- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 11 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 <u>"Bureau." The Bureau of Professional and Occupational</u>
- 14 Affairs in the Department of State.
- 15 "License." A registration, permit, certificate or license
- 16 issued by a licensing board.
- 17 "Licensing board." A departmental or administrative board or
- 18 commission under the bureau.
- 19 "Military Occupational Codes Crosswalk." A module created by
- 20 a licensing board to provide guidance when evaluating
- 21 servicemembers' and veterans' applications for licensure to
- 22 identify skills, experience, credentials and education that have
- 23 been obtained in the military and crosswalking those skills,
- 24 experience, credentials and education into substitute licensure
- 25 requirements.
- 26 <u>"Military spouse." The spouse of a servicemember or veteran.</u>
- 27 The term includes an unmarried spouse of a deceased
- 28 servicemember where the servicemember died within one year prior
- 29 to the date an application for a license is submitted to a
- 30 licensing board.

"Qualified applicant." A servicemember, veteran or military 1 2 spouse who has submitted an application for a license. 3 "Servicemember." An active duty member of the armed forces of the United States, a reserve component or the national quard 5 of a state. 6 "Veteran." A former servicemember who was discharged from 7 active duty under circumstances other than dishonorable. 8 § 3302. Representation on licensing boards. 9 The Governor shall provide preference to and strive to achieve the goal of one servicemember, veteran or military 10 spouse serving on each licensing board in this Commonwealth. The 11 servicemember, veteran or military spouse shall be a public 12 13 member of the licensing board. § 3303. Expedited license. 14 (a) Application question. A licensing board shall include a 15 question on applications for licensure, renewal and reactivation 16 whether the individual submitting the application is a 17 18 servicemember, veteran or military spouse. (b) Processing. If an applicant is deemed as a qualified 19 applicant, the licensing board shall: 20 (1) Request that the qualified applicant submit 21 documentation to the licensing board demonstrating status as 22 23 a servicemember, veteran or military spouse. (2) Upon submission, expedite the processing of the 24 25 application. § 3304. Military experience in place of education criteria. 26 A licensing board shall issue a license to a qualified 27 28 applicant who does not meet the educational requirements for the license so long as the qualified applicant: 29 (1) Submits an application and fee as prescribed by the 30

2	(2) Passes all exams required for licensure.
3	(3) Has completed a military program and was awarded a
4	military occupational specialty.
5	(4) Performed in that occupational specialty at a level
6	that is substantially equivalent to the academic requirements
7	for the license that the qualified applicant applied.
8	(5) Has engaged in active practice for at least two of
9	the previous five years before submitting the application. A
10	qualified applicant's relevant military service experience of
11	the qualified applicant's official duties must be credited in
12	the calculation of the number of years the qualified
13	applicant has practiced in the profession.
14	(6) Meets all other noneducational requirements for
15	<u>licensure.</u>
16	§ 3305. Expedited temporary license.
17	(a) Requirements of temporary license. A licensing board
18	shall issue an expedited temporary license to a qualified
19	applicant who meets the criteria of subsection (c).
20	(b) Expiration. The expedited temporary license shall be
21	valid until the earlier of one of:
22	(1) Six months after the date of issuance of the
23	temporary license by the licensing board.
24	(2) The date a nontemporary license is granted.
25	(3) The date a notice to deny a license is issued under
26	subsection (f).
27	(c) Criteria. An application for an expedited temporary
28	license shall include the following documentation that the
29	<u>applicant:</u>
30	(1) Is a servicemember, veteran or military spouse.

Τ	(2) Holds a valid license in good standing issued in
2	another state.
3	(3) Is assigned to a duty station in this Commonwealth
4	or has established legal residence in this Commonwealth.
5	(4) Has submitted a full application for licensure.
6	(d) State equivalent. Except as provided for in subsection
7	(e), before issuing an expedited temporary license to a
8	qualified applicant under this section, the licensing board
9	shall determine that the requirements for licensure in another
0	state the qualified applicant is licensed are substantially
1	equivalent to or exceed the requirements for licensure in this
.2	Commonwealth.
13	(e) Not substantially equivalent. If a licensing board
4	determines that the requirements for licensure in another state
. 5	the qualified applicant is licensed are not substantially
- 6	equivalent to licensure in this Commonwealth, the licensing
_7	board may issue an expedited temporary license for a limited
8 .	period of time at the discretion of the licensing board while
_9	the qualified applicant completes additional requirements for
20	<u>licensure in this Commonwealth.</u>
21	(f) Denial of temporary license. A licensing board may not
22	issue an expedited temporary license if the issuance of the
23	license poses a risk to public health, safety or welfare.
24	(g) Publication. The process for obtaining an expedited
25	temporary license shall be published on a licensing board's
26	publicly accessible Internet website.
27	§ 3306. Relevant military experience.
28	(a) Years of experience. Notwithstanding any other
29	provision of law, in calculating a qualified applicant's years
30	of practice or experience in an occupation or a profession, a

1	licensing board shall give credit to the qualified applicant for
2	relevant experience obtained as a servicemember or veteran.
3	(b) Training or education provided by military. A licensing
4	board shall give credit for training and education provided by
5	the military and completed by a qualified applicant toward
6	training or education requirements for licensure, if the
7	training or education is determined by the licensing board to be
8	substantially equivalent to the training or education required
9	for licensure in this Commonwealth.
10	(c) Military Occupational Codes Crosswalk. A licensing
11	board shall use the Military Occupational Codes Crosswalk to
12	facilitate the acceptance of military practice or experience if
13	training or education requirements for licensure are incomplete.
14	§ 3307. Renewal of license for deployed servicemembers.
15	(a) Renewal application submission before deployment.
16	(1) A servicemember who is scheduled to be deployed
17	outside this Commonwealth may apply for renewal of a license
18	if the deployment will occur when the license is eligible for
19	<u>renewal.</u>
20	(2) The servicemember may submit to the licensing board
21	all requirements for renewal prior to deployment.
22	(3) The licensing board shall provide a review of the
23	application and information received.
24	(4) If the licensing board finds that a requirement is
25	not met, the licensing board may notify the servicemember of
26	the deficiency but may not process the renewal until the
27	biennial renewal cycle begins.
28	(b) Late renew after deployment. A licensing board may
29	renew a license of a servicemember after the expiration of the
30	license without penalty if the late renewal is a direct result

- 1 of deployment. 2 (c) Extension of continued education. A licensing board may 3 extend a requirement to complete continuing education or continued competency requirements for up to three months after 5 deployment of a servicemember if the servicemember meets all other requirements for license renewal. 6 7 (d) Military spouse. This section shall apply to a military 8 spouse if the military spouse travels with the servicemember during deployment. 10 \$ 3308. Fees. 11 A licensing board may not assess a fee for an initial 12 licensure of a military spouse who relocated to this 13 Commonwealth as a result of the servicemember's military orders. § 3309. Reports. 14 15 The bureau shall submit an annual report once for six years to the chairperson and minority chairperson of the Consumer 16 Protection and Professional Licensure Committee of the Senate 17 18 and the chairperson and minority chairperson of the Professional Licensure Committee of the House of Representatives. The report 19 20 shall include: 21 (1) The number of qualified applicants. 22 (2) The number of qualified applicants who were approved 23 for licensure. (3) The number of qualified applicants who were denied 24 25 licensure including data on the reasons for denial. (4) Data on the licensing board's application processing 26 27 times for qualified applicants including reasons for delays. 28 (5) Recommendations on ways to improve the licensing
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board's ability to meet the licensing needs of

servicemembers, veterans and military spouses.

- 8 (1) SUBMITS AN APPLICATION AND FEE AS PRESCRIBED BY THE

- 10 (2) PASSES ALL EXAMS REQUIRED FOR LICENSURE.
- 11 (3) HAS ENGAGED IN ACTIVE PRACTICE FOR AT LEAST TWO OF
- 12 THE PREVIOUS FIVE YEARS BEFORE SUBMITTING THE APPLICATION.
- 13 RELEVANT MILITARY SERVICE EXPERIENCE AND OFFICIAL DUTIES

30	IF THE DEPLOYMENT WILL OCCUR WHEN THE LICENSE IS ELIGIBLE FOR

- 2 (2) THE SERVICEMEMBER MAY SUBMIT TO THE LICENSING BOARD

- 2 (A) SUBMISSION AND CONTENT. -- THE BUREAU SHALL SUBMIT AN
- 3 ANNUAL REPORT TO THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE
- 4 CONSUMER PROTECTION AND PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE COMMITTEE OF THE
- 5 SENATE, THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE

- 17 (4) DATA ON THE LICENSING BOARD'S APPLICATION PROCESSING
- 18 TIMES FOR MILITARY APPLICANTS INCLUDING REASONS FOR DELAYS.
- 19 (5) RECOMMENDATIONS ON WAYS TO IMPROVE THE LICENSING
- 20 BOARD'S ABILITY TO MEET THE LICENSING NEEDS OF

- 22 (B) EXPIRATION.--THIS SECTION SHALL EXPIRE SIX YEARS AFTER
- 23 THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION.
- 24 SECTION 2. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IN 120 DAYS.
