A RESOLUTION

- 1 Establishing a task force to study social media platforms and 2 websites on which suicide is encouraged.
- 3 WHEREAS, Every suicide is an avoidable tragedy; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Suicide rates have risen in the United States over
- 5 the past 20 years, from 10.7 deaths per 100,000 in 2000, to 14
- 6 deaths per 100,000 in 2019; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Suicides have risen in nearly every American age
- 8 cohort, but especially among those 15 to 24 years of age, with a
- 9 45% increase since 2009; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Over the past several years, web forums have been
- 11 established where individuals discuss and encourage suicide; and
- 12 WHEREAS, These websites can be easily accessed through online
- 13 search engines; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Forty-five individuals have been confirmed to have
- 15 killed themselves after accessing one particular suicide forum;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, One of these suicide victims was a Pennsylvania
- 18 resident; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives has an interest in
- 2 preventing suicide through policy in order to promote the health
- 3 and well-being of Pennsylvanians; and
- 4 WHEREAS, It is important that websites where suicide is
- 5 encouraged are studied to determine what actions the
- 6 Commonwealth can take to prevent suicides stemming from these
- 7 websites; and
- 8 WHEREAS, There are a series of complications in regulating
- 9 websites where suicide is encouraged, including:
- 10 (1) freedom of expression concerns, as several state
- 11 courts have found encouraging others to commit suicide is
- 12 protected speech under the First Amendment; and
- 13 (2) the server for such websites moving frequently among
- various jurisdictions to avoid government interference;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, The House of Representatives desires advice on
- 17 legislation from a wide range of sources on how to regulate
- 18 social media platforms and websites where suicide is encouraged;
- 19 therefore be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives establish a task
- 21 force to study social media platforms and websites on which
- 22 suicide is encouraged; and be it further
- 23 RESOLVED, That the task force be comprised of the following
- 24 members:
- 25 (1) the Attorney General, as chair of the task force;
- 26 (2) the Secretary of Health, or a designee;
- 27 (3) the Secretary of Human Services, or a designee;
- 28 (4) the chair and minority chair of the Judiciary
- 29 Committee of the House of Representatives, or their
- 30 designees;

- 1 (5) the chair and minority chair of the Health Committee
- of the House of Representatives, or their designees;
- 3 (6) the chair and minority chair of the Human Services
- 4 Committee of the House of Representatives, or their
- 5 designees;
- 6 (7) two clinical psychologists with experience working
- 7 with suicidal patients, as appointed by the Governor;
- 8 (8) two experts in cyberbullying, as appointed by the
- 9 Governor; and
- 10 (9) two suicide prevention advocates, as appointed by
- 11 the Governor;
- 12 and be it further
- RESOLVED, That the task force issue a report within two years
- 14 of the adoption of this resolution with recommendations for
- 15 legislative and executive actions to prevent individuals from
- 16 committing suicide after visiting online forums where suicide is
- 17 encouraged.
