the whole contract for the
- 26 <u>municipal</u> improvement.
- 27 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
