AN ACT

- 1 Providing for open contracting by the Commonwealth and its 2 political subdivisions and their agencies and authorities.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Open
- 7 Contracting Act.
- 8 Section 2. Definitions.
- 9 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 10 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 11 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 12 "Public body." The Commonwealth or any of its political
- 13 subdivisions, or an agency or authority of either.
- 14 "Public works." Construction, reconstruction, demolition,
- 15 alteration or repair work, other than routine maintenance work,
- 16 contracted for by a public body.
- "Successful bidder." A person, partnership or corporation
- 18 that has the capability in all respects to fully perform the

- 1 contract requirements and who has the integrity and reliability
- 2 which will assure good faith performance.
- 3 Section 3. Prohibited practices.
- 4 Contract specifications issued by public bodies soliciting
- 5 bids on public works projects may not include any of the
- 6 following:
- 7 (1) A requirement that a successful bidder or any of its
- 8 subcontractors utilize workers:
- 9 (i) represented by a designated labor organization;
- 10 or
- 11 (ii) referred by a designated labor organization.
- 12 (2) A requirement that a successful bidder's existing
- workforce or any of its subcontractors' workforces affiliate
- 14 with or pay dues to a labor organization.
- 15 (3) A requirement that a successful bidder or any of its
- 16 subcontractors recognize a labor organization as the
- 17 exclusive representative of any of its employees on the
- 18 public works project.
- 19 Section 4. Discrimination prohibited.
- No public body shall consider or use as a criterion in its
- 21 selection process the union or nonunion status of a successful
- 22 bidder's workforce.
- 23 Section 5. Enforcement.
- 24 (a) General rule. -- A party who is aggrieved by an act
- 25 committed by a public body in violation of section 3 or 4 may
- 26 file an action in a court of competent jurisdiction to enjoin
- 27 the act.
- 28 (b) Damages and attorney fees. -- A court of competent
- 29 jurisdiction may award damages and reasonable attorney fees to
- 30 an aggrieved party that is successful in an action filed under

- 1 subsection (a).
- 2 Section 6. Effective date.
- 3 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
