7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Section 1606(b) of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
10	Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a paragraph to read:
11	§ 1606. Requirement for commercial driver's license.

13	(b) ExemptionsThe following persons are not required to
14	obtain a commercial driver's license in order to drive the
15	commercial motor vehicle specified:
16	* * *
17	(9) A driver, employed by a political subdivision,
18	operating a commercial motor vehicle within the boundaries of
19	the political subdivision for the purpose of removing snow or
20	ice from a roadway by plowing, sanding or salting, if:

1(i) the properly licensed employee who ordinarily2operates a commercial motor vehicle for the purpose of3removing snow or ice from a roadway by plowing, sanding4or salting is unable to operate the vehicle; or5(ii) the political subdivision determines that a6snow or ice emergency exists that requires additional7assistance.

9 Section 2. Section 4902(a) of Title 75 is amended to read:
10 § 4902. Restrictions on use of highways and bridges.
11 (a) Restrictions based on condition of highway or bridge.--

12 (1)The Commonwealth and local authorities with respect 13 to highways and bridges under their jurisdictions may 14 prohibit the operation of vehicles and may impose 15 restrictions as to the weight or size of vehicles operated 16 upon a highway or bridge only when they determine by 17 conducting an engineering and traffic study as provided for 18 in department regulations that the highway or bridge may be 19 damaged or destroyed unless use by vehicles is prohibited or 20 the permissible size or weight of vehicles is reduced.

(2) School buses, emergency vehicles and vehicles making
local deliveries or pickups may be exempted from restrictions
on the use of highways imposed under this subsection.

(2.1) The following shall apply:

25 (i) Vehicles operated by municipalities and local
 26 authorities for road maintenance or construction shall be
 27 exempt from restrictions on the use of highways imposed
 28 under this subsection while maintaining or constructing
 29 municipal roads.

30 <u>(ii) Vehicles operated by persons under contract</u>

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1 with municipalities or local authorities for road maintenance shall be exempt from restrictions on the use 2 of highways imposed under this subsection while 3 maintaining municipal roads if authorized by the 4 municipality or local authority. Any vehicle deemed 5 exempt under this subparagraph shall, while maintaining 6 municipal roads, carry written documentation signed by an 7 8 official of the municipality or local authority that 9 specifically identifies the vehicle as exempt.

10 (3) The department [may] <u>shall</u> issue a statement of 11 policy, which shall take effect upon publication in the 12 Pennsylvania Bulletin, adopting an appropriate methodology to 13 provide letters of local determination that identify 14 particular vehicles, routes or uses as local in nature.

(4) The methodology under paragraph (3) [may] <u>shall</u>
allow for exemptions from 67 Pa. Code Ch. 189 (relating to
hauling in excess of posted weight limit) related to the atrisk industry of logging or other forest products
experiencing a 20% decline in Statewide employment between
March 2002 and March [2011] 2019, as determined by the
Department of Labor and Industry.

22 [The exemptions and related requirements under (5) paragraph (4) may remain in existence only until December 31, 23 24 2023.] Exemptions for local delivery or pickup may not 25 include traffic going to or coming from a site at which 26 minerals, natural gas or natural resources are developed, 27 harvested or extracted, notwithstanding whether the site is located at a residence, a commercial site or on farmland. 28 Delivery or pickup of logs or other forest products to or 29 30 from permanent processing mills located on or reachable only

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1	through posted highways shall be considered local delivery or
2	pickup. Delivery or pickup of coal to or from permanent coal
3	reprocessing or preparation plants located on or reachable
4	only through posted highways and not on the same posted
5	highway as a site at which coal is extracted shall be
6	considered local delivery or pickup.

8	Section 3. Section 4962 of Title 75 is amended by adding a
9	subsection to read:
10	§ 4962. Conditions of permits and security for damages.

12	(f.7) Movement of dozers
13	(1) A permitted vehicle or combination hauling a dozer
14	with an attached blade in excess of 12 feet in width, but not
15	wider than 15 feet, may move upon a highway if:
16	(i) a traffic protector guiderail device is securely
17	fastened to the dozer; or
18	(ii) the blade is angled so the total width of the
19	load does not exceed 12 feet.
20	(2) A blade over 15 feet in width shall be removed and
21	hauled separately.
