## AN ACT

1	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An <
2	act relating to the public school system, including certain
3	provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
4	schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
5	laws relating thereto," providing for military connected
6	students.
7	AMENDING THE ACT OF MARCH 10, 1949 (P.L.30, NO.14), ENTITLED "AN <
8	ACT RELATING TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM, INCLUDING CERTAIN
9	PROVISIONS APPLICABLE AS WELL TO PRIVATE AND PAROCHIAL
10	SCHOOLS; AMENDING, REVISING, CONSOLIDATING AND CHANGING THE
11	LAWS RELATING THERETO, " PROVIDING FOR PURPLE STAR SCHOOL
12	PROGRAM.
13	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
14	hereby enacts as follows:
15	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known <
16	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an-
17	article to read:
18	ARTICLE XIII-F
19	MILITARY CONNECTED STUDENTS
20	Section 1301 F. Definitions.
21	The following words and phrases when used in this article
22	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the

1	context clearly indicates otherwise:
2	"Department." The Department of Education of the
3	Commonwealth.
4	"Military-connected student." A student who is the dependent
5	of either an individual in the active military service of the
6	<u>United States or in a full time status during active service</u>
7	with a force of the Pennsylvania National Guard.
8	"School." A school in a school district, charter school,
9	regional charter school, cyber charter school, intermediate unit
10	or career and technical school in this Commonwealth.
11	Section 1302-F. Purple-Star Schools.
12	(a) Designation. The department shall designate a school
13	as a Purple-Star School if the school applies and qualifies for
14	the designation under this article. To qualify as a Purple-Star-
15	<u>School, a school must:</u>
16	(1) Designate a staff member as a military liaison,
17	whose duties include:
18	(i) identifying military connected students enrolled
19	at the school;
20	(ii) serving as the point of contact between the
21	school and military-connected students and their
22	<pre>families;</pre>
23	(iii) determining appropriate student services
24	available to military connected students; and
25	(iv) assisting in coordinating programs relevant to
26	<u>military-connected students.</u>
27	(2) Maintain on the school district's publicly
28	accessible Internet website resources for military connected
29	students and their families, including information regarding:
30	(i) relocation to, enrollment at, registration at

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1	and transferring records to the school;
2	(ii) academic planning, course sequences and
3	advanced classes available at the school; and
4	(iii) counseling and other support services
5	available for military-connected students enrolled in the
6	school.
7	(3) Maintain a transition program led by students, if
8	appropriate, which assists military connected students in
9	transitioning into the school.
10	(4) Offer professional development for staff members on
11	issues related to military-connected students.
12	(5) Offer at least one of the following initiatives:
13	(i) a resolution showing support for military-
14	connected students and their families;
15	(ii) recognition of the Month of the Military Child
16	or Military Family Month with relevant events hosted by
17	the school; or
18	(iii) a partnership with a local military
19	installation that provides opportunities for active duty
20	military members to volunteer at the school, speak at an
21	assembly or host a field trip.
22	(b) Regulations. The department shall promulgate rules and
23	regulations as necessary to administer this section.
24	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

30	SECTION 1501-K. SCOPE OF ARTICLE.
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1	THIS ARTICLE RELATES TO THE PURPLE STAR SCHOOL PROGRAM.
2	SECTION 1502-K. DEFINITIONS.
3	THE FOLLOWING WORDS AND PHRASES WHEN USED IN THIS ARTICLE
4	SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS SECTION UNLESS THE
5	CONTEXT CLEARLY INDICATES OTHERWISE:
6	"DEPARTMENT." THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION OF THE
7	COMMONWEALTH.
8	"MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT." A SCHOOL-AGED CHILD WHO IS A
9	DEPENDENT OF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
10	(1) AN ACTIVE OR A FORMER MEMBER OF ANY OF THE
11	FOLLOWING:
12	(I) THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES SERVING IN THE
13	UNITED STATES ARMY, NAVY, AIR FORCE, MARINE CORPS, SPACE
14	FORCE OR COAST GUARD ON ACTIVE DUTY.
15	(II) THE PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL GUARD.
16	(III) A RESERVE FORCE OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED
17	FORCES.
18	(2) A MEMBER SPECIFIED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) WHO WAS
19	KILLED IN THE ACTIVE LINE OF DUTY.
20	"NONPUBLIC SCHOOL." A NONPROFIT SCHOOL, OTHER THAN A PUBLIC
21	SCHOOL WITHIN THIS COMMONWEALTH, WHERE A RESIDENT OF THIS
22	COMMONWEALTH MAY LEGALLY FULFILL THE COMPULSORY SCHOOL
23	ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS ACT AND WHICH MEETS THE
24	REQUIREMENTS OF TITLE VI OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1964 (PUBLIC
25	LAW 88-352, 78 STAT. 241).
26	"PROGRAM." THE PURPLE STAR SCHOOL PROGRAM ESTABLISHED UNDER
27	SECTION 1503-K(A).
28	"PUBLIC SCHOOL." A SCHOOL DISTRICT, CHARTER SCHOOL, REGIONAL
29	CHARTER SCHOOL OR AREA CAREER AND TECHNICAL SCHOOL.
30	SECTION 1503-K. PURPLE STAR SCHOOL PROGRAM.

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1	(A) ESTABLISHMENTTHE PURPLE STAR SCHOOL PROGRAM IS
2	ESTABLISHED WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT.
3	(B) DESIGNATIONTHE DEPARTMENT SHALL DESIGNATE A PUBLIC
4	SCHOOL OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL AS A PURPLE STAR SCHOOL IF THE PUBLIC
5	SCHOOL OR NONPUBLIC SCHOOL APPLIES AND QUALIFIES FOR THE
6	DESIGNATION UNDER THE PROGRAM.
7	SECTION 1504-K. QUALIFICATIONS FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS.
8	(A) QUALIFICATIONSIN ORDER TO QUALIFY FOR THE DESIGNATION
9	AS A PURPLE STAR SCHOOL, A PUBLIC SCHOOL SHALL DO ALL OF THE
10	FOLLOWING:
11	(1) SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE DEPARTMENT CERTIFYING
12	THAT THE PUBLIC SCHOOL MEETS ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
13	(I) THE CRITERIA UNDER SECTION 1183.
14	(II) THE PROGRAM QUALIFICATIONS UNDER THIS SECTION.
15	(2) DESIGNATE A STAFF MEMBER AS A MILITARY LIAISON. THE
16	MILITARY LIAISON SHALL HAVE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING DUTIES:
17	(I) IDENTIFY A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT ENROLLED
18	AT THE PUBLIC SCHOOL.
19	(II) SERVE AS THE POINT OF CONTACT BETWEEN THE
20	PUBLIC SCHOOL AND A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT AND THE
21	MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN.
22	(III) DETERMINE APPROPRIATE SCHOOL SERVICES
23	AVAILABLE TO A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT.
24	(IV) ASSIST IN COORDINATING SCHOOL PROGRAMS RELEVANT
25	TO A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT.
26	(3) MAINTAIN AN EASILY ACCESSIBLE WEB PAGE ON THE PUBLIC
27	SCHOOL'S PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE TO PROVIDE
28	RESOURCES FOR A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT AND THE MILITARY-
29	CONNECTED STUDENT'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN, INCLUDING INFORMATION
30	REGARDING ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:

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1	(I) RELOCATION TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL, ENROLLMENT AT
2	THE PUBLIC SCHOOL, REGISTRATION AT THE PUBLIC SCHOOL AND
3	TRANSFERRING RECORDS TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL.
4	(II) ACADEMIC PLANNING, COURSE SEQUENCES AND
5	ADVANCED CLASSES AVAILABLE AT THE PUBLIC SCHOOL.
6	(III) COUNSELING AND OTHER SUPPORT SERVICES
7	AVAILABLE FOR A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT.
8	(4) MAINTAIN A TRANSITION INITIATIVE LED BY STUDENTS,
9	WHEN APPROPRIATE, THAT ASSISTS A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT
10	IN TRANSITIONING INTO THE PUBLIC SCHOOL.
11	(5) OFFER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR STAFF MEMBERS ON
12	ISSUES RELATED TO MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENTS.
13	(6) OFFER AT LEAST ONE OF THE FOLLOWING INITIATIVES:
14	(I) A RESOLUTION SHOWING SUPPORT FOR MILITARY-
15	CONNECTED STUDENTS AND THEIR PARENTS OR GUARDIANS.
16	(II) A COMMEMORATION OF EACH MONTH HONORING ACTIVE-
17	DUTY MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS, INCLUDING RELEVANT EVENTS
18	HOSTED BY THE PUBLIC SCHOOL.
19	(III) A PARTNERSHIP WITH A LOCAL MILITARY
20	INSTALLATION THAT PROVIDES OPPORTUNITIES FOR ACTIVE-DUTY
21	MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS TO VOLUNTEER AT THE PUBLIC
22	SCHOOL, SPEAK AT A SCHOOL ASSEMBLY OR HOST A SCHOOL FIELD
23	TRIP.
24	(B) PARTNERSHIPSA PUBLIC SCHOOL MAY PARTNER WITH ANOTHER
25	PUBLIC SCHOOL TO MEET ANY PROGRAM REQUIREMENT.
26	SECTION 1505-K. QUALIFICATIONS FOR NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS.
27	(A) QUALIFICATIONSIN ORDER TO QUALIFY FOR THE DESIGNATION
28	AS A PURPLE STAR SCHOOL, A NONPUBLIC SCHOOL SHALL DO ALL OF THE
29	FOLLOWING:
30	(1) SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE DEPARTMENT CERTIFYING
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1	THAT THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MEETS THE PROGRAM QUALIFICATIONS
2	UNDER THIS SECTION.
3	(2) DESIGNATE A STAFF MEMBER AS A MILITARY LIAISON. THE
4	MILITARY LIAISON SHALL HAVE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING DUTIES:
5	(I) IDENTIFY A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT ENROLLED
6	AT THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL.
7	(II) SERVE AS THE POINT OF CONTACT BETWEEN THE
8	NONPUBLIC SCHOOL AND A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT AND THE
9	MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN.
10	(III) DETERMINE APPROPRIATE SCHOOL SERVICES
11	AVAILABLE TO A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT.
12	(IV) ASSIST IN COORDINATING SCHOOL PROGRAMS RELEVANT
13	TO A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT.
14	(3) MAINTAIN AN EASILY ACCESSIBLE WEB PAGE ON THE
15	NONPUBLIC SCHOOL'S PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE TO
16	PROVIDE RESOURCES FOR A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT AND THE
17	MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT'S PARENT OR GUARDIAN, INCLUDING
18	INFORMATION REGARDING ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
19	(I) RELOCATION TO THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL, ENROLLMENT
20	AT THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL, REGISTRATION AT THE NONPUBLIC
21	SCHOOL AND TRANSFERRING RECORDS TO THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL.
22	(II) ACADEMIC PLANNING, COURSE SEQUENCES AND
23	ADVANCED CLASSES AVAILABLE AT THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL.
24	(III) COUNSELING AND OTHER SUPPORT SERVICES
25	AVAILABLE FOR A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT.
26	(4) MAINTAIN A TRANSITION INITIATIVE LED BY STUDENTS,
27	WHEN APPROPRIATE, THAT ASSISTS A MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENT
28	IN TRANSITIONING INTO THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL.
29	(5) OFFER PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR STAFF MEMBERS ON
30	ISSUES RELATED TO MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENTS.

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1	(6) OFFER AT LEAST ONE OF THE FOLLOWING INITIATIVES:
2	(I) A RESOLUTION SHOWING SUPPORT FOR MILITARY-
3	CONNECTED STUDENTS AND THEIR PARENTS OR GUARDIANS.
4	(II) A COMMEMORATION OF EACH MONTH HONORING ACTIVE-
5	DUTY MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS, INCLUDING RELEVANT EVENTS
6	HOSTED BY THE NONPUBLIC SCHOOL.
7	(III) A PARTNERSHIP WITH A LOCAL MILITARY
8	INSTALLATION THAT PROVIDES OPPORTUNITIES FOR ACTIVE-DUTY
9	MILITARY SERVICE MEMBERS TO VOLUNTEER AT THE NONPUBLIC
10	SCHOOL, SPEAK AT A SCHOOL ASSEMBLY OR HOST A SCHOOL FIELD
11	TRIP.
12	(B) PARTNERSHIPSA NONPUBLIC SCHOOL MAY PARTNER WITH
13	ANOTHER NONPUBLIC SCHOOL TO MEET ANY PROGRAM REQUIREMENT.
14	SECTION 1506-K. REGULATIONS.
15	THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROMULGATE REGULATIONS AS NECESSARY TO
16	ADMINISTER THIS ARTICLE.
17	SECTION 2. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 180 DAYS.

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
