AN ACT

- Amending the act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), entitled 1 "An act relating to dogs, regulating the keeping of dogs; providing for the licensing of dogs and kennels; providing for the protection of dogs and the detention and destruction of dogs in certain cases; regulating the sale and 5 transportation of dogs; declaring dogs to be personal 6 property and the subject of theft; providing for the 7 8 abandonment of animals; providing for the assessment of damages done to animals; providing for payment of damages by 9 the Commonwealth in certain cases and the liability of the 10 owner or keeper of dogs for such damages; imposing powers and 11 duties on certain State and local officers and employees; 12 providing penalties; and creating a Dog Law Restricted 13 Account," in licenses, tags and kennels, further providing 14 for revocation or refusal of kennel licenses and providing 15 for importation or sale of dogs; and, in enforcement and 16 penalties, providing for whistleblower protection. 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 19 hereby enacts as follows:
- 20 Section 1. Section 211(a) introductory paragraph of the act
- 21 of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), known as the Dog Law, is
- 22 amended to read:
- 23 Section 211. Revocation or refusal of kennel licenses.
- 24 General powers of secretary. -- The secretary shall revoke

- 1 a kennel license, dealer license or out-of-state dealer license
- 2 if a licensee is convicted of a violation of 18 Pa.C.S. § 5511
- 3 (relating to cruelty to animals) or of substantially similar
- 4 conduct pursuant to the Animal Welfare Act (Public Law 89-544, 7
- 5 <u>U.S.C.</u> § 2131 et seq.), 18 <u>U.S.C.</u> § 48 (relating to animal_
- 6 <u>crushing</u>) or a cruelty law of another state. The secretary shall
- 7 not issue a kennel license, dealer license or out-of-state
- 8 dealer license to a person that has been convicted of a
- 9 violation of 18 Pa.C.S. § 5511 within the last ten years. The
- 10 secretary may revoke or refuse to issue a kennel license, dealer
- 11 license or out-of-state dealer license for any one or more of
- 12 the following reasons:
- 13 * * *
- 14 Section 2. The act is amended by adding sections to read:
- 15 <u>Section 222. Importation or sale of dogs.</u>
- 16 <u>Notwithstanding the provisions of section 908, a dealer or</u>
- 17 kennel may not import for sale, sell or offer for sale,
- 18 including a sale for research purposes, a dog bred by a person
- 19 who has received any of the following from the United States
- 20 Department of Agriculture as authorized under the Animal Welfare
- 21 Act (Public Law 89-544, 7 U.S.C. § 2131 et seq.) and its
- 22 <u>attendant regulations:</u>
- 23 (1) A citation for a direct or critical violation or
- 24 <u>citations for three or more indirect or noncritical</u>
- 25 <u>violations during the two-year period before the procurement</u>
- of the dog.
- 27 (2) Two consecutive citations for no access to a housing
- 28 <u>facility before the procurement of the dog.</u>
- 29 <u>Section 909. Whistleblower protection.</u>
- 30 An employee of a business, nonprofit entity or government

- 1 <u>entity subject to this act shall be deemed to be an employee</u>
- 2 under the act of December 12, 1986 (P.L.1559, No.169), known as
- 3 the Whistleblower Law, with regard to a good faith report of a
- 4 potential violation of this act or the Animal Welfare Act
- 5 (Public Law 89-544, 7 U.S.C. § 2131 et seq.). A business,
- 6 nonprofit entity or government entity subject to this act shall
- 7 <u>be deemed to be an employer under the Whistleblower Law with</u>
- 8 regard to a good faith report of a potential violation of this
- 9 <u>act or the Animal Welfare Act.</u>
- 10 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
