A RESOLUTION

- 1 Establishing the Select Committee on the Jobs of the Future to
- investigate, review and make findings and recommendations
- regarding opportunities for the development of new
- industries, including advanced manufacturing, in this
- 5 Commonwealth.
- 6 WHEREAS, The worldwide pandemic caused by the novel
- 7 coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) demonstrated America's concerning
- 8 dependence on foreign nations to manufacture and produce
- 9 critical supplies; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Most of this critical supply chain is manufactured
- 11 offshore using high-tech techniques that were developed and
- 12 created in this Commonwealth's research, technology and higher
- 13 education institutions; and
- 14 WHEREAS, It is most important for America's national security
- 15 and economy to ensure that critical supplies and other goods are
- 16 produced and manufactured domestically; and
- 17 WHEREAS, This Commonwealth is uniquely positioned to reshore

- 1 these high-tech manufacturing operations due to its plentiful
- 2 natural resources, connected infrastructure and world-renowned
- 3 research, technology and educational institutions; therefore be
- 4 it
- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives establish the
- 6 Select Committee on the Jobs of the Future to investigate,
- 7 review and make findings and recommendations regarding
- 8 opportunities for the development of new industries, including
- 9 advanced manufacturing, in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the select committee investigate, review and
- 11 make findings and recommendations regarding all of the
- 12 following:
- 13 (1) The critical supplies and goods during the COVID-19
- pandemic that are primarily or exclusively available only
- through foreign supply chains.
- 16 (2) Resources that are available to train students for
- 17 careers in new industries, including advanced manufacturing,
- 18 at building trade union facilities, technical educational
- institutions, K-12 schools and colleges and universities in
- this Commonwealth.
- 21 (3) Other states' best practices and programs to reshore
- 22 advanced manufacturing operations, attract high-tech
- industries and prepare students for careers in new
- industries, including advanced manufacturing;
- 25 and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the select committee develop proposals which
- 27 encourage postsecondary educational institutions in this
- 28 Commonwealth to expand career training programs that will help
- 29 meet the needs of current and future employers; and be it
- 30 further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the select committee consist of five members
- 2 of the House of Representatives, including three members from
- 3 the majority caucus of the House of Representatives and two
- 4 members from the minority caucus of the House of
- 5 Representatives; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Speaker of the House of Representatives
- 7 appoint the chair of the select committee from among the members
- 8 of the select committee; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the select committee hold hearings, call
- 10 witnesses, take testimony and make its investigations at such
- 11 places as it deems necessary in this Commonwealth; and be it
- 12 further
- 13 RESOLVED, That the select committee be authorized to instruct
- 14 any individual to appear before the select committee to answer
- 15 questions on matters properly being inquired into by the select
- 16 committee and to produce books, papers, records, accounts,
- 17 reports and documents as the select committee deems necessary;
- 18 and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the Education Committee of the House of
- 20 Representatives assist the select committee to the fullest
- 21 extent possible; and be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That the select committee submit a report of its
- 23 findings and recommendations, including any recommendations for

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- 24 any appropriate legislation or other action, to the House of
- 25 Representatives no later than November 30, 2021 2022.
