## AN ACT

- 1 Making appropriations from the Professional Licensure
- 2 Augmentation Account and from restricted revenue accounts
- within the General Fund to the Department of State for use by
- the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs in
- 5 support of the professional licensure boards assigned
- 6 thereto.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. (A) The sum of \$63,953,000, or as much thereof <--
- 10 as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the
- 11 Professional Licensure Augmentation Account within the General
- 12 Fund to the Department of State for the operation of the Bureau
- 13 of Professional and Occupational Affairs for the fiscal year
- 14 July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023.
- 15 (B) THE APPROPRIATION UNDER SUBSECTION (A) INCLUDES
- 16 \$5,000,000 FOR INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND OTHER ASSOCIATED COSTS
- 17 RELATED TO THE REPLACEMENT OF THE PA LICENSURE SYSTEM. THE
- 18 \$5,000,000 MAY NOT BE EXPENDED FOR ANY OTHER PURPOSE. THE
- 19 DEPARTMENT OF STATE SHALL ISSUE A REPORT ON NOVEMBER 15, 2022,
- 20 AND ON MAY 15, 2023, TO THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON

- 1 OF THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE, THE CHAIRPERSON
- 2 AND MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE OF THE
- 3 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, THE CHAIRPERSON AND MINORITY
- 4 CHAIRPERSON OF THE CONSUMER PROTECTION AND PROFESSIONAL
- 5 LICENSURE COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE AND THE CHAIRPERSON AND
- 6 MINORITY CHAIRPERSON OF THE PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE COMMITTEE OF
- 7 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES THAT CONTAINS ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 8 (1) AN ACCOUNTING OF FUNDS EXPENDED BY THE BUREAU OF
- 9 PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS RELATED TO THE
- 10 REPLACEMENT OF THE PA LICENSURE SYSTEM BY CATEGORY OF
- 11 EXPENDITURE.
- 12 (2) A STATUS UPDATE ON THE IMPLEMENTATION AND TIMELINE
- 13 OF THE REPLACEMENT PROJECT, INCLUDING A DESCRIPTION OF
- 14 EFFORTS TO IMPROVE OR UPGRADE BUREAU OF PROFESSIONAL AND
- 15 OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS TECHNOLOGY INFRASTRUCTURE, TO INTERFACE
- 16 WITH EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS IN THIS COMMONWEALTH, TO
- 17 FACILITATE AND EXPEDITE EDUCATION VERIFICATION AND IMPROVE
- 18 THE TIMELY ISSUANCE OF PROFESSIONAL LICENSES.
- 19 (3) ANY OTHER INFORMATION DEEMED NECESSARY OR
- 20 APPROPRIATE BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 21 Section 2. (a) The sum of \$9,398,000, or as much thereof as
- 22 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted
- 23 receipts account of the State Board of Medicine for the
- 24 operation of the board for the fiscal year July 1, 2022, to June
- 25 30, 2023.
- 26 (b) The sum of \$2,651,000, or as much thereof as may be
- 27 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts
- 28 account of the State Board of Osteopathic Medicine for the
- 29 operation of the board for the fiscal year July 1, 2022, to June
- 30 30, 2023.

- 1 (c) The sum of \$410,000, or as much thereof as may be
- 2 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the restricted receipts
- 3 account of the State Board of Podiatry for the operation of the
- 4 board for the fiscal year July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023.
- 5 (d) The sum of \$868,000, or as much thereof as may be
- 6 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the Athletic Commission
- 7 Augmentation Account for the State Athletic Commission, as
- 8 authorized by 5 Pa.C.S. § 1512 (relating to Athletic Commission
- 9 Augmentation Account), for the support and operation of the
- 10 commission for the fiscal year July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023.
- 11 (e) Each appropriation listed in subsections (a), (b), (c)
- 12 and (d) shall not be treated as an augmentation to the
- 13 Department of State, a general government appropriation or any
- 14 other appropriation, but shall be treated and accounted for as
- 15 separate appropriations respectively.
- 16 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2022, or
- 17 immediately, whichever is later.
