## AN ACT

4	(a) Legislative intent
_5	(1) It is the intent of the General Assembly that
. 6	teachers be equipped to facilitate high-quality reading
_7	instruction grounded in the science of reading and
8 ـ	intervention services to address student reading needs.
9	(2) The program provided in this section will assist

- 1 <u>school districts in providing professional development for</u>
- 2 teachers in foundational skills and instructional
- 3 <u>interventions based on the science of reading and selecting</u>
- 4 <u>district personnel to serve as reading coaches to support</u>
- 5 <u>teachers in delivering high-quality reading instruction.</u>
- 6 (b) Program to be conducted. --
- 7 (1) Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, the
- 8 <u>Department of Education shall conduct a program with school</u>
- 9 <u>districts that volunteer to participate according to the</u>
- 10 <u>implementation of professional development and applied</u>
- 11 practice in the science of reading as selected school
- 12 <u>district personnel provide in-class demonstration, modeling</u>
- and coaching support to improve reading and literacy
- 14 <u>outcomes.</u>
- 15 (2) Selected coaches must have at least five years of
- experience in the teaching of reading by demonstrating their
- 17 skills in the instruction of and intervention with students,
- including those with dyslexia and other language-related
- 19 disabilities.
- 20 (3) The department may contract with multiple service
- 21 providers to develop and implement the program so that
- 22 <u>experienced support is available locally with providers who</u>
- 23 <u>can demonstrate application success.</u>
- 24 (4) Training workshops and meetings do not constitute
- 25 the professional development required under the program.
- 26 (5) Local education agencies and institutions of higher
- 27 <u>education that have successful implementation of literacy</u>
- 28 outcomes are eligible to provide professional development and
- onsite demonstration and coaching support in the program.
- 30 (c) Professional learning for kindergarten, first, second,

- 1 third and fourth grade teachers. -- Teachers in participating
- 2 <u>school districts shall participate in training and in-class</u>
- 3 application and demonstration of the foundational skills and
- 4 evidence-based intervention practices on the science of reading,
- 5 <u>including explicit and systematic instruction in phonological</u>
- 6 and phonemic awareness, the alphabetic principle, decoding and
- 7 encoding, fluency, vocabulary, reading comprehension and
- 8 <u>building content knowledge</u>, to ensure that all teachers have the
- 9 knowledge and skill to teach all students to read, including
- 10 students with dyslexia and other language-based learning
- 11 <u>disabilities</u>.
- 12 (d) Duties of department. -- The Department of Education
- 13 <u>shall:</u>
- 14 <u>(1) Select schools interested and committed to the</u>
- 15 <u>curricular</u>, <u>instructional and professional development</u>
- 16 <u>changes required for the program and create criteria for</u>
- 17 selection for participation based on the number and
- percentages of students scoring in the lowest two achievement
- 19 levels on State assessment for grades three and four, as well
- 20 <u>as other district-initiated reading, screening and other</u>
- 21 relevant data for kindergarten and grades one and two.
- 22 (2) Select an in-district teacher who has demonstrated
- 23 literacy success to work as a coach within each school to be
- responsible for the faithful implementation of the program.
- 25 Additional support for all school district coaches will be
- 26 <u>provided as part of the program as needed.</u>
- 27 (e) Definition. -- For purposes of this section, the term
- 28 "science of reading" shall mean evidence-based instructional and
- 29 assessment practices that address the multimodal approach that
- 30 integrates listening, speaking, reading, spelling and writing in

- 1 the acquisition of oral and written language skills that can be
- 2 <u>differentiated to meet the needs of individual students.</u>
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
