1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security Grant Program; and establishing the Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security Grant Committee within the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency and the Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security Grant Fund.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
10	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

3	<u>§ 78A01. Scope of chapter.</u>
4	This chapter relates to the Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security
5	<u>Grant Program.</u>
6	<u>§ 78A02. Definitions.</u>
7	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
8	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
9	context clearly indicates otherwise:
10	"Agency." The Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.
11	"Commission." The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and
12	Delinquency.
13	"Committee." The Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security Grant
14	Committee established under section 78A03 (relating to
15	<u>Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security Grant Committee).</u>
16	"Eligible uses." Any of the following:
17	(1) Security enhancements that may include, but are not
18	limited to:
19	(i) Safety and security planning.
20	(ii) Safety and security equipment and purchase of
21	security-related technology, which may include, but is
22	not limited to:
23	(A) Metal detectors.
24	(B) Protective lighting.
25	(C) Specialty-trained canines.
26	(D) Surveillance equipment.
27	(E) Special emergency communications equipment.
28	(F) Electronic locksets.
29	(G) Deadbolts.
30	<u>(H) Trauma kits.</u>

1	(I) Theft control devices.
2	(iii) Safety and security training.
3	(iv) Threat awareness and response training.
4	(v) Upgrades to existing structures that enhance
5	safety and security.
6	(vi) Vulnerability and threat assessments.
7	(vii) Any other safety or security-related use that
8	enhances safety or security of a nonprofit organization.
9	(2) Public outreach programs designed to reduce violence
10	in the community by encouraging increased communication,
11	tolerance, respect and understanding that are approved by the
12	<u>committee.</u>
13	"Fund." The Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security Grant Fund
14	established under section 78A08(a) (relating to Pennsylvania
15	Nonprofit Security Grant Fund).
16	"Grant program." The Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security Grant
17	Program established under section 78A07(a) (relating to
18	<u>Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security Grant Program).</u>
19	"Nonprofit organization." A corporation or other entity that
20	<u>is an exempt organization as provided for under section 501(c)</u>
21	(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26
22	<u>U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)).</u>
23	"Safety and security assessment" or "assessment." A
24	strategic evaluation of the facilities of a nonprofit
25	organization that is used to identify potential safety and
26	security threats.
27	<u>§ 78A03. Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security Grant Committee.</u>
28	(a) EstablishmentThe Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security
29	Grant Committee is established within the commission.
30	(b) CompositionThe committee shall consist of a
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1	chairperson and the following members:
2	(1) The Attorney General or a designee.
3	<u>(2) The Commissioner of Pennsylvania State Police or a</u>
4	<u>designee.</u>
5	(3) The director of the agency or a designee.
6	(4) The chairperson of the commission or a designee.
7	(5) The chairperson of the Pennsylvania Human Relations
8	<u>Commission or a designee.</u>
9	(6) An individual with experience in the subject matter
10	appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate.
11	(7) An individual with experience in the subject matter
12	appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate.
13	(8) An individual with experience in the subject matter
14	appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
15	(9) An individual with experience in the subject matter
16	appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of
17	<u>Representatives.</u>
18	(10) A recognized subject matter expert appointed by the
19	<u>Governor.</u>
20	(c) ChairpersonThe chairperson of the committee shall be
21	selected by the Governor from among the members of the
22	<u>committee.</u>
23	(d) Vice chairpersonA vice chairperson shall be
24	designated by the chairperson of the committee from among the
25	members of the committee to preside at meetings in the absence
26	of the chairperson.
27	(e) TermMembers of the committee shall serve a four-year
28	term.
29	(f) QuorumA majority of the members of the committee
30	shall constitute a quorum, and a quorum shall be required for
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1 <u>all actions.</u>

2	(g) ActionsA vote of the majority of the members of the
3	committee present shall be sufficient for all actions taken by
4	the committee.
5	(h) Initial meetingThe committee shall hold its first
6	meeting no later than 30 days from the effective date of this
7	subsection.
8	(i) CompensationMembers of the committee shall serve
9	without compensation for their services. Members of the
10	committee under subsection (b)(6), (7), (8), (9) and (10) shall
11	be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred
12	in the performance of their duties.
13	(j) CooperationThe commission shall cooperate with the
14	committee to select staff to be employed by the commission and
15	assigned to assist the committee in carrying out its duties.
16	<u>§ 78A04. Criteria.</u>
17	(a) Duty to establishNo later than October 31, 2020, the
18	committee shall establish criteria to be used when evaluating
19	the following:
20	(1) Applications submitted under this chapter for
21	proposed security enhancements to the facility or facilities
22	of a nonprofit organization, including:
23	(i) A review of the safety and security assessment
24	form submitted with an application for a grant under this
25	chapter.
26	(ii) A review of the nonprofit organization's safety
27	and security plan.
28	(iii) A review of the nonprofit organization's
29	existing plans for crisis response and mitigation.
30	(iv) An analysis of the design and the safety and

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1	security vulnerabilities of the facility or facilities of
2	the nonprofit organization.
3	(v) An evaluation of the nonprofit organization's
4	policies relating to safety and security issues.
5	(vi) An analysis of how the proposed security
6	enhancements will address the indicated security
7	vulnerabilities.
8	(2) Applications submitted under this chapter that
9	include proposed public outreach programs designed to reduce
10	violence in the community by encouraging increased
11	communication, tolerance, respect and understanding.
12	(b) Periodic review of criteriaThe committee shall review
13	the criteria established under subsection (a) at a minimum every
14	three years and may make revisions as needed.
15	<u>§ 78A05. Assessment providers.</u>
16	(a) Duty to establish criteriaNo later than October 31,
17	2020, the committee shall establish criteria for registration of
18	a person with knowledge and experience in matters of safety and
19	security that qualifies the person to conduct safety and
20	security assessments based upon the criteria established by the
21	committee under section 78A04 (relating to criteria) beginning
22	<u>October 31, 2020.</u>
23	(b) Qualified personsPersons registered to conduct school
24	safety and security assessments under section 1304-B of the act
25	of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School
26	Code of 1949, shall be qualified to conduct safety and security
27	assessments under this chapter.
28	(c) Periodic review of criteriaThe committee shall review_
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29	the criteria established in subsection (a) at a minimum every

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1	(d) RegistrationA person shall apply for registration as
2	an assessment provider to the committee in a manner prescribed
3	by the committee.
4	§ 78A06. Safety and security assessments.
5	(a) DevelopmentNo later than October 31, 2019, the
6	committee shall develop a safety and security assessment form to
7	distribute to nonprofit organizations for submission with an
8	application for a grant under this chapter.
9	(b) ConfidentialityAny data collected through the safety
10	and security assessment form by the committee and the findings
11	of the committee shall remain confidential and shall not be
12	subject to the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as
13	the Right-to-Know Law.
14	<u>§ 78A07. Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security Grant Program.</u>
15	(a) EstablishmentThe Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security
16	<u>Grant Program is established to provide grants to nonprofit</u>
17	organizations throughout this Commonwealth to fund eligible
18	uses.
19	(b) Functions generallyThe committee shall perform all
20	functions related to the direct approval, disbursement and
21	administration of grants under the program.
22	(c) ApplicationsNo later than September 1, 2020, and by
23	September 1 of each year thereafter, the committee shall accept
24	applications from nonprofit organizations for a grant during a
25	fiscal year. The applications must be submitted in the form and
26	manner prescribed by the committee.
27	(d) Review process
28	(1) No later than 90 days after a completed application
29	is received from a nonprofit organization, the committee
30	shall review and approve or deny the application.

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1	(2) A nonprofit organization may revise and resubmit a
2	denied application to the committee. The committee shall make
3	a reasonable effort to assist the nonprofit organization in
4	the revision and resubmission of the denied application.
5	(3) The committee may engage registered assessment
6	providers to complete the review required under this
7	subsection.
8	(e) Time frameThe committee shall review applications on
9	a rolling basis and shall accept applications until all grant
10	program money for the fiscal year is exhausted.
11	(f) Eligible usesThe committee may only award grants
12	through the grant program for eligible uses. Nonprofit
13	organizations may only expend grant money received through the
14	grant program on eligible uses.
15	(g) DiversityThe committee shall ensure that funding
16	under the grant program is geographically dispersed throughout
17	this Commonwealth.
18	(h) LimitationEach nonprofit organization may submit one
19	application annually. No nonprofit organization may receive an
20	annual grant allocation that exceeds 10% of the money available
21	under the grant program.
22	(i) CoordinationThe committee shall coordinate with the
23	commission and the agency on the interaction of the grant
24	program with the Federal Nonprofit Security Grant Program
25	administered by the United States Department of Homeland
26	Security to ensure the most effective use of resources.
27	(j) AuditsThe commission may randomly audit grant
28	recipients to ensure the appropriate use of grant money and
29	compliance with the provisions of this chapter.
30	<u>§ 78A08. Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security Grant Fund.</u>
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1	(a) EstablishmentThe Pennsylvania Nonprofit Security
2	Grant Fund is established as a special nonlapsing fund in the
3	<u>State Treasury.</u>
4	(b) AppropriationAll money deposited in the fund and the
5	interest it accrues are appropriated to the commission on a
6	continuing basis to award grants under this chapter.
7	(c) UseThe fund may only be used for the grant program
8	authorized under this chapter, and no money in the fund may be
9	transferred or diverted to any other purpose by administrative
10	action.
11	(d) FundingMoney available to the fund shall include
12	appropriations and transfers from Federal funds and other
13	sources of revenue made available to it.
14	(e) AllocationsNo more than 12.5% of the fund may be
15	allocated annually for grants for public outreach programs
16	designed to reduce violence in the community.
17	(f) Administrative costsNo more than 1% of the fund may
18	be used for reasonable administrative costs.
19	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
