## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 Extending in whole the disaster emergency declared on January
- 2 28, 2022, and extended on February 9, 2022, in response to
- the Forbes Avenue/Fern Hollow Bridge collapse.
- WHEREAS, On January 28, 2022, the Governor issued a
- 5 proclamation declaring a disaster emergency in response to the
- 6 collapse of the Forbes Avenue/Fern Hollow Bridge in the City of
- 7 Pittsburgh, Allegheny County; and
- 8 WHEREAS, On February 9, 2022, the General Assembly extended
- 9 in whole the disaster emergency in response to the collapse of
- 10 the Forbes Avenue/Fern Hollow Bridge until March 31, 2022; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Multiple vehicles were driving on the bridge at the
- 12 time of the collapse; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Motorists and first responders sustained injuries as
- 14 a result of the collapse; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The City of Pittsburgh and surrounding political
- 16 subdivisions continue to experience adverse effects, including
- 17 ongoing traffic disruptions in and around the scene of the

- 1 incident; and
- 2 WHEREAS, These adverse effects are of such magnitude or
- 3 severity as to render essential the Commonwealth's
- 4 supplementation of county and municipal efforts and resources
- 5 and the activation of all applicable State, county, and
- 6 municipal emergency response plans; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The proclamation of disaster emergency is set to
- 8 expire on March 31, 2022; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Extending the disaster emergency is necessary to
- 10 alleviate the continual traffic disruption and provide resources
- 11 for the deconstruction and reconstruction of the bridge; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The recovery period associated with this disaster
- 13 has not concluded; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Extending the disaster emergency will help to ensure
- 15 the Department of Transportation is eligible to receive
- 16 emergency relief funding from the Federal Highway Administration
- 17 to assist the City of Pittsburgh; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The powers and duties afforded to executive branch
- 19 agencies to maintain response operations necessary to recover
- 20 from disasters under Title 35 of Pennsylvania's Consolidated
- 21 Statutes will expire on March 31, 2022, when the proclamation of
- 22 disaster emergency is set to expire, unless otherwise extended
- 23 by the General Assembly; therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly,
- 25 in accordance with section 20 of Article IV of the Constitution
- 26 of Pennsylvania, extend the disaster emergency declared on
- 27 January 28, 2022, from March 31, 2022, to February 18, 2023; and
- 28 be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the disaster emergency will terminate by
- 30 operation of law, and will not be further extended unless upon

- 1 affirmative action of the General Assembly on or before February
- 2 18, 2023; and be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That upon adoption of this concurrent resolution of
- 4 both chambers of the General Assembly, the Chief Clerk of the
- 5 Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives
- 6 notify the Governor of the General Assembly's action; and be it
- 7 further
- 8 RESOLVED, That the Chief Clerk of the Senate and the Chief
- 9 Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit this concurrent
- 10 resolution to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication
- 11 in the Pennsylvania Bulletin pursuant to 45 Pa.C.S. § 725(a)(4);
- 12 and be it further
- 13 RESOLVED, That this concurrent resolution shall take effect
- 14 immediately.
