AN ACT

1 Designating a bridge, identified as Bridge Key 47626, carrying
2 Pennsylvania Route 255 over Sandy Lick Creek, Sandy Township,
3 Clearfield County, as the Sergeant Norman Lee Tinker Memorial
4 Bridge.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6 hereby enacts as follows:

7 Section 1. Sergeant Norman Lee Tinker Memorial Bridge.

8 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
9 follows:

10 (1) Norman Lee Tinker was born March 12, 1945, in
11 DuBois, Clearfield County.

12 (2) Sergeant Tinker was drafted into the United States
13 Army in 1967 and served with the 199th Light Infantry
14 Brigade, 4th Battalion, 12th Infantry, A Company.

15 (3) On January 25, 1968, Sergeant Tinker bravely gave
16 his life for his country after encountering hostile action in
17 the Bien Hoa Province of South Vietnam.

18 (4) For his service and sacrifice, Sergeant Tinker was

1 decorated with many awards, including the Purple Heart,
2 Vietnam Gallantry Cross and Army Good Conduct Medal.

3 (5) Sergeant Tinker is honored on the Vietnam Veteran's
4 Memorial in Washington, DC, on Panel 35e, line 35.

5 (b) Designation.--The bridge, identified as Bridge Key
6 47626, carrying Pennsylvania Route 255 over Sandy Lick Creek,
7 Sandy Township, Clearfield County, is designated the Sergeant
8 Norman Lee Tinker Memorial Bridge.

9 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
10 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
11 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

12 Section 2. Effective date.

13 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
