1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18	Amending the act of December 7, 1982 (P.L.784, No.225), entitled "An act relating to dogs, regulating the keeping of dogs; providing for the licensing of dogs and kennels; providing for the protection of dogs and the detention and destruction of dogs in certain cases; regulating the sale and transportation of dogs; declaring dogs to be personal property and the subject of theft; providing for the abandonment of animals; providing for payment of damages by the Commonwealth in certain cases and the liability of the owner or keeper of dogs for such damages; imposing powers and duties on certain State and local officers and employees; providing penalties; and creating a Dog Law Restricted Account," in licenses, tags and kennels, further providing for issuance of dog licenses, compensation, proof required, deposit of funds, records, license sales, rules and regulations, failure to comply unlawful acts and penalties and for applications for dog licenses, fees and penalties.

20	hereby enacts as follows:
21	Section 1. Section 200(b) of the act of December 7, 1982
22	(P.L.784, No.225), known as the Dog Law, is amended to read:
23	Section 200. Issuance of dog licenses; compensation; proof

3 (1) For services rendered in collecting and paying over dog license fees, agents, for as long as they continue to act 4 5 in that capacity, may collect and retain [a sum equal to the cost of a postage stamp plus \$1] the following amounts for 6 each dog license sold, which [amount] amounts shall be full 7 8 compensation for services rendered by them under this act[.]: 9 (i) Beginning on the effective date of this subparagraph and continuing for one year, the amount 10 11 shall be: 12 (A) \$2. 13 (B) \$3, for each lifetime license sold. 14 (ii) Beginning one year from the effective date of 15 this subparagraph, the secretary shall have the authority to establish by regulation the amount of compensation 16 17 collected. The amount established shall be only that 18 which is required to cover the reasonable and necessary 19 expenses of administering the duties provided in this 20 act. The amounts shall reflect the increased 21 administrative duties imposed in selling a license under 22 subparagraph (i) (A) and (B) and shall provide for 23 compensation to the county treasurer and agents under 24 subsection (a) (1), (4) and (5). 25 The compensation shall be retained by the respective (2) 26 agents and shall cover, among other things, the cost of 27 processing and issuing dog licenses, postage, mailing, 28 returns and bonding of the agents. A magisterial district 29 judge authorized by the county treasurer to process

license certificates is not authorized to collect compensation under this subsection. Agents under subsection (a) (3) and (5) shall collect an additional 50¢ which shall be remitted to the county treasurer, for the use of the county, in the same manner as records are forwarded under subsection (e).

8 Section 2. Section 201(a) and (b) of the act are amended and 9 the section is amended by adding subsections to read: 10 Section 201. Applications for dog licenses; fees; penalties. 11 (a) General rule.--Except as provided in subsection (b), on or before January 1 of each year, the owner of any dog, [three 12 13 months] eight weeks of age or older, except as hereinafter 14 provided, shall apply to the county treasurer of his respective 15 county or an agent under section 200(a), on a form prescribed by 16 the department, for the appropriate license for the dog. The application and license certificate shall state the breed, sex, 17 18 age, color and markings of the dog, the name, address and 19 telephone number of the owner and the year of licensure. The 20 application shall be accompanied by the appropriate license fee.
