## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

2	disaster emergency <del>declaration</del> DECLARED ON AUGUST 31, 2021, in response to the aftereffects of Hurricane Ida.
4	WHEREAS, On August 31, 2021, the Governor issued a
5	proclamation declaring a disaster emergency in response to the
6	aftereffects of Hurricane Ida; and
7	WHEREAS, In the proclamation declaring a disaster emergency,
8	the Governor declared that Hurricane Ida had the potential to
9	cause widespread and heavy rain throughout this Commonwealth,
10	which in turn posed a serious threat of severe flash flooding
11	and other adverse impacts throughout this Commonwealth; and
12	WHEREAS, The remnants of Hurricane Ida brought historic
13	rainfall to Pennsylvania, causing record flooding in many places
14	around this Commonwealth; and
15	WHEREAS, Flooding was particularly present in the
16	southeastern region of this Commonwealth, some of which
17	surpassed record flood levels, including reports ranging from
18	five to eight inches of rain, which caused significant damage to

- 1 homes, businesses and public infrastructure, while significantly
- 2 threatening and disrupting lives and displacing families; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Scranton saw its second wettest day on record and
- 4 Harrisburg and Altoona recorded their third wettest day on
- 5 record; and
- 6 WHEREAS, As a result of flooding and damaging winds, a total
- 7 of 389 roads were closed across this Commonwealth, while downed
- 8 trees and limbs disrupted utilities, leaving more than 15 major
- 9 interstates, roadways and expressways closed; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Recovery efforts in response to the damage caused by
- 11 Hurricane Ida remain ongoing and will continue for the
- 12 foreseeable future; therefore be it
- 13 RESOLVED, (The Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 14 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with section
- 15 20(c) of Article IV of the Constitution of Pennsylvania, extend
- 16 in whole until October 27, 2021, the disaster emergency declared
- 17 on August 31, 2021, in response to the aftereffects of Hurricane
- 18 Ida, EXCEPT AS TERMINATED OR EXTENDED, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, BY <--
- 19 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, (The Senate Concurring), That if the disaster <--
- 21 emergency declared on August 31, 2021, in response to the
- 22 aftereffects of Hurricane Ida is deemed to have expired prior to-
- 23 the effective date of this concurrent resolution, the General
- 24 Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with
- 25 section 20(c) and (d) of Article IV of the Constitution of
- 26 Pennsylvania, expressly approve the issuance of a new disaster
- 27 emergency declaration based on the same or substantially similar-
- 28 facts or circumstances as the disaster emergency declared on-
- 29 August 31, 2021, in response to the aftereffects of Hurricane
- 30 Ida, provided that the new disaster emergency declaration shall

- 1 be extended in whole until October 27, 2021, unless the General-
- 2 Assembly extend the declaration in whole or in part; and be it
- 3 <del>further</del>
- 4 RESOLVED, That upon adoption of this concurrent resolution by
- 5 both chambers of the General Assembly, the Chief Clerk SECRETARY <--
- 6 of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of
- 7 Representatives notify the Governor of the General Assembly's
- 8 action; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Chief Clerk SECRETARY of the Senate and <--
- 10 the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit this
- 11 concurrent resolution to the Legislative Reference Bureau for
- 12 publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin under 45 Pa.C.S. ⊱ <--
