AN ACT

- Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
 Consolidated Statutes, in Department of Military Affairs,
 repealing provisions relating to advisory councils for
 veterans' homes; and, in State Veterans' Commission and
 Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans' Affairs, further
 providing for definitions and providing for veterans' homes.

 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
 hereby enacts as follows:

 Section 1. Section 704 of Title 51 of the Pennsylvania
- 11 [§ 704. Advisory councils for veterans' homes.

Consolidated Statutes is repealed:

- 12 (a) Establishment of advisory council. -- There is hereby
- 13 established an advisory council for each veterans' home operated
- 14 by the Commonwealth. Each advisory council shall consist of 15
- 15 members and the Adjutant General, who shall serve ex officio.
- 16 Twelve of the members shall be appointed by the Governor from a
- 17 list of nominations submitted to the Adjutant General by the
- 18 Pennsylvania War Veterans' Council. The Speaker of the House of
- 19 Representatives and the President pro tempore of the Senate

- 1 shall each appoint one member from their respective bodies to
- 2 serve on each council. The remaining member on the advisory
- 3 council shall be selected by the residents of the veterans'
- 4 homes.
- 5 (b) Term of office and officers.--Each member of the
- 6 councils appointed from the General Assembly shall serve for the
- 7 duration of that General Assembly. The eight members appointed
- 8 by the Governor shall serve a term of three years, provided that
- 9 the initial eight members selected by the Governor shall serve
- 10 as follows: three members for one year, three members for two
- 11 years and two members for three years as designated by the
- 12 Governor. Each council shall organize as soon as possible and
- 13 shall annually elect a president, vice president and secretary.
- (c) Removal for cause. -- The members appointed by the
- 15 Governor may be removed by the Governor for cause.
- (d) Quorum and time of meetings. -- Six members of a council
- 17 shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting the
- 18 business of the council. Each advisory council shall meet at
- 19 least quarterly and at other times at the call of the president.
- 20 (e) Expenses. -- Members of each advisory council shall
- 21 receive no compensation for their services but shall receive
- 22 reimbursement for their necessary and proper expenses for
- 23 attendance at meetings.
- (f) Power and duty of advisory councils. -- Each veterans'
- 25 home advisory council shall advise the Adjutant General as to
- 26 the management, operation and the adequacy of facilities and
- 27 services at their respective homes.]

- 28 (a) Establishment. -- The Veterans' Home Advisory Board is
- 29 established in the department.
- 30 (b) Composition. -- The advisory board shall consist of the

 13 for subsection (b) (15), recommendations for appointments

 14 under this paragraph shall be requested by the Governor from

- 16 (2) Members appointed by the Governor are appointed to
 17 terms of two years and may serve no more than three
 18 consecutive terms.
- 19 (3) The Statewide organizations under paragraph (1)
 20 shall ensure that nominees are sufficiently proficient and
 21 knowledgeable in the operations and policies of nursing home
 22 care, long-term care facilities or a related health care
 23 facility and to the greatest extent possible, provide a
 24 diverse representation of the Commonwealth's demographics and
 25 regions.
- 26 (4) The Governor shall make the initial appointments of
 27 members under subsection (b)(5), (6), (7), (8), (9) and (15)
 28 within 90 days of the effective date of this paragraph.
 29 Initial terms for members appointed by the Governor shall be
 30 divided between one-year and two-year terms.

- 1 (5) The Governor may remove an appointed member of the
- 2 advisory board for cause upon written notice to the advisory
- 3 board.
- 4 (6) A member's nonparticipation in three consecutive
- 5 <u>advisory board meetings may be considered cause for removal.</u>
- 6 (7) For a vacancy, the Governor shall appoint an
- 7 <u>individual to fill the remainder of the term.</u>
- 8 <u>(e) Quorum.--Seventeen members of the advisory board shall</u>
- 9 constitute a quorum. When a quorum is present, three-fourths of
- 10 the members present and voting are required for any action of
- 11 the advisory board.
- 12 <u>(f) Meetings.--The advisory board shall meet at least once</u>
- 13 quarterly and at any special session called by the chairperson.
- 14 All meetings of the advisory board shall be conducted in
- 15 <u>accordance with 65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7 (relating to open meetings).</u>
- 16 (g) Compensation. -- The members of the advisory board shall
- 17 serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for actual
- 18 and necessary travel and other expenses in connection with
- 19 attendance at meetings called by the chairperson.
- 20 (h) Powers and duties. -- The advisory board shall have the
- 21 power and duty to:
- 22 (1) Serve as an advisory body to the office for the
- 23 <u>development and improvement of services to and care and</u>
- 24 treatment of residents of veterans' homes in accordance with
- 25 <u>nationally accepted standards of care.</u>
- 26 (2) Review and make recommendations regarding, and
- 27 <u>approve in its advisory capacity, the system of standards</u>
- developed by the office.
- 29 <u>(3) Evaluate and review the standards, practices and</u>
- 30 procedures of the office regarding the administration and

Т	enforcement of applicable redetal and state laws and
2	regulations. The advisory board may make recommendations to
3	the Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans' Affairs.
4	(4) Evaluate and review financial accountability
5	standards, policies and practices of residential veterans'
6	homes regarding residents' money for which the veterans' home
7	is the payee and evaluate and review expenditures made on
8	behalf of the residents by the veterans' home to ensure that
9	the money is managed appropriately and in the best interests
10	of the residents.
11	(5) Publish and distribute an annual report of its
12	activities and any recommendations for the improvement of
13	services, care and treatment to residents of veterans' homes
14	on or before January 1 each year to:
15	(i) The Governor.
16	(ii) The chair of the Veterans Affairs and Emergency
17	Preparedness Committee of the Senate.
18	(iii) The minority chair of the Veterans Affairs and
19	Emergency Preparedness Committee of the Senate.
20	(iv) The chair of the Veterans Affairs and Emergency
21	Preparedness Committee of the House of Representatives.
22	(v) The minority chair of the Veterans Affairs and
23	Emergency Preparedness Committee of the House of
24	Representatives.
25	(i) Additional powers and duties The advisory board shall
26	have the power and duty to:
27	(1) Interview qualified applicants for the position of
28	Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans' Affairs.
29	(2) Interview qualified applicants for the position of
30	director of veterans' homes.

- 2 <u>qualified applicants for the position of Deputy Adjutant</u>
- 3 General for Veterans' Affairs and director of veterans'
- 4 homes.
- 5 <u>(4) Remove a Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans'</u>
- 6 Affairs or director of veterans' homes for cause upon written
- 7 <u>notice to the advisory board or upon an action initiated by</u>
- 8 <u>the advisory board.</u>
- 9 <u>§ 1742. Veterans' home advisory councils.</u>
- 10 (a) Establishment.--Each veterans' home shall establish a
- 11 resident advisory council. The commandant of the veterans' home
- 12 <u>shall designate facility staff to coordinate the establishment</u>
- 13 of and to act as the administrative staff to the advisory
- 14 <u>council. No employee or affiliate of a veterans' home shall be a</u>
- 15 member of a resident advisory council.
- 16 (b) Composition. -- Each advisory council shall consist of the
- 17 following members, or a designee of the member:
- 18 (1) Four members, appointed by the Governor from a list
- 19 of nominations submitted to the Office of Deputy Adjutant
- 20 General from the Pennsylvania War Veterans Council.
- 21 (2) One member of the Senate, appointed by the President
- 22 pro tempore of the Senate, who represents the county or a
- 23 portion of the county in which a veterans' home is located.
- 24 (3) One member of the Senate, appointed by the Minority
- 25 <u>Leader of the Senate, who represents the county or a portion</u>
- of the county in which a veterans' home is located.
- 27 (4) One member of the House of Representatives,
- appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, who
- 29 represents the county or a portion of the county in which a
- 30 <u>veterans' home is located.</u>

2	appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of
3	Representatives, who represents the county or a portion of
4	the county in which a veterans' home is located.
5	(6) A licensed physician from the county in which a
6	veterans' home is located.
7	(7) A representative from the local agency on aging
8	located nearest to the veterans' home.
9	(8) A licensed registered nurse not employed or
10	affiliated with the veterans' home.
11	(9) The county veterans' affairs director from the
12	county in which the veterans' home is located.
13	(10) The president or chief of the EMS agency that is
14	the primary EMS provider for the veterans' home.
15	(c) Powers and duties Each advisory council shall:
16	(1) Meet at least once each month with the staff
17	coordinator who shall provide assistance to the council in
18	preparing and disseminating a report of each meeting as
19	specified by regulation to each resident, the administrator
20	and the staff.
21	(2) Keep and maintain records of the advisory council's
22	meetings, which shall be kept and stored in the commandant's
23	office.
24	(3) Communicate to the commandant the opinions and
25	concerns of the residents of a veterans' home.
26	(4) Review procedures for implementing residents'
27	rights, veterans' home responsibilities and make
28	recommendations for changes or additions which will
29	strengthen the veterans' home policies and procedures which
30	affect residents' rights and veterans' home responsibilities.

(5) Provide a forum for the following:
(i) Obtaining and disseminating information,
including complaints that are filed with the advisory
council.
(ii) Soliciting and adopting recommendations for
veterans' home programming and improvements.
(iii) Early identification and recommendation of
orderly resolution of problems.
(iv) The maintaining of records of complaints
against the veterans' home and staff and the presentment
of the complaints to the department monthly.
(6) Provide, on a quarterly basis, a report to the
advisory board outlining in detail the information required
under this subsection.
§ 1743. Director.
(a) Establishment There shall be a State Director of
Veterans' Homes within the department who shall report to the
Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans' Affairs on all matters
<pre>concerning veterans' homes.</pre>
(b) Appointment The Governor shall appoint a director as
<pre>provided for under section 1741(i)(3) (relating to Veterans'</pre>
Home Advisory Board).
(c) Qualifications The director shall:
(1) Be an honorably discharged veteran of the United
States Armed Forces, including a reserve component or
National Guard.
(2) Be of good moral character as determined by the
Pennsylvania Board of Examiners of Nursing Home
Administrators.
(3) Possess not less than a bachelor's degree from an

- 1 <u>accredited college or university in a field related to health</u>
- 2 care or human services.
- 3 (4) Possess a valid Pennsylvania nursing home
- 4 <u>administrator's license.</u>
- 5 (5) Possess not less than three years' experience, in
- 6 the prior 10 years, in a related health care facility
- 7 <u>licensed by the Department of Health.</u>
- 8 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
