8	RESOLVED, That House Rules 1 T, 2 T, 3 T, 4 T, 5 T and 6 T of
9	the Temporary Rules of the House of Representatives be amended

11	[RULE 1 T
12	Applicability
13	The temporary rules adopted in this Rule and Rules 2 T, 3 T,
14	4 T, 5 T and 6 T shall apply notwithstanding provisions in the
15	Rules of the House of Representatives.
16	RULE 2 T
17	Voting by Designation on the Floor of the House
18	A member who is not present in the Hall of the House may
19	designate either the Majority or Minority Whip to cast the
20	member's vote on any question.
21	If a designated Whip is on leave, that designated Whip may

appoint another member to cast all votes designated to that 1 2 Whip. A designation, including commencement date, shall be 3 accomplished by filing an attestation with the Chief Clerk which 4 identifies either the Majority or Minority Whip as the member's 5 designee when the member will not be present in the Hall of the 6 7 House. 8 A member may revoke the member's designation by notifying the Chief Clerk in writing of the revocation. 9 10 A member voting by designation under this temporary rule shall be counted in determining whether a quorum is present. 11 A designation shall be effective until the designation is 12 revoked or until this temporary rule expires. 13 14 RULE 3 T Voting by Designation in Committee 15 16 At any voting meeting of a committee of the House of Representatives, a member of the committee who is not present 17 18 may designate the chair or minority chair to cast the member's 19 vote on any question. 20 The designation shall be accomplished by filing an attestation with the chair or minority chair which affirms that 21 the member will not be present at the voting meeting. 22 23 A member voting by designation under this temporary rule 24 shall be counted in determining whether a quorum is present. 25 RULE 4 T 26 Consideration of Bills, Third Consideration and Final Passage of 27 Bills and Conference Committee Reports A bill may not receive action on concurrence until at least 28 29 three hours have elapsed from the time the bill and its amendatory language was available to the public, unless the 30

2	paragraph of Rule 24 or an affirmative vote of 2/3 of the
3	members elected to the House indicates that they have had
4	sufficient time to review the language and thereby approve
5	proceeding with the bill.
6	Members shall be notified and conference committee reports
7	shall be made available to members at least three hours prior to
8	the adoption of all conference committee reports.

10	three hours have elapsed from the time the bill and its

14	The Chief Clerk shall, as soon as practicable but no later
15	than March 15, 2021, fully implement video conferencing or
16	similar remote participation technology to allow Members voting
17	by designation at any voting meeting of a standing committee of
18	the House of Representatives to engage in simultaneous,
19	interactive participation in the committee meeting. A voting
20	meeting of a standing committee shall be held in a committee
21	room utilizing video conferencing or similar remote
22	participation technology unless such a room is not available.
23	The video conferencing or similar remote participation
24	technology must safeguard the integrity of the legislative
25	process.

27	Expiration
28	<u>Unless amended or revoked by the House, this Rule and Rules 1</u>
29	<u>T, 2 T, 3 T, 4 T and 5 T shall expire on January 31, 2022.</u>

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
