AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 1 Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for 2 definitions; in certificate of title and security interests, further providing for content and effect of certificate of title; in rules of the road in general, further providing for 5 platooning; in miscellaneous provisions, further providing 6 for accidents involving death or personal injury, for 7 8 accidents involving damage to attended vehicle or property, for duty to give information and render aid, for accidents 9 involving damage to unattended vehicle or property and for 10 immediate notice of accident to police department; in 11 equipment standards, further providing for promulgation of 12 13 vehicle equipment standards; in inspection of vehicles, further providing for requirement for periodic inspection of 14 vehicles; in size, weight and load, further providing for width of vehicles; and, in highly automated vehicles, further 15 16 providing for definitions, providing for construction, 17 18 further providing for Highly Automated Vehicle Advisory Committee and providing for operation of highly automated 19 vehicles without a highly automated vehicle driver, for 20 21 operation of highly automated vehicles with a highly 22 automated motor vehicle driver, for operation of highly automated motor carrier vehicles, for operation of highly 23 automated transportation network service, for licensing and 24 registration, for insurance, for control and for regulations. 25 26 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 2.8 Section 1. Section 102 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania

- 1 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding definitions to read:
- 2 § 102. Definitions.
- 3 Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent
- 4 provisions of this title which are applicable to specific
- 5 provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when
- 6 used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly
- 7 indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section:
- 8 * * *
- 9 "Automated driving system" or "ADS." The hardware and
- 10 software collectively capable of performing the entire dynamic
- 11 driving task on a sustained basis, regardless of whether it is
- 12 <u>limited within a specific operational design domain. The term</u>
- 13 <u>describes a Level 3, 4 or 5 driving automation system under SAE</u>
- 14 J3016.
- 15 * * *
- 16 "Highly automated vehicle." A motor vehicle equipped with an
- 17 ADS and owned by a firm, copartnership, association, corporation
- 18 <u>or research institution.</u>
- 19 "Highly automated vehicle driver." An individual who:
- 20 (1) Performs all or part of the dynamic driving task for
- 21 <u>a highly automated vehicle located on board in the driver's</u>
- 22 <u>position or in a remote location.</u>
- 23 (2) Is an authorized affiliate, employee or contractor
- of the owner of the highly automated vehicle.

- 26 "SAE J3016." Surface Vehicle Recommended Practice Taxonomy
- 27 and Definitions for Terms Related to Driving Automation Systems
- 28 for On-Road Motor Vehicles published by the Society of
- 29 Automotive Engineers (SAE) International in April 2021.

- 1 Section 2. Section 1106(b)(10) and (11) of Title 75 are
- 2 amended and the subsection is amended by adding a paragraph to
- 3 read:
- 4 § 1106. Content and effect of certificate of title.
- 5 * * *
- 6 (b) Indication of special use or condition. -- No person shall
- 7 assign a certificate of title to any vehicle unless the
- 8 certificate clearly contains notice of the use or condition if
- 9 the vehicle is or has been:
- 10 * * *
- 11 (10) bearing a VIN plate differing from its original;
- 12 [or]
- 13 (11) a motor vehicle returned to a vehicle dealer or
- manufacturer pursuant to the act of March 28, 1984 (P.L.150,
- No.28), known as the Automobile Lemon Law[.]; or
- 16 (12) a highly automated vehicle.
- 17 Indication of the use or condition shall be deemed part of the
- 18 description of the vehicle. Any person violating this subsection

- 27 (d) Restrictions. -- A platoon shall observe the following
- 28 restrictions:

- 30 (4) [A] Except as provided under paragraph (5), a driver

- 1 shall be in each vehicle of a platoon.
- 2 (5) Consistent with applicable Federal and State laws,
- 3 the lead vehicle may operate with a driver and one nonlead
- 4 <u>vehicle may operate with an ADS engaged, with a highly</u>
- 5 automated vehicle driver or without a highly automated
- 6 vehicle driver.
- 7 (e) Plan for general platoon operations. -- A person may
- 8 operate a platoon on a highway of this Commonwealth if the
- 9 person files <u>and reviews</u> a plan for general platoon operations
- 10 with the department[. The department shall review the plan] in
- 11 consultation with the Pennsylvania State Police and the
- 12 Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission, as applicable. [If the plan is
- 13 not rejected by the department within 30 days after receipt of
- 14 the plan, the person may operate the platoon.]

- 20 <u>subsection</u> (a) is a highly automated vehicle operating with an
- 21 ADS engaged or without a highly automated vehicle driver on
- 22 board, the requirements of this section are satisfied if the
- 23 highly automated vehicle stops at the scene of an accident or as
- 24 close thereto as possible and remains at the scene of the
- 25 accident until the requirements of section 3744 have been
- 26 <u>fulfilled</u>.

- 28 § 3743. Accidents involving damage to attended vehicle or
- 29 property.

- 1 (a.1) Highly automated vehicles. -- The following shall apply:
- 2 (1) If a vehicle under subsection (a) is a highly
- automated vehicle operating with an ADS engaged or without a
- 4 <u>highly automated vehicle driver on board, the requirements of</u>
- 5 this section are satisfied if the highly automated vehicle
- 6 stops at the scene of the accident or as close thereto as
- possible and the owner or registrant of the highly automated
- 8 <u>vehicle</u>, a person on behalf of the owner or registrant or the
- 9 highly automated vehicle immediately contacts the nearest
- office of a duly authorized police department to report the
- 11 accident.
- 12 (2) The highly automated vehicle shall remain at the
- scene of the accident or as close thereto as possible until
- the owner or registrant of the highly automated vehicle or a
- person on behalf of the owner or registrant is informed by a
- 16 police officer that the requirements of section 3744 are
- 17 fulfilled.

- 19 § 3744. Duty to give information and render aid.
- 20 * * *
- 21 (a.1) Highly automated vehicles. -- The following shall apply:
- 22 (1) If a vehicle under subsection (a) is a highly
- 23 automated vehicle operating with an ADS engaged or without a
- highly automated vehicle driver on board, the requirements of
- 25 this section are satisfied if the owner or registrant of the
- highly automated vehicle, a person on behalf of the owner or
- 27 registrant or the highly automated vehicle immediately
- contacts the nearest office of a duly authorized police
- 29 department to report the accident and communicates the
- registration and financial responsibility information for the

- 1 highly automated vehicle to the police department.
- 2 (2) The highly automated vehicle shall remain at the
- 3 scene of the accident or as close thereto as possible until a
- 4 police officer confirms to the owner or registrant of the
- 5 <u>highly automated vehicle</u>, or a person on behalf of the owner
- 6 or registrant, that the requirements of this section are
- 7 fulfilled.

- 9 § 3745. Accidents involving damage to unattended vehicle or
- 10 property.

- 12 (a.1) Highly automated vehicles. -- The following shall apply:
- 13 (1) If a vehicle under subsection (a) is a highly
- 14 <u>automated vehicle operating with an ADS engaged or without a</u>
- 15 <u>highly automated vehicle driver on board, the requirements of</u>
- this section are satisfied if the highly automated vehicle
- 17 immediately stops at the scene of the accident or as close
- thereto as possible and the owner or registrant of the highly
- 19 automated vehicle, a person on behalf of the owner or
- registrant or the highly automated vehicle immediately
- 21 contacts the nearest office of a duly authorized police
- 22 department to report the accident and communicates the
- 23 registration and financial responsibility information for the
- highly automated vehicle to the police department.
- 25 (2) The highly automated vehicle shall remain at the
- 26 scene of the accident or as close thereto as possible until a
- 27 police officer confirms to the owner or registrant of the
- highly automated vehicle, or a person on behalf of the owner
- 29 or registrant, that the requirements of section 3744
- 30 (relating to duty to give information and render aid) are

- 3 § 3746. Immediate notice of accident to police department.
- 4 * * *
- 5 (a.1) Highly automated vehicles.--If a vehicle under
- 6 <u>subsection</u> (a) is a highly automated vehicle operating with an
- 7 ADS engaged or without a highly automated vehicle driver on
- 8 board, the requirements of this section are satisfied if the
- 9 <u>owner or registrant of the highly automated vehicle</u>, a person on
- 10 behalf of the owner or registrant or the highly automated
- 11 vehicle immediately contacts the nearest office of a duly
- 12 authorized police department to report the accident.

- 14 § 4103. Promulgation of vehicle equipment standards.
- 15 * * *
- 16 <u>(f) Highly automated vehicles.--A highly automated vehicle</u>
- 17 that is designed to operate exclusively by the ADS or a highly
- 18 <u>automated vehicle driver in a remote location for all trips is</u>
- 19 not subject to motor vehicle equipment laws or regulations of
- 20 this Commonwealth which:
- 21 (1) relate to or support motor vehicle operation by a
- 22 <u>driver seated in the vehicle; and</u>
- 23 (2) are not relevant for an ADS.
- 24 § 4702. Requirement for periodic inspection of vehicles.
- 25 * * *
- 26 (c.2) Safety inspection criteria for highly automated
- 27 <u>vehicles.--The standards established by the department under</u>
- 28 subsection (a) shall apply to highly automated vehicles only in
- 29 <u>a manner consistent with the provisions of section 4103(f)</u>
- 30 (relating to promulgation of vehicle equipment standards).

- 2 § 4921. Width of vehicles.
- 3 * * *
- 4 (e.3) Highly automated vehicles.--If a highly automated
- 5 <u>vehicle</u> is operating on highways of this Commonwealth, a rear
- 6 <u>visibility system comprised of a set of devices or components</u>,
- 7 which together perform the function of producing the rearview
- 8 <u>image</u>, shall be considered a mirror or a similar device to a
- 9 mirror, and shall be excluded from the measurement of the width
- 10 of the highly automated vehicle consistent with applicable
- 11 Federal and State laws.

- 13 Section 5. Section 8501 of Title 75 is amended by adding
- 14 definitions to read:
- 15 § 8501. Definitions.
- 16 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 17 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 18 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 19 * * *
- 20 "DDT fallback." The response by a highly automated vehicle
- 21 driver or ADS to either perform the DDT or achieve a minimal
- 22 <u>risk condition after occurrence of a DDT performance-relevant</u>
- 23 system failure or upon operational design domain exit.
- 24 "Dynamic driving task" or "DDT." The real-time operational
- 25 and tactical functions required to operate a motor vehicle on a
- 26 highway, excluding strategic functions, such as trip scheduling
- 27 and selection of destinations and waypoints, and including,
- 28 <u>without limitation:</u>
- 29 (1) Lateral vehicle motion control via steering.
- 30 (2) Longitudinal motion control via acceleration and

- deceleration.
- 2 (3) Monitoring the driving environment via object and
- 3 event detection, recognition, classification and response
- 4 <u>preparation</u>.
- 5 <u>(4) Object and event response execution.</u>
- 6 <u>(5) Maneuver planning.</u>
- 7 (6) Enhancing conspicuity via lighting, signaling and
- 8 <u>gesturing.</u>
- 9 "Minimal risk condition." A stable, stopped condition to
- 10 which an individual, a highly automated vehicle driver or ADS
- 11 may bring a highly automated vehicle after performing the DDT
- 12 <u>fallback in order to reduce the risk of a crash when a given</u>
- 13 <u>trip cannot or should not be continued.</u>
- 14 "Operational design domain" or "ODD." Operating conditions
- 15 <u>under which a given ADS is specifically designed to function</u>,
- 16 including, but not limited to, environmental, geographical and
- 17 time-of-day restrictions and the requisite presence or absence
- 18 of certain traffic or highway characteristics.
- 19 "Request to intervene." Notification by an ADS to a highly
- 20 <u>automated vehicle driver that the highly automated vehicle</u>
- 21 driver should promptly begin or resume performance of part or
- 22 all of the DDT or achieve a minimal risk condition.
- 23 Section 6. Title 75 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 24 <u>§ 8501.1.</u> Construction.
- 25 Except for the provisions of section 8510.1 (relating to
- 26 regulations), nothing in this chapter shall be construed to:
- 27 (1) prohibit a highly automated vehicle driver from
- 28 operating a highly automated vehicle to control all or part
- of the DDT; or
- 30 (2) prohibit a highly automated vehicle from operating

- 1 without a highly automated vehicle driver.
- 2 Section 7. Section 8503 of Title 75 is amended by adding a
- 3 subsection to read:
- 4 § 8503. Highly Automated Vehicle Advisory Committee.
- 5 * * *
- 6 (j) Special reports. -- Beginning as soon as practicable, but
- 7 no later than 18 months after the effective date of this
- 8 section, the advisory committee shall provide special reports to
- 9 the General Assembly, and post the reports on the department's
- 10 publicly accessible Internet website, that:
- 11 (1) Evaluate the benefits and implications to the
- 12 <u>Commonwealth's workforce.</u>
- 13 (2) Evaluate improvements to accessibility and mobility
- for persons with disabilities.
- 15 Section 8. Title 75 is amended by adding sections to read:
- 16 § 8504. Operation of highly automated vehicles without a highly
- 17 automated vehicle driver.
- 18 A highly automated vehicle with an ADS engaged, including a
- 19 <u>highly automated vehicle without a highly automated vehicle</u>
- 20 driver, may operate on highways if the following apply:
- 21 (1) The highly automated vehicle is capable of operating
- 22 in compliance with the applicable provisions of and
- 23 regulations promulgated under this title, unless an exemption
- has been granted by the department or the National Highway
- 25 Traffic Safety Administration.
- 26 (2) If required under Federal law, the highly automated
- 27 <u>vehicle bears the required manufacturer's certification label</u>
- indicating that the highly automated vehicle has been
- 29 certified to be in compliance with all applicable Federal
- 30 Motor Vehicle Safety Standards, including reference to any

- 1 <u>exemption granted by the National Highway Traffic Safety</u>
- 2 Administration.
- 3 (3) If a failure of an ADS occurs which renders the ADS
- 4 <u>unable to perform the entire DDT relevant to its intended</u>
- 5 ODD, the highly automated vehicle will achieve or a highly
- 6 <u>automated vehicle driver will cause the highly automated</u>
- 7 <u>vehicle to achieve a minimal risk condition.</u>
- 8 § 8505. Operation of highly automated vehicles with a highly
- 9 <u>automated vehicle driver.</u>
- 10 The highly automated vehicle driver on board or in a remote
- 11 <u>location must be properly licensed under this title to operate</u>
- 12 the appropriate type and class of motor vehicle on highways.
- 13 § 8506. Operation of highly automated motor carrier vehicles.
- 14 A highly automated vehicle that is also a motor carrier
- 15 vehicle requiring a commercial driver's license under section
- 16 1606 (relating to requirement for commercial driver's license)
- 17 may operate on highways with an ADS engaged or without a highly
- 18 automated vehicle driver on board. The highly automated vehicle
- 19 shall operate under Federal and State laws governing commercial
- 20 drivers and the operation of commercial motor vehicles, except
- 21 any provision which by its nature reasonably applies only to a
- 22 driver shall not apply to a highly automated vehicle. This
- 23 section shall not apply to a school bus.
- 24 § 8507. Operation of highly automated transportation network
- 25 service.
- 26 If a transportation network service is authorized under the
- 27 <u>laws of this Commonwealth</u>, a highly automated vehicle with an
- 28 ADS engaged or without a highly automated vehicle driver on
- 29 board may operate in a transportation network service or in
- 30 combination with other authorized vehicles in the transportation

- 1 <u>network service</u>. Any provision of law which by its nature
- 2 <u>reasonably applies only to a driver shall not apply to a highly</u>
- 3 <u>automated vehicle with an ADS engaged or without a highly</u>
- 4 <u>automated vehicle driver on board while logged onto a digital</u>
- 5 network of a transportation network service.
- 6 § 8508. Licensing and registration.
- 7 The following shall apply:
- 8 <u>(1) The ADS is considered the driver of a highly</u>
- 9 <u>automated vehicle when the ADS is engaged for the purpose of</u>
- 10 assessing compliance under this title and is considered to be
- 11 <u>a driver licensed to operate the motor vehicle under section</u>
- 12 <u>1501 (relating to drivers required to be licensed). If a</u>
- 13 <u>police officer must issue a citation, a police officer shall</u>
- 14 <u>cite the owner or registrant of the highly automated vehicle.</u>
- 15 <u>(2) The highly automated vehicle driver in a remote</u>
- location is considered the driver of a highly automated
- 17 vehicle for the purpose of assessing compliance under this
- 18 title and is considered to be a driver licensed to operate
- 19 the motor vehicle under section 1501. If a police officer
- issues a citation, a police officer shall cite the highly
- 21 automated vehicle driver.
- 22 (3) The requirements under this title relating to
- 23 exhibiting a driver's license and registration card are
- 24 satisfied if a vehicle registration card is in the highly
- 25 automated vehicle, physically or electronically and available
- for inspection by a police officer.
- 27 <u>§ 8509. Insurance.</u>
- 28 Before a highly automated vehicle with an ADS engaged or
- 29 <u>without a highly automated vehicle driver on board operates on</u>
- 30 highways, the owner of the highly automated vehicle shall submit

- 1 proof of financial responsibility to the department self-
- 2 <u>certifying that the highly automated vehicle is covered by</u>
- 3 <u>insurance or proof of self-insurance in the minimum amount of</u>
- 4 \$1,000,000, which shall satisfy the applicable laws of this
- 5 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 6 § 8510. Control.
- 7 <u>In accordance with section 6101 (relating to applicability</u>
- 8 and uniformity of title), this chapter preempts and supersedes
- 9 all ordinances relating to highly automated vehicles. A
- 10 political subdivision of the Commonwealth may not adopt or
- 11 enforce a policy, rule or ordinance that sets standards or
- 12 <u>otherwise burdens, prohibits, limits or regulates the operation</u>
- 13 of a highly automated vehicle.
- 14 <u>§ 8510.1.</u> Regulations.
- 15 <u>(a) General rule.--In order to facilitate the prompt</u>
- 16 implementation of this subchapter, the department may promulgate
- 17 regulations or publish guidelines which are consistent with this
- 18 title that include the following:
- 19 <u>(1) The process for receipt, review and approval of a</u>
- 20 request for a highly automated vehicle testing authorization
- 21 with or without a highly automated vehicle driver on board.
- 22 (2) The process for receipt and review of a self-
- certification prior to commercial deployment of a highly
- 24 automated vehicle. The department must provide a response
- within 30 days.
- 26 (3) The type and amount of information that is necessary
- for adequate review of and response to each stage of request
- for testing approval or commercial deployment.
- 29 <u>(4) The process an emergency service responder must</u>
- 30 follow when a highly automated vehicle without a highly

- 1 automated vehicle driver on board is involved in an emergency
- 2 <u>response area.</u>
- 3 (a.1) Guidelines. -- The department shall consult with the
- 4 <u>advisory committee before publishing guidelines under subsection</u>
- 5 (a).
- 6 (b) Temporary regulations. -- Notwithstanding any other
- 7 provision of law, regulations promulgated by the department
- 8 under this subchapter during the two years following the
- 9 <u>effective date of this section shall be deemed temporary</u>
- 10 regulations, which shall expire no later than three years
- 11 following the effective date of this section or upon
- 12 promulgation of final regulations. The temporary regulations
- 13 <u>shall not be subject to:</u>
- 14 (1) Sections 201, 202, 203, 204 and 205 of the act of
- 15 <u>July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the</u>
- 16 Commonwealth Documents Law.
- 17 (2) Sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the act of October
- 18 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth
- 19 Attorneys Act.
- 20 (3) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as
- 21 the Regulatory Review Act.
- 22 (c) Publication. -- The department shall transmit any
- 23 temporary regulations promulgated under subsection (b) to the
- 24 Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania
- 25 Bulletin.
- 26 Section 9. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
