AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," establishing the PA Teach Scholarship Program; imposing duties on the Pennsylvania Higher Education 6 Assistance Agency and the State System of Higher Education; and making an appropriation. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 11 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 12 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an 13 article to read: 14 ARTICLE XX-L 15 PA TEACH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM 16 Section 2001-L. Purpose. 17 The purpose of this article is to help ensure an excellent 18 education within the public schools of this Commonwealth by addressing the lack of teachers that has jeopardized the 19 provision of the constitutionally required thorough and 20

- 2 this Commonwealth.
- 3 Section 2002-L. Definitions.
- 4 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 5 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 6 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 7 <u>"Academic year." A complete school year commencing on or</u>
- 8 <u>after August 1 of the calendar year.</u>
- 9 <u>"Agency." The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance</u>
- 10 Agency.
- 11 "Cost of attendance." The direct and indirect costs relating
- 12 to attendance at an institution. The term includes tuition and
- 13 fees, room and board or living expenses, books, supplies,
- 14 transportation, loan fees, the documented cost of a personal
- 15 computer and other school-related miscellaneous expenses,
- 16 allowance for child care or other dependent care, costs related
- 17 to a disability, eliqible study-abroad programs, costs related
- 18 to student teaching and any other costs approved by the agency.
- 19 "Eliqible student." An individual who meets the eliqibility
- 20 criteria specified in section 2004-L.
- 21 "Program." The PA Teach Scholarship Program established
- 22 <u>under section 2003-L.</u>
- 23 "State system." The State System of Higher Education
- 24 established under Article XX-A.
- 25 <u>Section 2003-L. PA Teach Scholarship Program.</u>
- 26 (a) Establishment. -- The PA Teach Scholarship Program is
- 27 <u>established within the agency.</u>
- 28 (b) Scholarship grant. -- The agency shall provide a
- 29 scholarship grant to an eligible student who is a resident of
- 30 this Commonwealth. The scholarship grant shall be applied

- 1 against the cost of attendance. The scholarship grant shall be
- 2 for the amount provided under section 2004-L.
- 3 (c) Other funding. -- Prior to receiving a scholarship grant
- 4 <u>under this article</u>, a student must also apply for Federal Pell
- 5 Grants and State grants available to cover the cost of
- 6 <u>attendance</u>, as determined by the agency.
- 7 (d) Order of financial aid. -- An institution of the State
- 8 system shall apply a scholarship grant received by an eliqible
- 9 student with other financial aid in the following order:
- 10 (1) Federal Pell Grant or any successor program.
- 11 <u>(2) Pennsylvania State grants.</u>
- 12 (3) Institutional aid.
- 13 <u>(4) Private scholarships.</u>
- 14 (5) Scholarship grants awarded under section 2004-L.
- 15 (6) Federal work study.
- 16 <u>(7) Federal student loans.</u>
- 17 Section 2004-L. Scholarship grant.
- 18 (a) Eligibility. -- To receive a scholarship grant, a student
- 19 must meet the following requirements:
- 20 (1) Attend a university within the State system.
- 21 (2) Be enrolled in an approved course of study in
- 22 education or another program that is designed to prepare the
- 23 student to become a teacher in an elementary or secondary
- school.
- 25 (3) Maintain domicile in this Commonwealth during the
- term of the scholarship grant.
- 27 (4) Enter into a written agreement with the agency in a
- form and manner that the agency shall determine to do all of
- 29 the following:
- 30 (i) Commence employment in this Commonwealth within

- 1 one year after completion of the approved course of 2 study. 3 (ii) Work within this Commonwealth for a period of one year for each academic year that the eligible student 4 5 received a scholarship grant under this article, unless the agency determines that there are extenuating 6 7 circumstances. 8 (iii) Reimburse the Commonwealth all amounts received under this article if the eligible student does 9 10 not comply with subparagraphs (i) and (ii). (b) Student teaching. -- An eligible student who is engaged in 11 student teaching shall be eligible to receive a scholarship 12 13 grant. 14 (c) Amount. -- The agency may award a scholarship grant in an amount up to \$8,000 per academic year to an eligible student. 15 16 (d) Renewal. -- The scholarship grant may be renewed for up to four academic years. 17 18 (e) Application. -- An eligible student shall apply to the 19 agency for a scholarship grant as prescribed by the agency. 20 (f) Termination. -- If a student who receives a scholarship grant terminates enrollment at the university during the 21 academic year or prior to completion of the approved course of 22 23 study, the university shall notify the agency in writing. The 24 university shall return all unused portions of the scholarship grant. The returned portion shall be used to fund other 25 26 scholarship grants under this article. (q) Transfer. -- A scholarship grant is only transferrable if 27 28 the student transfers to another university within the State 29 system.
- 30 (h) Limitations. -- A scholarship grant awarded under the

- 1 program shall be made from funds appropriated for that purpose.
- 2 First priority for the awarding of grants shall be given to
- 3 renewal applicants. Thereafter, a grant shall be awarded on a
- 4 <u>first-come</u>, <u>first-served basis</u>.
- 5 <u>Section 2005-L. Miscellaneous provisions.</u>
- 6 (a) Enforcement. -- The agency shall enforce repayment of all
- 7 <u>scholarship grants for a student who does not comply with the</u>
- 8 provisions of this article. The agency may use all lawful
- 9 <u>collection procedures and may use private collection agencies.</u>
- 10 (b) Scholarship grant not taxable income. -- Scholarship
- 11 grants received by an eligible student shall not be considered
- 12 <u>taxable income for purposes of Article III of the act of March</u>
- 13 4, 1971 (P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971.
- 14 (c) Regulations. -- The agency shall adopt regulations,
- 15 guidelines and procedures necessary to carry out this article.
- 16 (d) Report. -- The agency shall annually publish on the
- 17 agency's publicly accessible Internet website a report on the
- 18 program. The report shall include information regarding the
- 19 operation of the program, including:
- 20 (1) The number of students receiving an award at each
- 21 university within the State system.
- 22 (2) Demographic and income statistics of students
- 23 receiving an award.
- 24 (3) Outcome measures, including:
- 25 (i) The number of students receiving an award who go
- on to teach in schools in this Commonwealth.
- 27 (ii) The number of students receiving an award who
- 28 stay in this Commonwealth after graduation.
- 29 (iii) Any other measures determined by the agency or
- requested by the State system.

- 1 (e) Appropriation.--The sum of \$50,000,000 is appropriated
- 2 <u>from the General Fund to the agency for the current fiscal year</u>
- 3 for the program. The General Assembly shall appropriate funds
- 4 for the program for the following fiscal years.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
