AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study, providing for books and other educational resource materials in public school entities.
8	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Article XV of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
11	No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by
12	adding a subarticle to read:
13	(e) Books and Other Educational Resource Materials in
14	Public School Entities.
15	Section 1561. Definitions.
16	The following words and phrases when used in this subarticle
17	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
18	context clearly indicates otherwise:
19	"Committee." An educational resource material review
20	committee established under section 1563.

1	"Department." The Department of Education of the
2	Commonwealth.
3	"Institution of higher education." Any of the following:
4	(1) A university within the State System of Higher
5	Education established under Article XX-A.
6	(2) An institution designated as "State-related" by the
7	Commonwealth.
8	"Professor." An individual who teaches at an institution of
9	higher education located within this Commonwealth and has
10	assigned the book or other educational resource material under
11	discussion at least twice during the three (3) preceding
12	academic years.
13	"Public school entity." A public school, including a school
14	district, charter school, intermediate unit or area career and
15	technical school.
16	"Qualified moderator." An individual who has professional or
17	academic background in the subject area of the book or other
18	educational resource material under discussion.
19	Section 1562. Authorization.
20	<u>A board of school directors of a public school entity may do</u>
21	the following if the board of school directors complies with the
22	requirements of this subarticle:
23	(1) Vote to ban or restrict access to a book or other
24	educational resource material from a school library,
25	curriculum or recommended reading list or related use of the
26	public school entity.
27	(2) Vote to require the inclusion or acquisition of a
28	book or other educational resource material within a school
29	library, curriculum or recommended reading list or related
30	use of the public school entity.

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1	Section 1563. Establishment of committee.
2	(a) RequirementA board of school directors of a public
3	school entity may not engage in any of the actions under section
4	1562 unless the board of school directors first establishes an
5	educational resource material review committee.
6	(b) Nature and purposesA committee shall be advisory in
7	nature and assist with instituting policies in accordance with
8	this subarticle and informing school communities about books,
9	curricula and other educational resource materials.
10	(c) Mandatory compositionA committee shall consist of the
11	following individuals associated with the school district of the
12	public school entity:
13	(1) Principals.
14	(2) Directors of curricula.
15	(3) Librarians.
16	(4) The superintendent or a designee of the
17	superintendent.
18	(d) Discretionary compositionA committee may include
19	other stakeholders, such as officers of school-recognized
20	student groups.
21	<u>Section 1564. General training.</u>
22	Each member of a committee shall undergo training developed
23	in conjunction with the following:
24	(1) The Office of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion within
25	the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.
26	(2) The State Board of Education.
27	(3) The Office of Commonwealth Libraries within the
28	department.
29	(4) Teacher unions in this Commonwealth, including the
30	Pennsylvania State Education Association and the Pennsylvania

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2	Section 1565. Committee meetings.
3	(a) RequirementsPrior to any public hearing under section
4	1570, a committee shall:
5	(1) Hold an initial organizational meeting, during which
6	the members of the committee shall select a chairperson or
7	<u>two cochairpersons.</u>
8	(2) Hold no fewer than two meetings to conduct business
9	in furtherance of this subarticle.
10	(b) Nature of meetingsMeetings of a committee prior to
11	any public hearing under section 1570 shall not be required to
12	be open to the public.
13	Section 1566. Forms.
14	(a) Development and purposeThe department, in
15	consultation with the Pennsylvania State System of Higher
16	Education and the Office of Commonwealth Libraries within the
17	<u>department, shall develop a form to be used by a member of a</u>
18	board of school directors of a public school entity who seeks to
19	ban, restrict access to or require the inclusion or acquisition
20	of a book or other educational resource material from or within
21	a school library, curriculum or recommended reading list or
22	related use of the public school entity.
23	(b) PostingThe form shall be posted on the publicly
24	accessible Internet website of the department.
25	(c) ContentsA completed form shall:
26	(1) identify categories of concern and specific
27	sections, passages or pages of the book or other educational
28	resource material that merit the ban or restriction; or
29	(2) identify the reasons for requiring the inclusion or
30	acquisition of the book or other educational resource

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1	material.
2	(d) DutiesPrior to any public hearing under section 1570,
3	<u>a committee shall:</u>
4	(1) Address any concerns regarding the form.
5	(2) Review any completed form by a member of the board
6	of school directors of the public school entity.
7	(e) Public documentEach completed form shall be
8	accessible for inspection and duplication in accordance with the
9	act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-
10	Know Law.
11	Section 1567. Notarized attestation.
12	<u>A member of the board of school directors of a public school</u>
13	entity who seeks to ban, restrict access to or require the
14	inclusion or acquisition of a book or other educational resource
15	<u>material from or within a school library, curriculum or</u>
16	recommended reading list or related use of the public school
17	entity shall complete the form under section 1566 and shall sign
18	a notarized attestation form that the member has read the book
19	or other educational resource material in its entirety within
20	the current calendar year, with a receipt documented by a school
21	librarian or director of curriculum provided to the member.
22	Section 1568. Specific training.
23	<u>Members of a committee shall participate in a training by a</u>
24	Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education professor, or a
25	designee, who has taught or otherwise written about the book or
26	other educational resource material in question, as confirmed by
27	the department and a librarian chosen by the Office of
28	Commonwealth Libraries within the department.
29	Section 1569. Report.
30	(a) PreparationA committee shall prepare a report

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1	containing a discussion of the book or other educational
2	resource material and the recommendation of the committee
3	regarding the proposed ban, restriction, inclusion or
4	acquisition of the book or other educational resource material.
5	(b) RequirementsThe report shall be:
6	(1) Transmitted to the board of school directors of the
7	public school entity at least 24 hours before the scheduled
8	meeting of the board of school directors during which the
9	proposed ban, restriction, inclusion or acquisition will be
10	considered.
11	(2) Posted on the publicly accessible Internet website
12	of the public school entity.
13	<u>(c) TemplateThe Pennsylvania State System of Higher</u>
14	Education shall develop the template for the written report by
15	the committee.
16	Section 1570. Public hearing.
17	(a) RequirementA board of school directors of a public
18	school entity shall hold a public hearing regarding the proposed
19	ban, restriction, inclusion or acquisition of the book or other
20	educational resource material.
21	(b) Moderator
22	(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2), the public
23	hearing shall be moderated by at least one professor from an
24	institution of higher education.
25	(2) If no professor from an institution of higher
26	education is available as moderator, the board of school
27	directors of a public school entity shall select another
28	qualified moderator for the public hearing.
29	(c) PresentationThe chairperson or cochairpersons of the
30	committee, or a designee of the chairperson or cochairpersons of

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1	the committee, shall attend the public hearing and present the
2	report under section 1569 and the recommendations of the
3	<u>committee.</u>
4	(d) Duties of proponentThe member of the board of school
5	directors of a public school entity who is proposing the ban,
6	restriction, inclusion or acquisition of the book or other
7	educational resource material shall attend the public hearing
8	and shall, as requested by another member of the board of school
9	directors or any of the individuals described in subsection (c):
10	(1) Read aloud excerpts from the book or other
11	educational resource material that form the basis of the
12	proposed ban, restriction, inclusion or acquisition of the
13	book or other educational resource material.
14	(2) Provide any other related information, including
15	information contained in the completed form that proposed the
16	ban, restriction, inclusion or acquisition of the book or
17	other educational resource material.
18	(e) Public responseThe public hearing shall allow for
19	residents living within the boundaries of the school district to
20	comment on the merits and content of the book or other
21	educational resource material under discussion at the public
22	hearing.
23	(f) VoteFollowing completion of the public hearing, the
24	board of school directors of a public school entity may vote for
25	the ban, restriction, inclusion or acquisition of the book or
26	other educational resource material. The following apply:
27	(1) A two-thirds vote of the members of the board of
28	school directors shall be required for the ban, restriction,
29	inclusion or acquisition.
30	(2) A motion regarding the ban, restriction, inclusion

1 <u>or acquisition may not occur unless the individual requesting</u>

2 <u>the ban, restriction, inclusion or acquisition is present at</u>

3 <u>the public hearing during which the motion is made.</u>

4 (g) Construction. -- A motion regarding the ban, restriction,

5 <u>inclusion or acquisition of a book or other educational resource</u>

6 material may not result in an action being taken regarding the

7 ban, restriction, inclusion or acquisition that occurs after the

8 end of the school year and before the beginning of the next

9 <u>school year.</u>

10 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
