AN ACT

1	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled
2	"An act relating to the finances of the State government;
3	providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for
4	ambulatory surgical center data collection, for the Joint
5	Underwriting Association, for entertainment business
6	financial management firms, for private dam financial
7	assurance and for reinstatement of item vetoes; providing for
8	the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes,
9	bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the
10	collection and recovery of fees and other money or property
11	due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
12	including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale,
13	the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds
14	and securities belonging to or in the possession of the
15	Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the
16	Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the
17	courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the
18	Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and
19	all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting
20	moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
21	and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth,
22	authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes
23	to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of
24	section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of
25	Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of
26	certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every
27	department, board, commission, and officer of the State
28	government, every political subdivision of the State, and
29	certain officers of such subdivisions, every person,
30	association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or
31	collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws
32	imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or
33	other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,

1 2 3 4	every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the Commonwealth," in emergency COVID-19 response, establishing the Community Health Outreach and Vaccination Support Program; and making an appropriation.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known
8	as The Fiscal Code, is amended by adding a section to read:
9	Section 135-C. Community Health Outreach and Vaccination
10	<u>Support Program.</u>
11	(a) EstablishmentThe Community Health Outreach and
12	Vaccination Support Program is established within the department
13	to make grants under this section.
14	(b) EligibilityA nonprofit organization shall be eligible
15	to apply for a grant under the program if the nonprofit
16	organization:
17	(1) Has demonstrated experience and expertise in
18	implementing public health programs, particularly in
19	medically underserved areas and across broad geographic
20	areas.
21	(2) Has established relationships with the Department of
22	<u>Health or State or local public health departments.</u>
23	(3) Can demonstrate the ability to provide services to
24	areas and populations not being reached by current COVID-19
25	vaccination and response efforts.
26	(4) Can clearly describe the partnerships formed at the
27	regional and local level to directly assist individuals in
28	receiving the COVID-19 vaccination. The partnerships may
29	include organizations such as community-based organizations
30	and other health and social service organizations that can
31	directly hire community outreach workers from the vulnerable
32	and medically underserved communities that they will serve

1	and can reach out to communities or populations with low
2	COVID-19 vaccination rates.
3	(c) Use of moneyA grant under this section may only be
4	used for the purpose of outreach efforts with the purpose of
5	educating persons in the community of the benefits of the COVID-
6	19 vaccination, including:
7	(1) Local media buys for advertising and public service
8	announcements involving television, radio, newspapers,
9	magazines, blogs and websites.
10	(2) Community events.
11	(3) Mobilization efforts to educate and assist
12	individuals in accessing and receiving COVID-19 vaccinations,
13	including making COVID-19 vaccination appointments, providing
14	resources to find convenient COVID-19 vaccination locations
15	and assisting individuals with transportation.
16	(4) Administrative costs related to the outreach
17	<u>efforts.</u>
18	(d) Application
19	(1) The department shall develop grant application
20	forms.
21	(2) At a minimum, the forms shall contain the following
22	information:
23	(i) The name, address and contact information of the
24	applicant.
25	(ii) A description of the applicant and eligibility,
26	including any documentation of proof as required by the
27	<u>department.</u>
28	(iii) The amount of grant money requested.
29	(iv) The proposed use for the grant money requested.
30	(v) Any other information that the department deems

2	(3) The forms shall be posted on the publicly accessible
3	Internet website of the department.
4	(e) LimitationA nonprofit organization shall not receive
5	program grant money totaling more than \$50,000.
6	(f) Review and determinationAfter review of the
7	information provided under each applicant's submitted
8	application form, the department shall determine whether to
9	award grant money to the applicant and, if so, the amount of the
10	grant money awarded. The award shall give special consideration
11	to a nonprofit organization that will serve communities or
12	populations with low COVID-19 vaccination rates.
13	(g) AppropriationIn addition to any other money
14	appropriated to the department for grants under this section,
15	the sum of \$5,000,000 is appropriated to the department from
16	money received by the Commonwealth under Title IX, Subtitle M,
17	section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Public Law
18	117-2, 135 Stat. 4) and deposited into the COVID-19 Response
19	Restricted Account for the purpose of making grants under this
20	section.
21	(h) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
22	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
23	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
24	"COVID-19." The novel coronavirus as identified in the
25	proclamation of disaster emergency issued by the Governor on
26	March 6, 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and
27	any renewal of the state of disaster emergency.
28	"Department." The Department of Community and Economic
29	Development of the Commonwealth.
30	"Institution of higher education." As defined in section

1	118(c) of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as
2	the Public School Code of 1949.
3	"Nonprofit organization." As follows:
4	(1) An entity that is:
5	(i) organized as a nonprofit corporation or
6	nonprofit unincorporated association under the laws of
7	the United States or this Commonwealth; or
8	(ii) authorized to do business in this Commonwealth
9	as a nonprofit corporation or nonprofit unincorporated
10	association under the laws of this Commonwealth.
11	(2) The term includes a religious institution, a faith-
12	based organization and an institution of higher education.
13	"Program." The Community Health Outreach and Vaccination
14	<u>Support Program.</u>
15	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
